This case involves alleged violations by Preserve Marriage Washington for failing to timely report expenditures, debts, and orders placed totaling \$328,737 during its 2012 campaign opposing Referendum 74, a statewide ballot proposition on the November 6, 2012 general election ballot.

You are being provided the Notice of Administrative Charges and Report of Investigation. Staff is working with the Respondent on a Stipulation as to Facts, Violations and Penalty.

Notice of Administrative Charges

I. Jurisdiction

 The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A RCW, the state campaign finance and disclosure laws; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC. These charges incorporate the Report of Investigation and all related exhibits by reference.

II. Allegations

2. Staff alleges that Preserve Marriage Washington violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 by failing to timely report expenditures, debts, and orders placed totaling \$328,737 during its 2012 campaign opposing Referendum 74, a statewide ballot proposition on the November 6, 2012 general election ballot.

III. Facts

- 3. Preserve Marriage Washington was a political committee formed to call a referendum election on SB 6239, legislation approved in the 2011-12 legislative session concerning civil marriage and Washington's domestic partnership laws. The referendum proposition qualified for the November 6, 2012 general election ballot and was assigned number R-74. Preserve Marriage Washington opposed R-74. R-74 was approved by voters.
- 4. Chris Plante served as Preserve Marriage Washington's Deputy Campaign Director. On its first Campaign Summary Receipts and Expenditures Report (C-4 report), filed March

- 12, 2012, Preserve Marriage Washington timely disclosed in-kind contributions from the National Organization for Marriage, Mr. Plante's employer, for his services in establishing the committee. The committee also previously disclosed an estimated debt to the National Organization for Marriage for Mr. Plante's services. On September 6, 2012, Preserve Marriage Washington filed amended reports to correct this estimate of debt, and to make it clear that the debt was for campaign management.
- 5. Frank Schubert began serving as Campaign Manager for Preserve Marriage Washington in April 2012, and was compensated according to a monthly retainer agreement. Although Preserve Marriage Washington received contemporaneous invoices from Mr. Schubert's company, Mission Public Affairs, due to an administrative error, these invoices were not listed as debts on Preserve Marriage Washington's C-4 reports.
- 6. On September 6, 2012, Preserve Marriage Washington filed amended C-4 reports showing that the committee had initially over-reported by approximately \$10,000 an estimated debt owed to the National Organization for Marriage incurred in the month of April 2012 for the services of Chris Plante, and under-reported the committee's debts for May, June, and July 2012 services totaling \$59,627. This debt was reported between 28 and 88 days late, and 61 days before the general election.
- 7. On September 6, 2012, Preserve Marriage Washington filed amended C-4 reports showing that the committee had failed to report debt incurred during April, May, and July, 2012 totaling \$50,110 owed to Mission Public Affairs. The debts were reported between 28 and 120 days late, and 61 days before the general election.
- 8. On October 30, 2012, Preserve Marriage Washington filed a C-4 report for the period September 1 October 15, 2012, disclosing \$20,000 in expenditures and approximately \$90,000 in debts, orders placed, and obligations, that were in addition to what was initially reported on a C-4 report for the same period, filed October 16, 2012. The expenditure activity (including debts and obligations), included over \$70,000 in previously undisclosed obligations and payments to Mission Public Affairs for campaign management, and numerous smaller obligations for legal services, video production, and

- other services. This expenditure activity was due to be disclosed on October 16, 2012, and was reported 14 days late, and seven days before the election.
- 9. On January 10, 2013, Preserve Marriage Washington filed a C-4 report for the period October 30 November 30, 2012 disclosing approximately \$43,000 more in debts, orders placed, and obligations than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on December 10, 2012. A subsequent amendment for same reporting period, filed on June 6, 2013, disclosed approximately \$66,000 in additional previously undisclosed debts. These obligations, for campaign management, consulting, legal, and compliance services, were due to be disclosed on December 10, 2012, and were reported between 31 178 days late.
- 10. Preserve Marriage Washington had an agreement with National Organization for Marriage and ActRight Compliance Services and Engagement to combine invoices for the services of the entities' representatives during October and November, so that the pre-election work would appear on one invoice. Although Preserve Marriage Washington monitored and tracked the work that consultants and vendors performed on Preserve Marriage Washington's behalf, because the committee only reported these debts when invoiced, Preserve Marriage Washington did not disclose debts and obligations incurred in October and November 2012 until after its post-election C-4 report was due on December 10, 2012.

IV. Law

RCW 42.17A.005(20) defines "expenditure" to include a contract, promise, or agreement, whether or not legally enforceable, to make an expenditure. For the purposes of RCW 42.17A, agreements to make expenditures, contracts, and promises to pay may be reported as estimated obligations until actual payment is made.

RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 require political committees to file timely, accurate reports of monetary and in-kind contributions, including contributions pledged but not received, and monetary and in-kind expenditures, including debts, orders placed and obligations. The reports are filed monthly following an excess of \$200 in contribution or expenditure activity, except during the five months before the election, during which time summary reports of receipts and expenditures are required to be filed 21 days and again 7 days before each election in which the committee is participating. The reports must disclose any debt, obligation, note, unpaid loan, or other liability valued at more than \$250, or valued at more than \$50 that has been outstanding for

over thirty days. Any contributions received and expenditures made prior to the date of registration must be disclosed on the day the registration is filed. Reports of contributions must include the name and address of any contributor who has given more than \$25 in the aggregate.

I. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Preserve Marriage Washington (PMW) was a political committee formed to call a referendum election on SB 6239, legislation approved in the 2011-12 legislative session. SB 6239 created equality in civil marriage and changed Washington's domestic partnership laws. The referendum was assigned ballot number R-74.
- 1.2 On Wednesday, February 22, 2012, PMW filed a C-1pc Political Committee Registration indicating that the committee was "for" R-74.1 The registration statement (Exhibit 1) listed Joseph Backholm as the committee's treasurer and campaign manager. Mr. Backholm's address, and that of the committee, was listed as 16108 Ash Way in Lynnwood, Washington, the address of the Family Policy Institute of Washington (FPIW). (In 2012, Mr. Backholm was the Executive Director of FPIW, a position he still holds.)
- 1.3 Washington State voters approved R-74 in the November 6, 2012 general election with 53.7% of votes cast. The Washington Secretary of State's Office certified the vote on December 5, 2012, and SB 6239 became effective on December 6, 2012.
- 1.4 On August 15, 2012, Sandra Turner Fukumoto filed a complaint against PMW. **(Exhibit 2.)**

¹ On March 1, 2012, PMW filed an amended registration to clarify that, although the committee sought to qualify R-74 for the ballot, assuming that the measure qualified, PMW would then advocate a "no" vote (i.e., that SB 6239 should be rejected).

