Executive Summary and Staff Analysis Jay Inslee for Washington - 2016 Campaign

PDC Case No. 15-065

This summary highlights staff's findings, conclusions, and recommendations regarding the allegations contained in PDC Case No. 15-065, a 45-Day Citizen Action Complaint (Complaint) filed on May 27, 2015 by Susan Hutchison, Chair, Washington State Republican Party (WSRP) against Jay Inslee for Washington – 2016 Campaign.

Background

The Citizen Action Complaint was filed with the Washington Attorney General's Office and referred to the PDC for investigation and possible action on June 2, 2015. On June 24, 2015, staff received an addendum to the complaint from Caleb Heimlich, Executive Director of WSRP, alleging additional violations by Jay Inslee for Washington. Staff included the allegations in the addendum in its investigation.

Allegations

The Citizen Action Complaint alleged that the Inslee campaign spent funds to conduct a personal grass roots lobbying campaign on behalf of Governor Inslee, and that such use was a personal use of campaign funds by Governor Inslee not directly related to his reelection campaign, an alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.445, as supported by WAC 390-16-238. The complaint further alleged that Governor Inslee failed to report his grass roots lobbying campaign on PDC form L-6, an alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.640. The addendum to the complaint cited four additional occasions where similar alleged personal use of campaign funds for grass roots lobbying occurred.

Investigative Findings

Staff found that the Inslee campaign engaged in activities that initially appeared to constitute grass roots lobbying. Those activities included sending seven emails between December 2014 and May 2015, informing recipients of Governor Inslee's position on issues important to him, and that were under consideration by the 2015 legislature. The emails were sent on December 7, 2014, December 16, 2014, December 18, 2014, January 27, 2015, February 16, 2015, March 5, 2015, and May 7, 2015.

Staff's review of the complaint, addendum, and evidence indicates that the emails in question were sent to Governor Inslee's email list, not to the general public. We found that the emails described the governor's position on several issues under consideration by the 2015 legislature, including at least one piece of legislation identified by bill number, and directed the reader to click on links to visit pages on the Inslee campaign's Web site. (Unlike the emails sent by the campaign, the Web pages they linked to were publically accessible.)

None of the emails or Web pages facilitated direct contact with members of the legislature, for example by including the legislative hotline telephone number, or specific legislator contact information. Rather, they afforded the reader the opportunity to

express the reader's views on issues of interest to the governor, by filling out a contact form. Staff's review of the linked Web forms indicates that only the visitor's email address and zip code were required information on the Web forms; the visitor's first and last name were optional.

The Inslee campaign stated that the names and contact information of the individuals who completed the Web forms were entered into the campaign's campaign contact database. The campaign stated that it did not use the responses to present a petition or similar message to state legislators, that none of the names of the responding individuals were presented to state legislative officials, and that state legislative officials were not informed of the responses in any other way. Staff found no evidence that legislators or legislative staff members were contacted by the Inslee campaign about the issues cited in the emails. Despite the fact that petitions were mentioned in the emails, no evidence was found that petitions were created or delivered to any legislative members or their staff.

The Inslee campaign stated that the relevant expenses were directly related to the governor's reelection campaign, and that if not for his campaign, the governor would not have incurred them. The campaign stated that the purpose of the emails was to maintain and build Governor Inslee's supporter base in preparation for the 2016 election. The campaign stated that an incumbent running for reelection faces a basic challenge of maintaining the supporter base that helped him get elected. They stated that an obvious means of maintaining their support is to demonstrate that the candidate is using his time in office to pursue the goals of the candidate and his supporters. The campaign stated that the communications at issue built connections between the governor and his supporters, and that by soliciting action from these supporters, the campaign was able to gather information as to who on its email list replied or took action. They stated that gathering information about the accuracy of a campaign's email list is a critical piece of the preparation that goes into preparing for an election year.

Staff found that the expenses associated with sending the emails and creating the related Web pages were reported in the Inslee campaign's monthly PDC reports. The Inslee campaign used two vendors to produce the emails and websites, Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive. Both firms are paid a regular monthly fee for ongoing campaign work. The email and website work cited in the complaint was completed by these vendors as part of their monthly work, and no additional billing was done. No additional fees were paid to these vendors for the email and website work.

The Inslee campaign stated that it included Washington Conservation Voters in certain of its emails and Web pages because of the organization's support for the governor's positions on the issues. Washington Conservation Voters did not pay for any of the work, and was not listed in the relevant emails or Web pages as a sponsor. The Inslee campaign included the campaign's sponsor identification information on its political advertising materials.

Although not cited in the complaint, staff found that Trilogy Interactive, a vendor to the Inslee campaign, provided work product to Washington Conservations Voters in the form of contact information for the individuals who responded to one of the Inslee campaign's emails. The campaign stated that it understands that the provision of this information to Washington Conservations Voters did not lead to the individuals' names or contact information being communicated to state officials.

Conclusion

Staff found no evidence that Governor Inslee or his campaign made prohibited personal use of campaign funds for grass roots lobbying not directly related to the governor's reelection campaign. Staff found that the Jay Inslee for Washington – 2016 Campaign reported the expenses on C-4 summary reports required under RCW 42.17A.235 and .240, and that by virtue of this reporting, no disclosure on form L-6 was required under RCW 42.17A.640. For these reasons, staff concludes there is insufficient evidence to establish a violation by Governor Inslee or his campaign of RCW 42.17A.445 or of RCW 42.17A.640.

No evidence was found that the Inslee campaign authorized its vendor Trilogy Interactive to provide work product to Washington Conservation Voters, an outside party; as stated above, no evidence was found that the provision of this information resulted in grass roots lobbying by Washington Conservation Voters. However, the Commission's rules state that contributions received by a candidate are subject to the prohibition in RCW 42.17A.445 on personal use, whether the candidate's committee converts the contributions to a different form. Accordingly, staff believes it would be appropriate to advise the Inslee Campaign to take steps to prevent the future transfer of work product, goods, services, or anything of value sponsored by the campaign to any other person for less than full consideration, because such action could be construed as a prohibited personal use of contributions.

