IT IS ALLEGED as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17 RCW, the Public Disclosure Act; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC. These charges incorporate the Report of Investigation and all of its exhibits by reference.

II. ALLEGATIONS

2. Respondent Patricia Davis is a candidate in the November 8, 2005 general election for Port of Seattle Commissioner. Ms. Davis violated RCW 42.17.080 and .090 as follows:

a. By failing to timely file her 21-day pre-primary C-4 report. The report was filed 19 days late and included \$24,080 in contributions and \$19,537 in expenditures. An amended C-4 report was filed 30 days late and included \$1,179 in additional expenditures not previously reported.

b. By failing to timely file her 7-day pre-primary C-4 report. The report was filed 5 days late and included \$9,300 in contributions. An amended C-4 report was filed 16 days late and included \$3,250 in additional contributions and \$43,069 in additional expenditures not previously reported.



c. By failing to timely file two C-3 reports for contributions totaling \$12,000 and \$16,700. The reports were filed 60 and 32 days late respectively.

III. RELEVANT LAW

3. RCW 42.17.080 and .090 require candidates to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures. Reports of contributions and expenditures are required monthly except for special reports due 21 and 7 days before the primary and general elections. In addition, detailed reports of contributions received must be filed for each bank deposit. These reports must be filed monthly until the fourth month before the election when detailed contribution reports are required weekly.

IV. FACTS SUPPORTING ALLEGATIONS

4. Respondent Davis is a candidate for Port of Seattle Commissioner. The election is scheduled to take place on November 8, 2005. She selected the “full reporting option” requiring frequent and detailed reports of contribution and expenditure activities.


5. Ms. Davis failed to timely file contribution and expenditure information on her 21-day pre-primary C-4 report. The late reported information included \$24,080 in contributions and \$19,537 in expenditures, reported 19 days late on September 18, 2005, two days before the primary election. The late filed C-4 was amended on September 29, 2005, showing \$1,179 in additional, previously unreported, expenditures for consulting and political advertising. These expenditures were reported 30 days late and nine days after the September 20, 2005 primary election.

6. Ms. Davis failed to timely file contribution information on her 7-day pre-primary C-4 report. The late reported information included \$9,300 in contributions, reported 5 days late on September 18, 2005, two days before the primary election. The late filed C-4 was amended on September 29, 2005, showing \$3,250 in additional, previously unreported, contributions and \$43,069 in additional expenditures. These

contributions and expenditures were reported 16 days late and nine days after the September 20, 2005 primary election.

7. Ms. Davis failed to timely file two C-3 reports. One C-3 included \$12,000 in contributions deposited on January 30, 2005. The C-3 was due by February 10, 2005 and was filed 60 days late on April 11, 2005. A second C-3 included \$16,700 in contributions deposited on February 15, 2005. The C-3 was due by March 10, 2005, and was filed 32 days late on April 11, 2005.