II. ALLEGATIONS IN COMPLAINT

- 2.1 In her complaint, Ms. Fukumoto alleged that PMW violated RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW 42.17A.240 by failing to disclose expenditures, debt, or in-kind contributions connected with staff services performed by the following individuals:
 - Chris Plante, who Ms. Fukumoto described as PMW's Deputy Campaign Director;
 - Frank Schubert, who Ms. Fukumoto described as PMW's Campaign Manager; and
 - Joseph Backholm, PMW Treasurer.

III. FINDINGS

- 3.1 PMW Response Regarding Chris Plante, Frank Schubert: On September 6, 2012, PMW counsel Joseph Vanderhulst provided a preliminary response to Ms. Fukumoto's complaint. (Exhibit 3.) Mr. Vanderhulst stated that Chris Plante served as PMW's Deputy Campaign Director, and that on its first C-4 report to the PDC, filed March 12, 2012, PMW timely disclosed in-kind contributions from the National Organization for Marriage (NOM), Mr. Plante's employer, for his services in establishing the committee. (Exhibit 4.) He stated that the committee also previously disclosed an estimated debt to NOM for Mr. Plante's services, and that with its response, PMW had filed amended reports to correct this estimate, and to make it clear that the debt was for campaign management.
- 3.2 Mr. Vanderhulst stated further that Frank Schubert began serving as Campaign Manager for PMW in April 2012, and was compensated according to a monthly retainer agreement. He stated that although PMW received contemporaneous invoices from Mr. Schubert's company, Mission Public Affairs, due to an administrative error, these invoices were not listed as debts on PMW's C-4 reports. He stated that the committee's amended reports, filed September 6, 2012 corrected this oversight, listing the debts incurred to Mr. Schubert in the reporting periods. He noted that on August 10, 2012, prior to Ms. Fukumoto's August 15, 2012 complaint, PMW began disclosing debts to Mission Public Affairs and payments against those debts. (Exhibit 5.)
- 3.3 <u>Amended C-4 Reports by PMW</u>: The amended C-4 reports filed by PMW on September 6, 2012 (Exhibit 6) indicate that the committee initially over-

reported by approximately \$10,000 an estimated debt to NOM incurred in the month of April 2012 for the services of Chris Plante, and under-reported the committee's debts to NOM over the following three months. The under-reported debts to NOM incurred in May, June, and July 2012 totaled \$59,627 in value, and were reported between 28 and 88 days late. However, the full extent of the debts were disclosed to the public 61 days before the general election.

3.4 The amended C-4 reports filed by PMW on September 6, 2012 indicate that in its original C-4 reports for April, May, and July, 2012, the committee omitted a total of \$50,110 in debts to Mission Public Affairs incurred during the reporting periods. The debts were reported between 28 and 120 days late, 61 days before the general election. Although the committee failed to timely disclose a debt for the services of Frank Schubert performed in July 2012, as noted in Mr. Vanderhulst's response, the C-4 for July that was filed on August 10, 2012 did include a debt to Mission Public Affairs for Mr. Schubert's June retainer of \$20,000.

3.5 PMW Response Regarding Joseph Backholm: In his September 6, 2012 preliminary response to the complaint, PMW counsel Joseph Vanderhulst stated that Joseph Backholm served PMW as a volunteer. He stated that unlike Mr. Schubert and Mr. Plante, who have served as paid campaign managers for similar committees in the past in other states, Mr. Backholm has not, and does not ordinarily charge a fee or receive compensation for serving as a political committee chairman and treasurer.

- 3.6 On March 20, 2013. Mr. Vanderhulst submitted a supplemental response dated March 19, 2013, addressing the allegation of unreported in-kind contributions in the form of Mr. Backholm's services to PMW, and other unreported in-kind contributions. (Exhibit 7) He stated that Mr. Backholm was not compensated in any way by FPIW for the time spent providing services to PMW, and that neither his duties nor his work schedule with FPIW were affected by his PMW activities. He stated that the FPIW board of directors did not grant Mr. Backholm leave from his duties with FPIW. because FPIW continued to function as it had previously. He stated that because Mr. Backholm's duties and work schedule with FPIW were not affected, his compensation from FPIW was not affected. He stated that Mr. Backholm did not take paid leave from FPIW, because he did not take leave or time off from work during the campaign, but continued to work the same amount of time for FPIW as he had before becoming treasurer for PMW. He stated that PMW did not make use of the office space or other administrative resources of FPIW, or of any other person or entity, but hired and paid its own administrative staff. He stated that early in the campaign, FPIW received calls regarding the marriage ballot measure campaign, but these were directed to PMW and FPIW staff were instructed to clarify that FPIW was not involved in the ballot measure campaign.
- 3.7 Interview with Joseph Backholm: On August 19, 2013, Joseph Backholm was interviewed under oath by telephone. Mr. Backholm confirmed that he was not employed by PMW during the R-74 campaign, but rather worked for FPIW, his sole employer since 2008. He stated that the FPIW board decided that while he volunteered for PMW, he was not released from his position as Director of FPIW. Mr. Backholm stated that he has no set work schedule for FPIW, and was expected to simply "get the job done." He stated that he worked nights and weekends for FPIW, and to compensate, would occasionally take days or hours off in the middle of the week to spend time with his family or attend his children's school assemblies.
- 3.8 Mr. Backholm stated that his duties as volunteer treasurer for PMW included signing checks, holding weekly conference calls, and acting as spokesman for PMW, including at three or four media or public appearances or debates throughout the campaign. Mr. Backholm did not recall the amount of time he spent working on PMW activities in total or on a daily basis, and did not track this time spent on the PMW campaign. However, he stated that there were many days when he had no active involvement with the campaign. He stated that he did not engage in substantive travel outside the state for PMW, but only attended media activities in the Seattle area.
- 3.9 Mr. Backholm stated that his FPIW work schedule is unpredictable, and involves travel on behalf of his employer. He stated that throughout the year, he is located in his office approximately 40% of the time. He stated that the weekly conference calls he held for PMW happened in a variety of locations,

including his home or car, in media studios, and occasionally from his office, wherever he happened to be at the time. He stated that PMW had a separate office suite in the same building as FPIW, and that he would sign checks and conduct other campaign business in the PMW office. He stated that on occasions when scheduling conflicts arose between FPIW work and PMW activity, the conflicts were resolved in the least inconvenient way for all parties concerned, including by rescheduling obligations.