Recommendation

For the reasons described above, staff recommends that the Commission recommend to the Attorney General that no further action be taken on the Citizen Action Complaint.

Applicable Statutes, Rules, and Interpretations

RCW 42.17A.445

Contributions received and reported in accordance with RCW $\underline{42.17A.220}$ through $\underline{42.17A.240}$ and $\underline{42.17A.425}$ may only be paid to a candidate, or a treasurer or other individual or expended for such individual's personal use under the following circumstances (Excerpts of each of the qualifying forms of reimbursement):

(1) Reimbursement for or payments to cover lost earnings incurred as a result of campaigning or services performed for the political committee.

- (2) Reimbursement for direct out-of-pocket election campaign and postelection campaign related expenses made by the individual.
- (3) Repayment of loans made by the individual to political committees shall be reported pursuant to RCW <u>42.17A.240</u>.

RCW 42.17A.640

Any person who has made expenditures, not reported by a registered lobbyist under RCW 42.17A.615 or by a candidate or political committee under RCW 42.17A.225 or 42.17A.235, exceeding *one thousand dollars in the aggregate within any three-month period or exceeding *five hundred dollars in the aggregate within any one-month period in presenting a program to the public, a substantial portion of which is intended, designed, or calculated primarily to influence legislation shall register and report, as provided in subsection (2) of this section, as a sponsor of a grass roots lobbying campaign.

WAC 390-16-238 (Excerpts from the WAC)

- (1) Except as specifically allowed by chapter <u>42.17A</u> RCW, any expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds that is not directly related to the candidate's election campaign is a personal use of campaign funds prohibited under RCW <u>42.17A.445</u>.
- (2) An expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds shall be considered personal use if it fulfills or pays for any commitment, obligation or expense that would exist irrespective of the candidate's election campaign. ...
- (4) Examples of expenditures presumed to be for personal use include, but are not limited to:
 - (a) Mortgage, rent, utility or maintenance expenses for personal living accommodations;
 - (b) Clothing purchases and maintenance expenses not related to the campaign:
 - (c) Automobile expenses not related to the campaign;
 - (d) Travel expenses not related to the campaign;
 - (e) Household food items:
 - (f) Restaurant expenses except for in-person fund-raising or campaign organizational activities:
 - (g) Tuition payments not related to the campaign;
 - (h) Admission to sporting events, concerts, theaters, or other forms of entertainment unless the event is primarily related to the candidate's campaign;
 - (i) Country club membership fees, dues and payments;
 - (j) Health club or recreational facility membership fees, dues and payments;
 - (k) Social, civic, fraternal, or professional membership dues, fees and payments unless the expenditure occurs during an election year and membership is required to gain access to the organization's mailing list for campaign purposes or other facilities for the candidate's campaign;
 - (I) Home or business internet service provider costs;
 - (m) Home or business newspaper and periodical subscriptions;
 - (n) Greeting cards to persons who would customarily receive such cards (e.g., family, friends and business associates).

I. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

1.1 On May 27, 2015, the Washington State Attorney General's Office (AGO) received a 45-Day Citizen Action Letter complaint against Jay Inslee for Washington. On June 2, 2015 the 45-Day Citizen Action Letter was forwarded to the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) from the AGO. The AGO requested the PDC to review and make recommendation(s), or schedule an administrative hearing. The 45-Day Citizen's complaint came from Susan Hutchison, Chair, Washington State Republican Party. The complaint alleges that the Jay Inslee for Washington – 2016 Campaign has allegedly violated provisions from RCW 42.17A and WAC 390-16.

II. ALLEGATIONS IN COMPLAINT

2.1 In her complaint dated May 27, 2015, Ms. Hutchison, Chair, Washington State Republican Party, alleged that the Jay Inslee for Washington – 2016 Campaign 1) made personal use of contributions prohibited under RCW 42.17A.445, and 2) failed to register and report as the sponsor of a grassroots lobbying campaign under RCW 42.17A.640¹. On three occasions the Jay Inslee for Washington sent emails to a list of supporters asking them to support legislation during the 2015 legislative session. Three emails and

linked Web pages were included with the complaint and are listed below as Exhibits 1, 2, and 3:

- 2.2 Email dated January 27, 2015, Subject Line: "Where will you be when Washington Leads?" There is House Bill number 1314 listed, however the there is no information for the public to call the legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. An excerpt from the email states:
 - "...Today, the Washington State House of Representatives Is holding a public hearing on HB 1314, a bill that would hold Washington's largest polluters accountable. This is our opportunity. We need to prove that Washington has what it takes to lead this transition to a clean energy economy. That's why activitists with Washington Conservation Voters are stepping up and joining me to show their support for this bill. Will you join us and show that Washington is ready to take this important step?"

<u>Stand with Washington Conservation Voters and me and sign on In support of our historic Carbon Pollution Accountability Act Ahead of today's hearing."</u>

At the bottom of this email is a black out block with white letters asking recipients to "SIGN ON". Also at the bottom of the email is a box on the right side of the page stating: "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington PO Box 21067 Seattle, WA 98111". The reader is given access to a web page titled: **Support the Carbon Pollution Accountability Act**. The website asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form. **(EXHIBIT 1)**.

- 2.3Email dated February 16, 2015, Subject Line: "Yes, Yes, Yes" In this email there are four questions asked which pertain to right to fair pay, minimum wage and sick leave. In this email this discussion is about two bills before the Washington State House of Representatives. There is no bill number listed, legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. An excerpt from the email
 - "...the Washington state House is hearing bills on both guaranteeing Paid sick leave and raising the minimum wage.

Workers shouldn't have to choose between their health – and their families' health – and food on the table. That's why guaranteeing that most employers provide paid sick leave is the right thing to do.

Raising the minimum wage is fair to workers, and it'll boost our state's economy as whole --- workers have more money to spend, local businesses across the state benefit. Raising the minimum wage to \$12 an hour is not only fair – it's smart.