- 3.10 Additional Untimely Reporting by PMW: In reviewing PMW's response to the complaint, and the committee's contribution and expenditure reports, staff noted instances of late reporting in addition to those noted in the complaint. The additional late-reported activity was as follows:
 - A C-4 report filed on October 30, 2012 for the period of September 1 October 15, 2012 disclosed approximately \$302,000 more in contribution deposits, \$20,000 more in expenditures and approximately \$90,000 more in debts, orders placed, and obligations, than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on October 16, 2012. (Exhibit 8.) Nearly all of the contributions were disclosed in a substantially timely manner on C-3 reports, however the expenditure activity (including debts and obligations), included over \$70,000 in previously undisclosed obligations and payments to Mission Public Affairs for campaign management, and numerous smaller obligations for legal services, video production, and other services. This expenditure activity was due to be disclosed on October 16, 2012, and was reported 14 days late, though seven days before the election.
 - A C-4 report filed on June 6, 2013 for the period of October 16 29, 2012 disclosed approximately \$7,000 more in contribution deposits than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on October 30, 2012. (Exhibit 9.) Again, while the contributions were disclosed in a substantially timely manner on C-3 reports, this deposit activity was due to be disclosed on a C-4 report on October 30, 2012, and was reported 219 days late.
 - A C-4 report filed on January 10, 2013 for the period of October 30 November 30, 2012 disclosed approximately \$43,000 more in debts, orders placed, and obligations than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on December 10, 2012. A subsequent amendment for same reporting period, filed on June 6, 2013, disclosed approximately \$66,000 in additional previously undisclosed debts. (Exhibit 10.) These obligations, for campaign management, consulting, legal, and compliance services, were due to be disclosed on December 10, 2012, and were reported between 31 178 days late.

- 3.11 On September 5, 2014, and November 13, 2014, Mr. Vanderhulst sent written explanations for the additional late reporting by PMW. (Exhibit 11). He stated that the late reported PMW contributions resulted from the committee's inability to know that a credit card contribution had been received until it had actually cleared PMW's account. He stated that the committee obtained contributor data through an online system separate from the credit card processing system so that it could track individual contributions and collect contributor data for reporting purposes, and out of an abundance of caution, used the earliest possible date for each contribution's date of deposit. He stated that in some cases, the lag in discovering this information resulted in a contribution being disclosed after the C-4 cutoff for the relevant deposit date.
- 3.12 Regarding the late reporting of PMW's expenditure activity, Mr. Vanderhulst stated that while PMW did monitor and track the work that consultants and vendors performed on the committee's behalf, PMW reported its debts only when invoiced. He stated that NOM and ActRight Compliance Services and Engagement had an agreement with PMW to combine invoices for their representatives' services during October and November into one, so that the pre-election work would appear on one invoice. He stated that these invoices were not ready until after the C-4 cutoff for December 2012. In the case of Mission Public Affairs, he stated that a good faith mix-up resulted in the vendor failing to provide invoices in a timely manner.
- 3.13 Mr. Vanderhulst stated that in the interest of full disclosure, PMW amended its reports to reflect the dates of debts provided by the vendors, rather than the dates when PMW was made aware that an outstanding debt remained. He stated that no harm to the public resulted from the late disclosure, as it could be determined from PMW's reports that the committee was using certain vendors on a recurring basis, such as Mission Public Affairs, and that the amounts of invoices were frequently consistent. He stated that the corrections to the committee's reports should not be considered late, but rather best efforts to ensure that the reports filed were accurate as soon as information became known.

IV. SCOPE

- 4.1 Staff reviewed the following documents:
 - A complaint against Preserve Marriage Washington (PMW) received on August 15, 2012 from Sandra Turner Fukumoto, under cover letter from the law firm of Davis Wright Tremaine LLP;
 - Email dated September 6, 2012 from Joseph Vanderhulst, Staff Attorney, ActRight Legal Foundation and counsel for PMW;

- An email received on September 5, 2014 from Joseph Vanderhulst with an attached letter (which was also sent First Class Mail), Subject: Explanation of Amendments to C-4 Reports by Preserve Marriage Washington; and
- An email received on November 13, 2014 from Joseph Vanderhulst.
- 4.2 PDC staff interviewed Joseph Backholm, PMW Treasurer, under oath on August 19, 2013.

V. <u>LAW</u>

RCW 42.17A.005(20) defines "expenditure" to include a contract, promise, or agreement, whether or not legally enforceable, to make an expenditure. For the purposes of RCW 421.7A, agreements to make expenditures, contracts, and promises to pay may be reported as estimated obligations until actual payment is made.

RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 require political committees to file timely, accurate reports of monetary and in-kind contributions, including contributions pledged but not received, and monetary and in-kind expenditures, including debts, orders placed and obligations. The reports are filed monthly following an excess of \$200 in contribution or expenditure activity, except during the five months before the election, during which time summary reports of receipts and expenditures are required to be filed 21 days and again 7 days before each election in which the committee is participating. The reports must disclose any debt, obligation, note, unpaid loan, or other liability valued at more than \$250, or valued at more than \$50 that has been outstanding for over thirty days. Any contributions received and expenditures made prior to the date of registration must be disclosed on the day the registration is filed. Reports of contributions must include the name and address of any contributor who has given more than \$25 in the aggregate.

1. Introduction

On February 13, 2012, Washington Governor Christine Gregoire signed Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6239 ("SB 6239") into law, legalizing same-sex marriage in Washington State. Eight days later, Preserve Marriage Washington ("PMW"), which pledges to "preserve marriage as the union between one man and one woman," registered as a single-year political committee with the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission ("PDC"). Before SB 6239 could take effect, PMW and its allies collected enough signatures to put the law up to a popular vote in November 2012, as Referendum 74. Unfortunately, throughout its campaign, PMW has failed to obey Washington State public disclosure laws.

2. Preserve Marriage Washington has Violated RCW § 42.17A.240 by Failing to Report Staff Services as Expenditures, Debt, or, if the Staff was Uncompensated, as In-Kind Contributions.

Under Washington law, political committees like PMW must report staff services as expenditures, debt, *or*, if the staff is uncompensated, as in-kind contributions.⁴ PMW did none of the three, thereby violating RCW § 42.17A.240.

PMW has not reported expenditures for the services of its Campaign Manager, ⁵ Frank Schubert, its Deputy Campaign Director, ⁶ Chris Plante, or its Chairman ⁷ and Treasurer, ⁸ Joseph

Backholm.⁹ If PMW has not compensated these or other staff members, it must report the fair market value of their services either as debt or as an in-kind contribution. However, PMW never reported such services as debt, ¹⁰ and the only in-kind contributions for staff services it reported were in February¹¹ for Mr. Plante and Brian Brown, the President of the National Organization for Marriage. ¹² PMW reported no other staff services as in-kind contributions at any time. ¹³

Since PMW reported staff services only for Mssrs. Plante and Brown in February, PMW violated RCW § 42.17A.240 if Plante or Brown worked for the campaign outside February, or if any other staff worked on the campaign at any time. In reality, Mssrs. Plante, Schubert and Backholm have actively campaigned on behalf of PMW since its inception. Mr. Plante has appeared on several radio programs as a representative of the campaign, ¹⁴ and admitted, according to the organization's own meeting minutes, that "he and his family were moving to Washington State to be able to devote full time to the effort of Referendum 74 [sie]." PMW has reported neither these appearances nor any other campaign work Mr. Plante references. Mr. Schubert, a veteran of California's Proposition 8 fight, also never appears in PMW's disclosure documents, even though he is identified as "leading the messaging effort" as the campaign's "Manager" in the organizations' minutes. ¹⁷ PMW also has not reported Mr. Backholm's services,

Public Disclosure Commission even though he identified himself as the Chairman¹⁸ and Treasurer¹⁹ of the campaign, helped collect the signatures to put R-74 on the ballot,²⁰ and appeared in numerous interviews as a representative of PMW.²¹

Mr. Plante's, Mr. Schubert's, and Mr. Backholm's campaign management services do not qualify under the "volunteer services" disclosure exception. ²² Such services fall under the exception only if the manager "does not ordinarily charge a fee or receive compensation for providing the service. ²³ Mr. Plante charged PMW and PMW compensated him for his campaign services in February. ²⁴ Under the statute, PMW cannot pay Mr. Plante for his services one month and claim he does not ordinarily receive payment the next. Mr. Schubert, too, ordinarily receives a fee for his services. The Associated Press has described him as a "well-paid political consultant," who currently manages four "statewide campaigns" related to same-sex marriage. ²⁵ The facts support this conclusion: the Yes On 8 campaign paid Frank Schubert and his consultancy, Schubert Flint Public Affairs, \$588,242.69 in 2008 for managing its Proposition 8 operations in California. ²⁶

Determining whether Mr. Backholm ordinarily receives a fee presents difficulties precisely because he has worked for organizations under investigation for skirting disclosure laws. On May 15, 2012, the Public Disclosure Commission began investigating Family PAC, a political committee Mr. Backholm founded and ran in 2009, for failing to disclose "over

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\$140,000 in contribution and expenditure activity."²⁷ If Family PAC kept incomplete lectords as to Mr. Backholm, he could succeed in covering one violation with another, posing as a volunteer now because no record exists of Family PAC paying him in 2009. Luckily, Mr. Backholm works as the Executive Director of the Family Policy Institute of Washington's (FPIW). FPIW financial records and tax filings, which are not publicly available, would likely reveal that FPIW compensates Mr. Backholm for his R-74 work, or for similar work, such that he "ordinarily" receives compensation and falls outside the "volunteer" exception. In the end, none of the three men can sidestep the disclosure requirements because each ordinarily receives compensation for similar campaign services.

Just as Mr. Backholm's Family PAC violated Washington State public disclosure laws in 2009, so has Preserve Marriage Washington defied the law by failing to disclose staff services as expenditures, debt, or in-kind contributions. Washington State has one of the strongest histories of openness and transparency in politics of any state in the country. I urge the PDC to hold Preserve Marriage Washington accountable for flouting that tradition and failing to be honest with the citizenry.

Ballot Title

The legislature passed Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6239 concerning marriage for samesex couples, modified domestic-partnership law, and religious freedom, and voters have filed a sufficient referendum petition on this bill.

This bill would allow same-sex couples to marry, preserve domestic partnerships only for seniors, and preserve the right of clergy or religious organizations to refuse to perform, recognize, or accommodate any marriage ceremony.

Ballot Measure Summary

This bill allows same-sex couples to marry, applies marriage laws without regard to gender, and specifies that laws using gender-specific terms like husband and wife include same-sex spouses. After 2014, existing domestic partnerships are converted to marriages, except for seniors. It preserves the right of clergy or religious organizations to refuse to perform or recognize any marriage or accommodate wedding ceremonies. The bill does not affect licensing of religious organizations providing adoption, foster-care, or child-placement.

Ref 74 Steering Committee combined meeting minutes February 29th in Olympia & March 1st in Bothell

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Wednesday February 29th the meeting was held at Westwood Baptist church in Olympia. Lunch was served followed by an informal meeting on the Ref 74 campaign. Joseph Backholm, FPIW opened the meeting. Approximately 35 people attended. Brian Brown from National Organization for Marriage presented. He introduced Frank Schubert as the campaign manager for Ref 74. Frank will be leading the messaging effort. The meeting ended with a very informational and interactive Q and A time.

Thursday March 1st the meeting was held at Cedar Park Church in Bothell. Lunch was served for prayer leaders and for steering committee members followed by an informational meeting in the Chapel of the Resurrection. Approximately 50 people attended. Randy Leskovar opened the meeting. Christopher Plante from National Organization for Marriage said he and his family were moving to Washington State to be able to devote full time to the effort of Referendum 74. Frank Schubert was introduced. He is leading the messaging effort.

Prayer teams: March 1st a group of about 16 prayer leaders from around the state gathered earlier in the day to develop a framework for supporting prayer groups. The state will be divided into its 49 legislative districts plus Olympia for 50 districts. A list will be gathered by Nancy Woods (nancy.2@cedarpark.org) as people volunteer to lead a group or to form a prayer group of two or more people. A bi-weekly prayer objectives list will be emailed to those persons to focus prayer on the gay marriage issue as well as to pray for other important issues in the State of Washington. Diana Wakefield and Susan Johnson will assemble the prayer objectives and Nancy Woods will send them out.

Frank indicated that he has been involved in politics all his adult life and is a Public Affairs professional having been twice named as the "Most Valuable Political Consultant" by the trade association. He reported on his role in Proposition 8 in California which had 250,000 volunteers and some 100,000 who took off work on election day to help get out the vote. They began with similar numbers to Washington State and ended with a victory of 52+% to 47+%. The Ref 74 campaign will need tens of thousands of volunteers.

He noted that the 9th District Federal Court had overturned the results of Proposition 8. Their reasoning was that once a state had granted the right to marriage for same sex couples, it could not take it away. Therefore a Referendum which prevents Washington's law from taking effect is the only sure way to prevent same sex marriage. An Initiative without a successful referendum would be appealed to the same 9th District and would likely suffer the same fate. The Referendum must be successful.