While these two bills are being heard in the House, it's critical that we build up public support ---a Washington economy that work for all. Washington is the best place in the country to work. Let's keep leading by supporting these two bills. Will you sign on Today?

Join me in supporting a Washington that works for all, and sign on In support of paid sick leave and raising the minimum wage."

At the bottom of this email is a black out block with white letters asking recipients to "TAKE ACTION". Also at the bottom of the email is a box on the right side of the page stating: "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington PO Box 21067 Seattle, WA 98111". The reader is given access to a web page titled: **A Washington economy for all**. The website asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form. **(EXHIBIT 2)**.

- 2.4Email dated March 5, 2015, Subject Line: "What's the only thing left?" This email discusses the successes and what still needs to be done in the legislature. There is no bill number listed, legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. An excerpt from the email:
 - "...On Tuesday, the Washington House passed a package of bills that raises the minimum wage and guarantees paid sick and safe leave.

These are policies that lift up all Washingtonians, and that's why the public supports them. That's why the Washington House supports them.

Now it's up to the Washington Senate to support them – but I need your help to convince them.

The Senate needs to hear from you. Will you take a stand for a Washington that works for all today?

Add your name now, and urge the Washington Senate to Pass paid sick and safe leave and minimum wage!"

At the bottom of this email is a black out block with white letters asking recipients to "TAKE ACTION". Also at the bottom of the email is a box on the right side of the page stating: "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington PO Box 21067 Seattle, WA 98111". **(EXHIBIT 3)**. On the website the last paragraph reads:

"Will you sign my petition to urge the Washington Senate To pass paid sick and safe leave and minimum wage?"

The website asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form.

- 2.5 On June 24, 2015, the Public Disclosure Commission received an addendum to the initial 45-Day Citizen Action Complaint. The addendum 45-Day Citizen's complaint came from Caleb Heimlich, Executive Director, Washington State Republican Party. The complaint has additional allegations that the Jay Inslee for Washington 2016 Campaign has allegedly violated provisions from RCW 42.17A and WAC 390-16. Four emails and linked Web pages were included with the addendum and are listed below as Exhibits 4 12:
- 2.6 Email dated December 7, 2014 with "Our Roads and bridges are too Important" The recipient of the email is asked on two occasions to support a comprehensive, sustainable transportation package during the next legislative session by clicking on any of the three links in the email (EXHIBIT 4). There is no bill number listed, legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. These links are:

"Do you want a transportation plan that works for Washington to be a top priority in the next legislative session? Click here to show your support."

"Help me make Washington roads and bridges safe and create new jobs for workers. Click here to declare that you believe Washington needs a comprehensive transportation plan now."

At the bottom of the email there is a blacked out box with white letters asking the recipient to "TAKE ACTION". Each of the links goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington (**EXHIBIT 5**). The website asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form. The header on the website is titled "Support a transportation plan that puts Washington to work" The header at the top of the website states "Jay Inslee Democrat for Governor" at the bottom of the website "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington (D)".

2.7 Email dated December 16, 2014, with "Do it for the Kids" in the subject proposed education plan during the next legislative session by clicking on any of two links in the email. (EXHIBIT 6). A disclaimer on the email states it is paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington. There is no bill number listed, legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. These links are:

"Do you believe Washington students deserve real action on education in the upcoming legislative session? Click here to learn more about my plan and show your support."

"Help me pass a plan that puts Washington students first and prepares them for the jobs of the future. Click here to read more

about my plan to improve education, and declare your support."

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington. The heading on the page is titled "Support my plan to make education a top priority in Washington" (EXHIBIT 7). The page ask supporters to sign up to support Governor Inslee's education plan in the upcoming session. The web page asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form.

2.8 Email dated December 18, 2014, with "Reinvesting in Washington" in the subject line. Recipients are asked on two occasions to support Governor Inslee's budget proposal by clicking on any of two links in the email. (EXHIBIT 8). A disclaimer on the email states it is paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington. There is no bill number listed, legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. These links are:

"Are you ready to take a stand for a working Washington? Click here to declare your support for my 2015 budget plan."

"Help me pass a budget that reinvests in the future of Washington. Click here to declare your support."

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington. The header on the page is titled "Support my plan to reinvest in the future of Washington" Below the header "Jay Inslee Democrat for Governor" at the bottom of the page "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington (D)". The website asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form. (EXHIBIT 9)

2.9 Email dated May 7, 2015, with "My priorities" in the subject line. Recipient is asked to support Governor Inslee's "legislative priorities" in the "special session" including approving a budget, passing a transportation funding package, and to take action on reducing carbon pollution by clicking on any of two links in the email. (**EXHIBIT 10**). A disclaimer on the email states it is paid for by Jay Inslee, Democrat for Governor. There is no bill number listed, legislative hot line or information directing the public to contact their legislator. These links are:

"Add your name: Sign on in support of my legislative priorities Today, as the special session gets under way."

Each link goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee, Democrat for Governor. The header on these pages are titled: "Support Jay's Priorities in the Special Session" Below

the header "Jay Inslee Democrat for Governor" at the bottom of the page "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington (D)". The website asks for an individual's name, email address and zip code, even though the email address and zip code were all that was required to submit the form. (**EXHIBIT 11**). The second document is located at www.jayinslee.com/home and discusses the following:

Inslee signs \$5.1B transportation bill, touts Cheney rail project – 06/12 Inslee uses Puyallup bridge visit to highlight state infrastructure needs – 05/27 Gov. Inslee donating raise to school fundraising site – 05/19 Inslee signs tougher oil-train law, calls on feds to act – 05/14

At the header on this document is Jay Inslee, Democrat for Governor and at the bottom of the page "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington (D), P.O. Box 21067 Seattle WA 98111. (**EXHIBIT 12**)

III. FINDINGS

- 3.1 On June 16, 2015, the PDC staff received a response to the complaint from Attorney Kevin J. Hamilton, of PerkinsCoie Law Firm on behalf of the Jay Inslee for Washington - 2016 Campaign. Mr. Hamilton states that the complaint is meritless and list RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238. Mr. Hamilton discussed the two issues raised by Ms. Hutchinson in her complaint.
- 3.2 First issue: All Expenditures made by Jay Inslee for Washington have been made for the Purpose of Reelecting Governor Inslee. In Mr. Hamilton's June 6, 2015 response he cites RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238 claiming Ms. Hutchison's allegations are meritless. Mr. Hamilton goes on to state:

"It perhaps need not be said that none of these examples of "personal use" are even remotely similar to the political literature that is at issue here. The rule against personal use of campaign funds to defray personal expenses unconnected to politics. That is a far cry from the expenditures at issue here.