In the message, we will be defending the tradition of marriage and pointing out the consequences of changing it. He noted the law, if allowed to stand, would be one statute imposing genderless marriage upon everyone. It would impact the Catholic Church in their program of adoption and many others. It would impact what children are taught in public school about homosexuality and about marriage. If you disagree, you would be in conflict with the law. Counselors who declined to counsel would be in conflict with the law. The message could be summarized as the truth about marriage and the truth about consequences. It will not be negative toward gays. Indeed, some emphasis will be given to the fact that gays already have every right connected with marriage and this law will not grant them any further rights of any kind.

Frank reviewed the Ballot Title process. The language is presently being appealed in Thurston County court with a hearing set for March 13th and a decision within 5 days of that date. Petitions could be printed immediately after that.

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The distribution process aims to have two locations in every legislative district for distribution and pickup. Joseph Backholm is currently managing this effort. There will be training made available to volunteers working to gather signatures on the petition.

There will be conference calls, powerpoint presentations, and FAQ made available.

There will be a heavy emphasis upon voter ID with the ultimate aim to persuade the "mushy middle" to vote Reject on Referendum 74.

Persuading people will require a budget of about \$4 million dollars and people were encouraged to contribute starting now.

A brief discussion was held about the campaign structure which includes a very small executive committee and a much larger Steering Committee.

He encouraged leaders to have people sign up on the www.PreserveMarriageWashington.com website to volunteer, request petitions, and donate.

Professional handouts were provided for leaders to take and distribute; Why Preserving Marriage Matters, Email Your Friends/Spread the Word, The Threat to Marriage, and a mail-in sign-up sheet for volunteers.

Pray: We need all churches, ministries and organizations praying for the next steps. We need prayer for: more churches lorganizations to join, for finances, for volunteers and for preparation for the signature gathering phase. March 13th is the court date on Ref 74 pray for a favorable outcome.

The goal of the "steering committee" is to form a group of pastors and other leaders and work together to activate their networks, engage in the process of gathering signatures for Ref 74, educate voters on the issues and turn out voters.

The Ref 74 Steering Committee will meet monthly. Tele-conferences will be made available soon. The goal of these meetings is to have an interactive format where leaders can get information on the campaign, build a stronger united coalition and be more effective in getting out our message of preserving God-ordained Biblical marriage.

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Opponents of Gay Marriage Face Tougher Test in Washington State

OLYMPIA, Wash. - Evenly matched ballot fights over same-sex marriage have been about as rare in American politics as transits of Venus. Opponents have won by a knockout in state after state, with voters consistently preferring to define matrimony as a compact only for heterosexuals.

h Olympia, Wash., Joseph Backholm delivered petitions on Wednesday seeking a voter repeal of a new state law allowing same-sex marriages.

Same-Sex Marriage Issue Moves Closer to Justices (June 6, 2012)

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But as a consortium of groups opposed to Washington State's fourmonth-old gender-neutral marriage law filed their petitions here in the capital on Wednesday - the first salvo in a battle to repeal the statute at the ballot box in November -

independent polls suggest that the playing field, at least here, may be leveling.

President Obama's endorsement of same-sex marriage rights last month is probably the biggest new variable in a state that he won handily in 2008 and where he still had a 54 percent approval rating in a poll released last week by Strategies 360.

Washington is also the only state where voters have confirmed domestic partnership rights for gay couples, ratifying in 2009 a law passed by the Legislature. And support for that statute, which would not be affected by a November vote on the marriage law, has grown even stronger since 2009, said Matt Barreto, an associate professor of political science at the University of

Washington and principal investigator for the Washington Poll, which has regularly surveyed voters on the issue.

What that means, he said, is that supporters of the rollback on the word "marriage" will need a far more delicate approach here than they have taken in other states, or risk a backlash from the majority of Washingtonians who say they want gays and lesbians to share the same legal rights.

Organizers of the petition drive said at a news conference on Wednesday that the outpouring of signatures - now facing a certification process by the secretary of state's office - spoke for itself. The issue, they said, is far from settled.

"By the end of the day, we're going to have upwards of 240,000 signatures, which is double the minimum requirement of eligible signatures and, we believe, the largest

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

number of signatures ever delivered in a referendum in Washington State," said Joseph Backholm, the chairman of Preserve Marriage Washington.

Mr. Backholm added that because the civil union law was not being challenged, the new debate over marriage would not be about taking away or preserving legal protections. Instead, he said, Washington voters would decide a finer distinction for only marriage itself and could thus vote to repeal the new law without feeling that legal harm was being

Supporters of Washington's law said the past four months - as opponents scurried to gather signatures - gave them an opportunity to prepare a defense. They plan a counterpunch campaign with a coalition of once-unlikely allies, including many church groups that now support or conduct same-sex weddings.

"I wouldn't suggest that it's a settled issue," said Zach Silk, the campaign manager of Washington United for Marriage, which is leading the ballot fight in support of the law. "Our opponents are very good, and every time this has come to the ballot it has won."

What is harder to measure, he said, is the impact of the personal stories that Washington residents have heard from President Obama and from Gov. Christine Gregoire, a Democrat who signed the law in February and talked about how her daughters had helped change her thinking on the issue, just as Mr. Obama's daughters had helped change his.

According to the telephone poll by Strategies 360, 54 percent of likely voters in Washington, questioned in late May, said it should be legal for gay and lesbian couples to marry. In the poll of 500 likely voters, with a margin of sampling error of plus or minus 4 percentage points, at least 50 percent of those under 65 said same-sex marriage should be

But no matter what happens in November, the filing of the petitions on Wednesday has stopped the clock for gay couples waiting to tie the knot. The marriage law would have taken effect on Wednesday, but is now on hold pending November's vote.

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Opponents block Washington state gay marriage

OLYMPIA, Wash. (AP) — Washington's gay marriage law was blocked from taking effect Wednesday, as opponents filed more than 200,000 signatures seeking a public vote on the issue in November.

Preserve Marriage Washington submitted the signatures just a day before the state was to begin allowing same-sex marriages. State officials will review the signatures over the next week to determine if proposed Referendum 74 will qualify for a public vote, though the numbers suggest the measure will make the ballot easily.

"The current definition of marriage works and has worked," said Joseph Backholm, the chair of Preserve Marriage Washington, as he stood next to stacked boxes of petitions.

The law, passed by the Legislature and signed by Gov. Chris Gregoire earlier this year, would make Washington the seventh state to have legal same-sex marriages.

National groups have already promised time and money to fight the law, including the Washington, D.C.-based National Organization for Marriage, which was involved in ballot measures that overturned same-sex marriage in California and Maine.

Gay marriage supporters, expecting that the referendum would qualify, have already been raising money to protect the law. Zach Silk, campaign manager for Washington United for Marriage, expects both sides to raise millions of dollars.

"It's fair to say it's going to be an extremely expensive race," Silk said.

The issue has implications on ballots across the nation.