Any incumbent who, like Governor Inslee, is running for reelection faces a basic challenge-maintaining the supporter base that helped him get reelected. There are limited ways to do so in "off-years" during the incumbent's term in office, particularly during the Session Freeze when funds cannot be solicited. One way that an incumbent can keep his supporters engaged is to remain in regular contact with them over his term. And one obvious means of maintaining their support Is to demonstrate that the candidate is using his time in office to pursue the goals the candidate and his supporters share.

In short, communicating a candidate's position to the public on important political issues of the day and asking for support is a type of political communication that is obviously of benefit to an incumbent running for reelection. At the risk of stating the obvious, the Governor maintains regular communication with his supporters because doing so helps to maintain and build his supporter base, which is vitally important to he re-election."

3.3 On June 23, 2015, PDC staff sent questions by email to the Inslee for Governor campaign, seeking to determine 1) what Governor Inslee or his campaign did with the responses to the email and Web communications, 2) whether the responses led to a petition or similar message being presented to state legislative officials, and 3) whether state legislative officials were informed of the responses in any other way. On July 6, 2015, Mr. Hamilton responded as follows:

"To the extent that individuals who received the communications responded, the names and contact information of such individuals were entered into the Campaign's campaign contact database. The Campaign did not use the responses to present a petition or similar message to state legislators. None of the names of the responding individuals were presented to state legislative officials, nor were the state legislative officials informed of the responses in any other way."

3.4 Second issue: Jay Inslee for Washington is a Candidate Committee,
Properly Reported all Expenditures on C-4 Forms, and was not required
to file L-6 Forms as a Grassroots Lobbying Campaign. Mr. Hamilton goes on
to state:

"Ms. Hutchison also alleges that Jay Inslee for Washington "engaged In an unreported grassroots lobbying campaign" in violation of RCW 42.17A.640. This allegation is similarly meritless.

Reporting requirements apply when a person spends a certain amount Of money "in presenting a program to the public, a substantial portion Of which is intended, designed, or calculated primarily to influence Legislation." RCW 42.17A.640. But by its express terms, and for Obvious reasons, the statute does not apply to expenditures made By candidates and political committees. See RCW 42.17A.640 ("Any Person who has made expenditures, not reported by a...candidate Or political committee under RCW 43.17A.225 or 42.17A.235,...shall Register and report, as provided in subsection (2) of this section, as A sponsor of a grass roots lobbying campaign." (emphasis added). Grassroots lobbying expenditures are reported on an L-6 form.

Here, all expenditures related to the communications at issue in Ms. Hutchinson's Complaint were made by Governor Inslee's reelection committee, Jay Inslee for Washington. As explained above, these expenditures were fully and properly reported by Jay Inslee for Washington on the applicable From C=4.

By the plain language of the governing statute, RCW 42.17A.640, Jay Inslee for Washington was certainly not required to also report the same expenditures on an L-6 form. Ms. Hutchinson's allegation that "Jay Inslee for Washington has engaged in an unreported grassroots lobbying campaign" is simply wrong."

3.5 In the July 6, 2015, paragraph 5 of the response from Attorney Hamilton on behalf of the Inslee campaign. The following excerpt pertaining to the Washington Conservation Voters:

"Washington Conservation Voters shares Governor Inslee's concerns about carbon pollution. Accordingly, Washington Conservation Voters expressed its support for the substance of the January 27 communication by partnering with the Campaign to have Washington Conservation Voters' name appear on that particular communication. The Campaign did not provide its own list of contacts to Washington Conservation Voters. Nor did the Campaign provide the names or email addresses of individuals who responded to the January 27 communications, although its understanding is that Washington Conservation Voters was apprised of the identities of those who responded to the communication by Trilogy. The Campaign further understands that Washington Conservation Voters did not present names or contacts to state legislative officials, nor were the state legislative officials informed of the responsive contacts by Washington Conservation Voters in any other way."

The Inslee Campaign was paying Trilogy Interaction LLC, to promote Governor Inslee's campaign for re-election. The Washington Conservation Voters did not paid to have their logo on the House Bill 1314 emails, on the websites or pay for the listing of individuals who responded to the Jay Inslee campaign which was provided to the Washington Conservation Voters by Trilogy Interactive LLC.

- 3.6 HB 1314 "Implementing a carbon pollution market program to reduce greenhouse gas emissions" Governor Inslee was the "Requestor".
- 3.7 HB 1355 "Increasing the minimum hourly wage to twelve dollars over four years".
- 3.8 HB 1356 "Establishing minimum standards for sick and safe leave from employment" were requested by Governor Inslee.
- 3.9 On June 30, 2015 at approximately 0930 hours, I telephonically interviewed Mr. Jacob Lipson, Staffer with the Washington State Legislature. Mr. Lipson stated that if a petition was sent to a specific committee it would go directly to one of the committee members. The only information staffers receive and keep pertains to the individuals who testify before the committee.

- HB 1356 "Establishing minimum standards for sick and safe leave from employment".
- On June 30, 2015 telephonic interview with Mr. Jacob Lipson, Staffer with the Washington State Legislature.

V. LAW

RCW 42.17A.445

Contributions received and reported in accordance with RCW <u>42.17A.220</u> through <u>42.17A.240</u> and <u>42.17A.425</u> may only be paid to a candidate, or a treasurer or other individual or expended for such individual's personal use under the following circumstances (Excerpts of each of the qualifying forms of reimbursement):

Jay Inslee for Washington – 2016 Campaign Report of Investigation PDC Case Number 15-065 Page - 10 -

- (1) Reimbursement for or payments to cover lost earnings incurred as a result of campaigning or services performed for the political committee.
- (2) Reimbursement for direct out-of-pocket election campaign and postelection campaign related expenses made by the individual.
- (3) Repayment of loans made by the individual to political committees shall be reported pursuant to RCW 42.17A.240.

RCW 42.17A.640

(1) Any person who has made expenditures, not reported by a registered lobbyist under RCW 42.17A.615 or by a candidate or political committee under RCW 42.17A.225 or 42.17A.235, exceeding *one thousand dollars in the aggregate within any three-month period or exceeding *five hundred dollars in the aggregate within any one-month period in presenting a program to the public, a substantial portion of which is intended, designed, or calculated primarily to influence legislation shall register and report, as provided in subsection (2) of this section, as a sponsor of a grass roots lobbying campaign.

WAC 390-16-238 (Excerpts from the WAC)

- (1) Except as specifically allowed by chapter <u>42.17A</u> RCW, any expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds that is not directly related to the candidate's election campaign is a personal use of campaign funds prohibited under RCW <u>42.17A.445</u>.
- (2) An expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds shall be considered personal use if it fulfills or pays for any commitment, obligation or expense that would exist irrespective of the candidate's election campaign.
- (4) Examples of expenditures presumed to be for personal use include, but are not limited to:
 - (a) Mortgage, rent, utility or maintenance expenses for personal living accommodations:
 - (b) Clothing purchases and maintenance expenses not related to the campaign;
 - (c) Automobile expenses not related to the campaign;
 - (d) Travel expenses not related to the campaign;
 - (e) Household food items;
 - (f) Restaurant expenses except for in-person fund-raising or campaign organizational activities;
 - (g) Tuition payments not related to the campaign;
 - (h) Admission to sporting events, concerts, theaters, or other forms of entertainment unless the event is primarily related to the candidate's campaign;
 - (i) Country club membership fees, dues and payments;
 - (j) Health club or recreational facility membership fees, dues and payments;
 - (k) Social, civic, fraternal, or professional membership dues, fees and payments unless the expenditure occurs during an election year and membership is

required to gain access to the organization's mailing list for campaign purposes or other facilities for the candidate's campaign;

- (I) Home or business internet service provider costs;
- (m) Home or business newspaper and periodical subscriptions;
- (n) Greeting cards to persons who would customarily receive such cards (e.g., family, friends and business associates).

On May 27, 2015, the Attorney General received a letter from Susan Hutchinson, Chair of the Washington State Republican Party, alleging violations of provisions of RCW 42.17A by the Jay Inslee for Washington political committee. Specifically, Ms. Hutchinson alleges that the committee is improperly using campaign funds for lobbying efforts. A copy of this letter is provided with this letter.

I am requesting a review, possible investigation, and report back from the Commission from the Public Disclosure Commission and its staff. The Attorney General's Office will await the results of that review and any action from the Commission before proceeding. In the event the Commission determines that it is appropriate to schedule an administrative hearing related to any allegations against the committee, please advise. Otherwise, I would request the Commission's recommendation with how to proceed, along with any report of investigation that may be completed, be forwarded to the Attorney General when available.

The file in this matter has been assigned to Chad Standifer, who will be available to answer any legal questions the staff may have during the course of any review or investigation. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call me at (360) 753-0543.

Dear Attorney General Ferguson:

Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.765, I am notifying you of possible multiple violations of Chapter 42.17A of the Revised Code of Washington by Jay Inslee for Washington.

Background

Jay Inslee for Washington is the campaign committee for Jay Inslee's 2016 campaign for Washington State Governor. See Attachment 1. On three occasions Jay Inslee for Washington sent emails to its list of supporters asking them to support legislation during the 2015 legislative session:

1. In an email dated January 27, 2015 with "Where will you be when Washington leads?" in the subject line, the recipient is asked on two occasions to support the Carbon Pollution Accountability Act by clicking any of three links in the email. See Attachment 2. A disclaimer on the email indicates that it is paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington.

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Governor and the Washington Conservation Voters. See Attachment 3. The heading on the page is titled "Support the Carbon Pollution Accountability Act". There is no disclaimer describing who paid for the design, hosting, or management of the web site, whether it was either organization, only one, or neither.

2. In an email dated February 16, 2015 with "Yes, yes, yes." in the subject line, the recipient is asked on four occasions to support upcoming legislation in the state House of Representatives that would guarantee paid sick leave and increase the minimum wage by clicking any of five links in the email. See Attachment 4. A disclaimer on the email indicates that it is paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington.

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top as "Jay Inslee for Governor" and also features a disclaimer at the bottom that says "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington." See. Attachment 5. The heading is entitled "A Washington economy for all". The page asks supporters to sign up to support the paid sick leave and minimum wage legislation.

3. In an email dated March 5, 2015 with "What's the only thing left?" in the subject line, the recipient is asked to support the paid family leave and minimum wage legislation in the state Senate by clicking either of two links in the email. See Attachment 6.

Each link goes to a web page identified at the top as "Jay Inslee for Governor" and also features a disclaimer at the bottom that says "Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington." See Attachment 7. The heading is entitled "Pass Paid Sick and Safe Leave and Minimum Wage!". The page asks supporters to sign a petition to urge the Washington Senate to pass paid sick and safe leave and minimum wage legislation.

Possible Violations

WAC 390-16-238 states:

(1) Except as specifically allowed by chapter <u>42.17A</u> RCW, any expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds that is not directly related to the candidate's election campaign is a personal use of campaign funds prohibited under RCW <u>42.17A.445</u>.