President Barack Obama recently declared his support for gay marriage. In Washington state, the referendum has split the state's two candidates for governor. Maryland legalized gay marriage this year as well, but that state is also poised to have a public vote this fall.

Washington state has had domestic partnership laws since 2007 and in 2009 passed an "everything but marriage" expansion of that law, which was ultimately upheld by voters after a referendum challenge.

A poll by Seattle consulting firm Strategies 360 showed that 54 percent of voters in the state think it should be legal for same-sex couples to get married, though the poll didn't specifically ask them how they would vote on a referendum.

Perry Gordon lives in Roy but came to Olympia to watch the signature filing and to support gay marriage. He called gay marriage a matter of equality and encouraged Washington voters to consider their conscience.

"Would you want somebody to tell you that the only recognized marriage should be between a man and a man or a woman and a woman? How would you feel about that?" Gordon said in an interview.

Gordon is gay and said he'd like to get married at some point in the future.

Backholm, meanwhile, raised the specter of polygamy and marriage within families while making his case against gay marriage. He said the law would redefine marriage as it's been known for generations and suggested a possible slippery slope to other types of marriage.

"We have to think about the precedent we're creating," he said.

Gay marriage is legal in New York, Connecticut, Iowa, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont and Washington, D.C.

The Washington secretary of state's office recommends that referendum campaigns submit about 150,000 signatures in order to provide a cushion for invalid or duplicate signatures. Backholm estimated the anti-gay marriage campaign was delivering about 240,000 signatures.

Strategist is central figure against gay marriage

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Four years ago, Frank Schubert was a well-paid political consultant for what he jokingly calls "the forces of evil" — tobacco, timber and pharmaceutical companies — when he agreed to lead the 2008 campaign to repeal gay marriage in California.

What started as a professional challenge has now become a personal crusade. And Schubert, a specialist in political messaging, has become the central figure in a major effort to stop gay marriage from becoming legal across the country.

Part Karl Rove and part Pat Robertson, Schubert Is managing four statewide campaigns where the issue is on the ballot in the fall — in Maine, Maryland, Minnesota and Washington, He's trying to preserve a winning streak in which conservatives have put anti-gay marriage laws on the books in 31 states since 1998.

But that achievement could be in danger as some national polls show public opinion gradually shifting toward accepting gay marriage. Six states plus the District of Columbia allow it. In Maryland and Washington, governors have signed laws to permit same-sex marriage, but those laws are on hold until the November referendums.

Schubert said his mission to make voters understand what's at stake.

"Five thousand years have shown that marriage between a man and a woman serves us well," he said, adding that it is "fundamental to our nature as people." The alternative, he said, is a culture based on personal desires.

The initiatives this year will feature a collision of well-funded organizations and media efforts as sophisticated as any national political campaign. The National Organization for Marriage, a Washington-based nonprofit supported by conservative donors, is funding Schubert's effort. Gay rights groups and backers are heavily invested on the other side. The opposing forces are expected to spend up to \$20 million in Minnesota alone.

The campaigns will provide a new test of the competing messages about the contentious issue: Do gays deserve the same right to many as heterosexuals? Or should society allow children to grow up in an environment in which same-sex marriage is a viable life choice?

Schubert deftly targets the latter message at parents.

"That's a major argument for us, that whenever people have gone to the polls, they've voted our way," Schubert sald last week during a two-day visit to Minnesota to check in on the campaign there.

In addition to the 31 states that forbid same-sex maniage, voters in a 32nd state, Maine, overturned a gay maniage law that had been approved by the Legislature.

Gay rights organizers begrudgingly admire Schubert's ability as much as they detest what he's

"Whether we like it or not, he's done a very good job of tapping into fears people have about homosexuality that are still very real," said Julie Davis, a San Francisco-based GLBT activist.

For Schubert, a stocky, white-bearded 56-year-old, the cause has been a perfect union of his professional background and personal values.

Earlier this year, Schubert gave up the 15-member consulting firm he co-founded in California, which he sald billed \$2.5 million in a slow year, to become a one-man shop in a field that is "far less lucrative." But he said his work "has deepened my own faith, deepened my own marriage."

He said not everyone understands his choice, even in his own family. Schubert has a younger sister raising children with her lesbian partner.

"I love my sister very much, and I wanted her to know that my working on this issue was not a reflection of me seeing her as a less valuable person," he said.

Anne Marie Schubert, a Sacramento County prosecutor, declined to be interviewed for this story.

Always a Republican, Schubert worked in the California state assembly and for Republican candidates before managing public initiative campaigns in Western states. In California and Oregon, he led campaigns to strike down tobacco tax increases by sowing public doubts about how the money would be spent.

Schubert has twice won a yearly MVP award bestowed by the bipartisan American Association of Political Consultants.

"Rove only won one!" he said, bentering with Minnesota campaign staff before a strategy session during his visit.

Schubert's campaigns use TV ads to drive home a message about gay marriage's "consequences." A typical ad in California showed a young girl running up to her mother: "Morn, guess what I learned in school today? I learned how a prince can marry a prince, and I can marry a princess!" Then, cut to a conservative law professor: "Think it can't happen? It already has."

In 2009, Schubert led the campaign that overturned Maine's gay marriage law and unseated three lowa Supreme Court justices who ruled gay marriage legal in that state. Earlier this year, he engineered passage of North Carolina's gay marriage ban.

The oldest of eight children, Schubert grew up in Sacramento and attended an all-male Jesuit

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high school. His first marriage ended after nine years and two children; he had it annulled. His deepening Roman Catholic convictions, he said, helped him make a better second marriage and support one of his daughters in overcoming addiction problems.

In addition to his work on gay marriage, Schubert says he also hopes to pursue state laws to make diworce more difficult.

Schubert spends his time leading staff strategy meetings and stopping at Christian radio stations, always leaving time to pray a daily rosary.

He says he's confident about winning in all four campaigns this year but admits to not knowing where public attitudes on gay mamage will be in a decade or two.

"I think it's very much an open question," he said.



PDC staff generated complaint filed against Family PAC

On October 21, 2009, Family PAC filed a C-1pc Political Committee Registration with the Public Disclosure Commission, indicating its status as a continuing political committee that would conduct activity on an on-going basis. On the C-1pc registration Family PAC's treasurer, Joseph Backholm, chose the Full Reporting option, certifying that the frequent, detailed campaign reports mandated by law would be filed as required. See Exhibit #1.

Following litigation challenging the constitutionality of several state laws, Family PAC recently filed a request for reimbursement of its attorneys fees and costs. In its pleadings, Family PAC stated that it has been receiving legal services, and expenditures for legal services have been made on its behalf, since September 16, 2009. Family PAC has stated that the amount claimed in the fee request is only a portion of the fees and costs it has received since 2009.