Given the facts above, Jay Inslee for Washington has engaged in an unpermitted use of candidate campaign funds. In none of the emails or linked web pages is there any direct or even indirect relationship to Governors Inslee's campaign for re-election. There is no appeal to support the Governor's campaign in any way and there is no appeal for funds or other support. In fact the sole purpose of these communications appears to be influencing legislation. Lobbying or grassroots lobbying are not permitted uses of campaign finds.

In addition, regardless of whether these email communications and web pages are not permitted uses of campaign funds, Jay Inslee for Washington has engaged in an unreported grassroots lobbying campaign.

RCW 42.17A.640 states:

- (1) Any person who has made expenditures, not reported by a registered lobbyist under RCW 42.17A.615 or by a candidate or political committee under RCW 42.17A.225 or 42.17A.235, exceeding *one thousand dollars in the aggregate within any three-month period or exceeding *five hundred dollars in the aggregate within any one-month period in presenting a program to the public, a substantial portion of which is intended, designed, or calculated primarily to influence legislation shall register and report, as provided in subsection (2) of this section, as a sponsor of a grass roots lobbying campaign.
- *Adjusted for inflation per WAC 390-20-150 to one thousand, four hundred dollars (\$1,400) in the aggregate within any three-month period or exceeding seven hundred dollars (\$700) in the aggregate within any one-month period.

In presenting the earlier referenced emails and webpages, Jay Inslee for Washington incurred a range of expenses including conceptualizing the grassroots lobbying campaign, creating the web pages and emails, writing and editing the content, hosting the web pages, and utilizing a service to send out mass emails. It is likely more than four vendors, consultants, and/or staff were involved in the conception, production, and approval of this campaign.

It seems certain that Jay Inslee for Washington spent well over \$700 a month and/or \$1,400 over 3 months in pursuit of this effort, thereby triggering the reporting requirements of 42.17A.615. However, Jay Inslee for Washington has filed no L-6 or other forms with the PDC reporting this campaign.

By way of this 45-day citizen action letter I am requesting the Attorney General's office to review and take action with regard to these violations as expeditiously as possible.

RE: May 26, 2015 45-Day Citizen Action Letter regarding RCW 42.17A violations by Jay Inslee for Washington

Dear Attorney General Ferguson:

By way of a May 26, 2015 45-day citizen action letter, WSRP notified you of possible multiple violations of Chapter 42.17A of the Revised Code of Washington by Jay Inslee for Washington. Specifically, three blast emails and linked web pages for Jay Inslee for Washington indicated possible violations of WAC 390-16-238 and/or RCW 42.17A.640.

It has come to our attention that Jay Inslee for Washington has sent a number of other blast emails over the last few months, each with linked web pages, that also violate WAC 390-16-238 and/or RCW 42.17A.640:

1. In an email dated December 7, 2014 with "Our Roads and bridges are too important" in the subject line, the recipient is asked on two occasions to support a comprehensive, sustainable transportation packaged during the next legislative session by clicking on any of three links in the email. See Attachment 1. A disclaimer on the email indicates it is paid for Jay Inslee for Washington.

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington. See Attachment 2. The heading on the page is titled "Support a transportation plan that puts Washington to work". The page asks supporters to sign up to support a transportation plan in the upcoming session.

2. In an email dated December 16, 2014 with "Do it for the kids" in the subject line, the recipient is asked on two occasions to support Governor Inslee's proposed education plan during the next legislative session by clicking on any of three links in the email. See Attachment 3. A disclaimer on the email indicates it is paid for Jay Inslee for Washington.

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington. See Attachment 4. The heading on the page is titled "Support my plan to make education a top priority in Washington". The page asks supporters to sign up to support Governor Inslee's education plan in the upcoming session.

3. In an email dated December 18, 2014 with "Reinvesting in Washington" in the subject line, the recipient is asked on two occasions to support Governor Inslee's budget proposal by clicking on any of three links in the email. See Attachment 5. A disclaimer on the email indicates it is paid for Jay Inslee for Washington.

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington. See Attachment 6. The heading on the page is titled "Support my plan to

reinvest in the future Washington". The page asks supporters to sign a petition to help pass a budget.

4. In an email dated May 7, 2015 with "My priorities" in the subject line, the recipient is asked to support Governor Inslee's "legislative priorities" in the "special session" including approving a budget, passing a transportation funding package, and to take action on reducing carbon pollution by clicking on any of two links in the email. See Attachment 7. A disclaimer on the email indicates it is paid for Jay Inslee for Washington.

Each link in the email goes to a web page identified at the top and bottom as being affiliated with Jay Inslee for Washington. See Attachment 8. The heading on the page is titled "Support Jay's Priorities in the Special Session". The page asks supporters to add their name in support of these priorities "as the session gets under way".

As stated in May 26, 2015 correspondence, these appeals for legislative support appear to be in violation of WAC 390-16-238 prohibiting the use of campaign funds for personal use and RCW 42.17A.640 which requires reporting of a grassroots lobbying campaign.

Finally, each of the linked web pages referenced in my correspondence of May 26, 2015 and in this letter have improper disclaimers. RCW 42.17A.320 requires all written political advertising to include the sponsor's name and address. None of the web pages referenced here or in my May 26. 2015 letter include Jay Inslee for Washington's address on them in violation of RCW 42.17A.320. In addition, Jay Inslee for Washington's home page also does not list an address in violation of this statute. See Attachment 9.

By way of this letter I am requesting that you consider these violations as part of the May 26, 2015 45-Day Citizen Action Letter filed with your office. If that is not possible, please consider this letter a new 45-Day Citizen Action Letter.





Dear Bill:

Thank you for providing the Jay Inslee for Washington Campaign ("Jay Inslee for Washington") with an opportunity to respond to the May 27, 2015, 45 Day Letter Citizen Action ("Complaint") filed by Susan Hutchison, the Chair of the Washington State Republican Party. In her Complaint, Ms. Hutchison raises two issues. With respect to both issues, Jay Inslee for Washington has acted in full compliance with Washington's Public Disclosure Law. As has, unfortunately, been true before with similar complaints made by the Republican Party against Governor Inslee, Ms. Hutchison's Complaint to the Public Disclosure Commission ("PDC") appears to simply be an attempt to advance political goals by other means. For the reasons more fully articulated below, I would respectfully submit that the PDC should dismiss the Complaint against Jay Inslee for Washington in its entirety.