Contributions to a political committee to pay for legal services, in-kind contributions of legal services performed for less than full consideration, debts and obligations related to legal services, and monetary expenditures to pay for legal services are all reportable under RCW 42.17.080, RCW 42.17.090, RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW 42.17A.240. In the case of Family PAC, the amount of reportable activity connected with legal services would appear to exceed \$140,000 because, based on Family PAC's representations, that figure represents only a portion of the fees and costs incurred in litigating the committee's challenge to Washington laws and rules.

¹ Effective January 1, 2012, RCW 42.17.080 and RCW 42.17.090 were recodified as RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW 42.17A.240, respectively. Contributions and expenditures required to be disclosed on or after January 1, 2012 are therefore governed under RCW 42.17A.

Since Family PAC's October 21, 2009 C-1pc registration, the committee has not filed any reports of contribution or expenditure activity with the PDC, including any debts owed.

Alleged Violations:

The facts referenced above provide reason to believe that Family PAC failed to disclose over \$140,000 in contribution and expenditure activity connected with legal services rendered to the political committee. These contributions and expenditures were required to be disclosed in PDC filings accessible to the public as early as September 30, 2009, and have not been disclosed.

Based on this information, I am filing this complaint and directing staff to investigate the allegation that Family PAC may have violated chapter RCW 42.17 and 42.17A.

Good afternoon Mr Perkins,

I write to respond on behalf of Preserve Marriage Washington to the letter they received from the PDC dated August 23, 2012, concerning the complaint received by the PDC dated August 15, 2012.

The complaint alleges that PMW has violated Washington law by failing to report staff services. Specifically, the complaint refers to staff services provided by Frank Schubert, who serves as Campaign Manager; Chris Plante, who serves as Deputy Campaign Director; and Joseph Backholm, who serves as Chairman and Treasurer. The complaint is unfounded and frivolous because the services provided by Mr Schubert and Mr Plante have been accounted for on PMW's reports and Mr Backholm serves under the volunteer exception.

Mr Schubert began serving as Campaign Manager in April 2012, and is compensated by a retainer agreement. PMW's report filed on August 10 shows payments made on these retainers in July and a vendor debt for the invoiced July retainer. Due to an administrative error, the invoices received by PMW for earlier retainers did not make it onto the May 10, June 10, and July 10 reports. But these reports have been amended to correct this oversight.

Mr Plante's initial service in setting up PMW was reported as an in-kind contribution from the National Organization for Marriage (Mr Plante's employer) to PMW. All subsequent service has been done pursuant to a retainer and has been invoiced and reported as a vendor debt to NOM on PMW's reports. Again, we have amended PMW's reports to make it more clear what the debts to NOM are for and to supplement some earlier numbers that were estimates.

Mr Backholm serves as a volunteer. Unlike Mr Schubert and Mr Plante, who have served as paid campaign managers for similar committees in the past in other states, Mr Backholm has not and does not ordinarily charge a fee or receive compensation for serving as Chairman and Treasurer. As the complaint acknowledges, he does the same for Family PAC.

Feel free to contact me to go over this information and the notice so that I can answer any questions you may have. We look forward to hearing from you and to resolving this complaint.



Dear Mr. Stutzman and Mr. Perkins:

In a letter dated March 6, 2013, the Washington PDC notified Preserve Marriage Washington (PMW) that PDC staff will investigate the allegations contained in the complaint filed by Sandra Turner Fukumoto. PMW submitted a preliminary response to those allegations on September 6, 2013, and the March 6 letter requested an additional response addressing four specific issues. Please accept the following as PMW's responses:

- 1. Mr. Backholm was not compensated in any way by the Family Policy Institute of Washington (FPIW) for the time spent providing services as Treasurer of PMW.
- 2. Neither his duties nor his work schedule with FPIW were affected by Mr. Backholm's serving as Treasurer for PMW. The FPIW board of directors did not grant Mr. Backholm leave from his duties with FPIW because FPIW continued to function as it had previously. All work done on behalf of PMW was done in addition to his responsibilities with FPIW.
- 3. Because Mr. Backholm's duties and work schedule with FPIW were not affected, his compensation from FPIW was not affected. Mr. Backholm did not take paid leave because he did not take leave or time off from FPIW, but continued to work the same amount of time for FPIW as he had before becoming Treasurer for PMW. As stated in

Mr Philip Stutzman Page 2 of 2

PMW's preliminary response, Mr. Backholm fulfilled the responsibilities involved in serving as Treasurer of PMW on a volunteer basis. Mr. Frank Schubert served as Campaign Manager and Mr. Christopher Plante served as Deputy Campaign Manager and they managed the day-to-day running of the campaign. Their compensation was reported.

4. PMW did not make use of the office space or other administrative resources of FPIW, or of any other person or entity. PMW hired and paid its own administrative staff, as has been reported. Early on in the campaign, calls were received by FPIW regarding the marriage ballot measure campaign, but these were directed to PMW and staff were instructed to clarify that FPIW was not involved in the ballot measure campaign.

Re: Explanation of Amendments to C-4 Reports by Preserve Marriage Washington

Dear Mr. Perkins,

In an email dated July 14, 2014, you requested a response and explanation for three amendments made by Preserve Marriage Washington to three C-4 reports originally filed in 2012. The details of your questions are as follows:

- 1. A C-4 report filed on October 30, 2012 for the period of September 1 October 15, 2012 disclosed approximately \$302,000 more in contribution deposits and approximately \$90,000 in debts, orders placed, and obligations, than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on October 16, 2012. (See attached C-4 reports filed for the September 1 October 15, 2012 reporting period.) This activity was due to be disclosed on October 16, 2012.
- 2. A C-4 report filed on June 6, 2013 for the period of October 16-29, 2012 disclosed approximately \$7,000 more in contribution deposits than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on October 30, 2012. (See attached C-4 reports filed for the October 16-29 reporting period.) This activity was due to be disclosed on October 30, 2012.
- 3. A C-4 report filed on January 10, 2013 for the period of October 30 November 30, 2012 disclosed approximately \$43,000 more in debts, orders placed, and obligations than the original C-4 report for the same period, filed on December 10, 2012. A subsequent amendment for the same reporting period, filed on June 6, 2013, disclosed approximately \$66,000 in additional undisclosed debts. (See attached C-4 reports filed for the October 30 November 30, 2012 reporting period.) This activity was due to be disclosed on December 10, 2012.

Preserve Marriage Washington ("PMW"), through counsel, hereby provides an explanation and mitigating information regarding the amendments to its C-4 reports updating its contribution and debt information. As is recognized in the PDC's Political Committee Campaign Disclosure

Instructions (see page 59), as well as in the existence of the ability to file amended reports through the ORCA software, committees may need to adjust and amend C-4 reports for many reasons. At all times, PMW made a good faith effort to disclose all of its financial activity and to amend its reports as soon as errors were detected or previously unknown information came to light.

Essentially, all three of the amendments mentioned above were made to address two issues. One with contributions received below the itemization threshold, and the other regarding outstanding obligations.

1. Contributions

Washington's campaign disclosure laws require contributions to be deposited within five business days of receipt. Contributions must be itemized if they are \$25 or more and must be reported on C-3 reports on a weekly basis (at least during the reporting periods mentioned above).

PMW received over \$3 million in contributions. Many of these contributions were made online using credit cards. Many of these contributions were below the \$25 itemization threshold. There is a significant lag, as is always the case with credit card processing, between the moments when an individual submits a contribution on a website, to when the funds are processed through merchant accounts, and then the particular contribution is deposited into PMW's bank account. Often these lags span several days and in almost every instance individual contributions are batched and deposited to the destination bank account in lump sums. Furthermore, the amounts are deposited with the processing fees already withdrawn. Therefore, it is impossible to know exactly when and in what batch a given individual contribution was actually deposited. The credit card processing systems do not provide individual contribution tracking and contributor information.

Washington law is not clear on what date a credit card contribution is considered "received" and is also not clear on whether a credit card batch deposit is considered a "deposit" for purposes of filing a C-3 report. Early in 2012, counsel for PMW reached out by phone to the two members of the compliance team at the PDC to request clarification. They were told to make best efforts and use the earliest known date to ensure compliance. In addition, the FEC also officially recommends using the earliest known date. PMW obtained contributor data through an online system separate from the credit card processing system so that it could track individual contributions and collect contributor data for reporting purposes. Accordingly, PMW used the dates in this system (which was the date of the initial click by the contribution) as the date of the contribution received. PMW then made best efforts to match the contributions with the deposits made through the credit card company for the C-3 reports.

The October 16, 2012 C-4 report was the first report in the year that involved a turnaround of just one day. PMW's contributions, as undoubtedly was the case with every committee, were heaviest in October before the general election. As a result, because of the lag of sometimes

several days, it became apparent only after an internal review and audit of the accounts that some contributions were actually "received" before a cut-off date, even though there was no way to know this at the time. This is the source of the first contribution amendment update.

In addition to the lag explanation, the second contribution update was also the result of an internal audit that was conducted in order to ensure that all contributions were disclosed. Again, the audit was necessary because of the lag between the contribution and deposit dates, the inability to know exactly when a given contribution actually cleared in PMW's bank account, and the one day or same week turn around for reports. The audit revealed that an additional \$7,000 in small donations had been received.

2. Outstanding Obligations

PMW disclosed all of its outstanding obligations as soon as they were known. Unfortunately, a couple of its vendors provided invoices later on in the campaign. In the interest of full disclosure, PMW chose to amend its reports to reflect the debts as of the dates provided by the vendors, rather than when PMW was made aware that there was still an outstanding debt.

Most of the debts relate to Mission Public Affairs, which was hired by the campaign to provide management. Following the conclusion of the election campaign, there was a good faith mix-up in which some invoices were discovered to be missing and an accounting was done after the campaign to ensure that all invoices were accounted for. PMW promptly disclosed all outstanding obligations once these were sorted out.

In addition, there was a glitch with the ORCA software that resulted in a \$27,294.18 invoice being reported twice. PMW informed the PDC tech staff of this issue by phone at the time. But this accounts for some of the increases in one of the reports.

No harm resulted to the public, as it could be determined from the reports that PMW was using certain vendors on a recurring basis, such as Mission Public Affairs, and that the amounts invoices were frequently consistent.

For these reasons, the corrections to the contributions and debts reported through PMW's amendments should not be considered late. They should be considered best efforts to ensure that the reports filed were accurate as soon as information became known.

Mr. Perkins,

On behalf of PMW, here are the explanations in response to the questions in your email of October 13:

- 1. The audit was informal and was done shortly before the amendment was made. PMW and ActRight Compliance Services (the vendor who handled the processing of contributions) do not have a record of what prompted the audit.
- 2. No discrepancy existed in October 2012 between PMW's actual deposits and its PDC contribution filings. As explained in our previous response, the way the PDC requires credit card contributions to be reported does not match the way they appear in PMW's accounts. PMW is required to report contributions as of the date that the donation was made, not the date that it cleared in PMW's account. So, during October, when some reports are required to cover data up to the day before the report, PMW was required to report contributions that had not cleared and would not clear for some days. In addition, the ORCA software requires each donation to be manually entered (only contacts can be uploaded). Despite good faith efforts, this resulted in having to go back and update the reports when the bank clearing caught up with the reporting. Most of these amendments were made shortly after the election. For whatever reason (the timing corresponds with when PMW was responding to complaints filed against it) another audit was done in mid-2013 to catch any other errors or missed contributions. At all times, PMW made a good faith effort to ensure that each and every contribution it received was reported.
- 3. PMW did monitor and track the work that consultants and vendors were doing on its behalf. All of the obligations that were disclosed through the amendments were ongoing vendors who were on adjustable retainers. These were Mission Public Affairs, NOM, and ActRight Compliance Services and Engagement. The good faith mix-up with Mission Public Affairs has been explained. The other vendors had agreed to combine their October/November invoices into one so that the pre-election work would appear on one invoice. The invoices reflected a combination of a flat rate with a cost portion. The invoices were not ready until after the reporting cutoff in December. Instead of waiting to report the invoices on the year-end report, however, (which is when they would have been due) PMW decided to amend its earlier reports, so that the obligations would appear on the reports closer to when the work was done.

Let me know if anything else needs to be clarified.

Following up on your letter dated September 5, 2014, I have a few additional questions to ask, in order that I may fully and accurately portray Preserve Marriage Washington's response to the complaint in this case. Please review the questions below and reply to let me know when I can expect a substantive response.

- 1. Regarding the PMW audit that revealed the \$7,000 in previously undisclosed small contributions from October 2012, was this audit performed just prior to the June 6, 2013 report that disclosed these contributions? If so, what prompted the audit?
- 2. If a \$7,000 discrepancy existed in October 2012 between PMW's actual deposits and its PDC contribution filings, why did PMW not audit its books at that time to resolve the discrepancy?
- 3. Regarding the late reporting of obligations to PMW's vendors, did PMW have any basis other than vendor invoices to estimate and disclose its debts and obligations as required by Washington law? Did the committee monitor or track in any way the work that consultants or vendors were performing on its behalf? If not, why not?