I. Background

A. Jay Inslee for Washington Campaign

As you know, Jay Inslee is the Governor of the State of Washington. Governor Inslee is also a declared candidate for the 2016 gubernatorial campaign. "Jay Inslee for Washington" is Governor Inslee's campaign committee and it appropriately filed a Form C-1 in 2013.

Throughout his political career and during the course of his governorship, Governor Inslee has carefully complied with all PDC and other election disclosure requirements. Toward that end, Governor Inslee works closely with accountants and lawyers with experience and expertise in

election disclosure issues. This was true with respect to the communications at issue here, all of which were (as discussed below) fully, properly, and timely reported to the PDC.

B. Issues Raised by Complaint

Ms. Hutchinson raises two issues in her Complaint. I will address each in turn.

1. All Expenditures Made by Jay Inslee for Washington Have Been Made for the Purpose of Reelecting Governor Inslee

Ms. Hutchinson first alleges that by keeping his supporters and potential supporters abreast of his positions on key issues pending in the Washington State Legislature, the Governor improperly spent campaign funds for "personal" reasons. We need look no further than the statute (RCW 42.17A.445) and regulation (WAC 390-16-238) cited in the Complaint to see why this claim is meritless.

RCW 42.17A.445 provides that, save for limited exceptions, campaign funds cannot be "expended" for "personal use." The related regulation, WAC 390-16-238, restates this general rule, indicating that "expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds that is not directly related to the candidate's election campaign is a personal use of campaign funds" and thus an expenditure is "personal use if it fulfills or pays for any commitment, obligation or expense that would exist irrespective of the candidate's election campaign." WAC 390-16-238(1)-(2). The regulation goes on to provide numerous examples of the kinds of expenditure that would constitute an impermissible personal use of campaign funds:

- (a) Mortgage, rent, utility or maintenance expenses for personal living accommodations;
- (b) Clothing purchases and maintenance expenses not related to the campaign;
- (c) Automobile expenses not related to the campaign;
- (d) Travel expenses not related to the campaign;
- (e) Household food items;
- (f) Restaurant expenses except for in-person fund-raising or campaign organizational activities;
- (g) Tuition payments not related to the campaign;

- (h) Admission to sporting events, concerts, theaters, or other forms of entertainment unless the event is primarily related to the candidate's campaign;
- (i) Country club membership fees, dues and payments;
- (j) Health club or recreational facility membership fees, dues and payments;
- (k) Social, civic, fraternal, or professional membership dues, fees and payments unless the expenditure occurs during an election year and membership is required to gain access to the organization's mailing list for campaign purposes or other facilities for the candidate's campaign;
- (l) Home or business internet service provider costs;
- (m) Home or business newspaper and periodical subscriptions;
- (n) Greeting cards to persons who would customarily receive such cards (e.g., family, friends and business associates).

Id. It perhaps need not be said that none of these examples of "personal use" are even *remotely* similar to the political literature that is at issue here. The rule against personal use of campaign funds properly safeguard against unscrupulous candidates who would raid their campaign funds to defray personal expenses unconnected to politics. That is a far cry from the expenditures at issue here.

Any incumbent who, like Governor Inslee, is running for reelection faces a basic challenge—maintaining the supporter base that helped him get reelected. There are limited ways to do so in "off-years" during the incumbent's term in office, particularly during the Session Freeze when funds cannot be solicited. One way that an incumbent can keep his supporters engaged is to remain in regular contact with them over his term. And one obvious means of maintaining their support is to demonstrate that the candidate is using his time in office to pursue the goals the candidate and his supporters share.

In short, communicating a candidate's position to the public on important political issues of the day and asking for support is a type of political communication that is obviously of benefit to an incumbent running for reelection. At the risk of stating the obvious, the Governor maintains regular communication with his supporters *because doing so helps to maintain and build his supporter base*, which is vitally important to his re-election.

This is why the specific communications at issue were sent—to maintain and build support for Governor Inslee's reelection. Each of the communications asked the Governor's supporters to take action to support the Governor and his agenda. Not only does a call to action build further connections between the Governor and his supporters, but soliciting action allows Jay Inslee for Washington to gather information as to who on its email list replied or took action. Gathering information about the accuracy of its email list and identifying and engaging with its active supporters is a critical piece of the preparation that goes into preparing for election year. Simply put, if these expenditures were not directly related to the Governor's reelection, Jay Inslee for Washington would not have made them.

And to answer directly your questions regarding the auspices of the communications: As each communication states expressly, Jay Inslee for Washington created and paid for the communications. Each communication (and related expenses) were paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington. The communications were sent to an email list maintained by Jay Inslee for Washington, which Governor Inslee has compiled over the past several years. All of the expenses related to the above were fully reported as expenditures on C4 reports filed by Jay Inslee for Washington.

A declared candidate for office who sends political communications to political supporters has not used campaign funds for "personal" reasons. Ms. Hutchison's complaint on this score is meritless and should be dismissed.

2. Jay Inslee for Washington Is a Candidate Committee, Properly Reported All Expenditures on C-4 Forms, And Was Not Required to File L-6 Forms As a Grassroots Lobbying Campaign

Ms. Hutchison also alleges that Jay Inslee for Washington "engaged in an unreported grassroots lobbying campaign" in violation of RCW 42.17 A.640. This allegation is similarly meritless.

Reporting requirements apply when a person spends a certain amount of money "in presenting a program to the public, a substantial portion of which is intended, designed, or calculated primarily to influence legislation." RCW 42.17A.640. But by its express terms, and for obvious reasons, the statute does not apply to expenditures made by candidates and political committees. See RCW 42.17A.640 ("Any person who has made expenditures, not reported by a . . . candidate or political committee under RCW42.17A.225 or 42.17A.235, . . . shall register and report, as provided in subsection (2) of this section, as a sponsor of a grass roots lobbying campaign." (emphasis added). Grassroots lobbying expenditures are reported on an L-6 form.

Here, all expenditures related to the communications at issue in Ms. Hutchinson's Complaint were made by Governor Inslee's reelection committee, Jay Inslee for Washington. As explained above, these expenditures were fully and properly reported by Jay Inslee for Washington on the

applicable Form C-4. By the plain language of the governing statute, RCW 42.17A.640, Jay Inslee for Washington was certainly not required to *also* report the same expenditures on an L-6 form. Ms. Hutchinson's allegation that "Jay Inslee for Washington has engaged in an unreported grassroots lobbying campaign" is simply wrong.

Please let me know if I can respond to any questions you might have or to provide you with further information in response to this unfortunate (and utterly baseless) complaint.

Dear Mr. Lemp:

This letter provides the additional information from Jay Inslee for Washington (the "Campaign") requested in your June 23, 2015, email. I provide the Campaign's response after each question as stated in your email:

1. On what C-4 forms (i.e. which filing dates) are the expenses related to the three (3) emails and web communications disclosed? Which itemized expenses specifically relate to the communications?

All expenses related to these communications were paid to two vendors: Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive. As further explained below, in each instance, all work necessary to prepare these communications by Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive was conducted pursuant to retainer arrangements between the Campaign and these two vendors. These vendors bill the Campaign on a monthly basis.

- For services provided to produce the 1/27/15 Email and forms:
 - Newman Partners was paid on 2/2/2015; as listed on the Campaign's February C-4.
 - o Trilogy Interactive was paid on 2/13/2015; as listed on the Campaign's February C-4. (Please see footnote 1, below, for a fuller discussion of this payment to Trilogy.)

• For services provided to produce the 2/16/15 Email and forms:

- Newman Partners was paid on 3/2/2015; as listed on the Campaign's March C-4.
- Trilogy Interactive was paid on 2/13/2015; as listed on the Campaign's February C-4.

• For services provided to produce the 3/5/15 Email and forms:

- Newman Partners was paid on 3/31/2015; as listed on the Campaign's March C-4.
- Trilogy Interactive was paid on 3/19/2015; as listed on the Campaign's March C-4.

2. What was the total cost to produce and send each of the three (3) emails on January 27, 2015, February 16, 2015 and March 5, 2015.

The Campaign has placed both Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive on a retainer for services rendered. Newman Partners is paid by the Campaign on a flat monthly fee of \$9,000, regardless of the volume of services provided by Newman Partners in a given month. The Campaign pays Trilogy Interactive a flat monthly fee, in advance, for the first 15 hours of work performed by Trilogy Interactive each month. Additional work performed by Trilogy Interactive in a given month is billed at an hourly rate for any such "overage" after the work is performed.

To the best of its knowledge, the Campaign has never been invoiced for and incurred no special or unique expenses for creation of the production and distribution of these three emails. Instead, any cost required to produce the emails was covered by the existing monthly retainer arrangement between the Campaign and Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive. ¹

¹ The Campaign's understanding is that Trilogy Interactive spent far less than 15 hours working on the communications in questions, and thus any work attributable to any single communication was covered by Trilogy Interactive's flat monthly fee. However, because the January communication was prepared late in January and Trilogy Interactive spent more than 15 hours working for the Campaign that month, it is *possible* that the specific time spent by Trilogy Interactive on the email technically fell within the "overage" for the month of January, which was paid by the Campaign on February 13. The Campaign would need to spend significant time and considerable expense to work with Trilogy Interactive to attempt to determine conclusively whether costs associated with the January communication are technically associated with the expenditure to Trilogy Interactive in January or February. Either way, however, they were fully reported in the corresponding C-4.

In total, the Campaign paid Newman Partners \$9,000 in both February and March. The Campaign paid Trilogy Interactive a total of \$6,336.63 and \$2,500 in March, respectively, for consulting fees. Again, these figures do *not* reflect the total cost to produce and distribute the specific communications at issue. Rather, it reflects the *entire* sum paid to Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive for *all* consulting services provided in February and March, which would encompass any and all costs associated with the communications.

- 3. What was the total cost to create the three (3) forms
 - a. Support the Carbon Pollution Accountability Act
 - b. A Washington Economy for All
 - c. Pass Paid Sick and Safe Leave and Minimum Wage!

Please see the Campaign's response to Question "2" above.

4. What did Governor Inslee or his campaign do with the responses to the three (3) emails? Did the responses lead to a petition or similar message being presented to state legislative officials? If so, where and on what date? Were state legislative officials informed of the responses in any other way? Please explain.

To the extent that individuals who received the communications responded, the names and contact information of such individuals were entered into the Campaign's campaign contact database. The Campaign did not use the responses to present a petition or similar message to state legislators. None of the names of the responding individuals were presented to state legislative officials, nor were the state legislative officials informed of the responses in any other way.

5. What connection did Washington Conservation Voters have with the email and Web Communications? Did they receive the names or email addresses of individuals who visited the relevant Web pages and completed the contact form?

Washington Conservation Voters shares Governor Inslee's concerns about carbon pollution. Accordingly, Washington Conservation Voters expressed its support for the substance of the January 27 communication by partnering with the Campaign to have Washington Conservation Voters' name appear on that particular communication. The Campaign did not provide its own list of contacts to Washington Conservation Voters. Nor did the Campaign provide the names or email addresses of individuals who responded to the January 27 communication, although its understanding is that Washington Conservation Voters was apprised of the identities of those who responded to the communication by Trilogy. The Campaign further understands that Washington Conservation Voters did not present names or contacts to state legislative officials,

nor were the state legislative officials informed of the responsive contacts by Washington Conservation Voters in any other way.

Dear Mr. Lemp:

This letter provides Jay Inslee for Washington's (the "Campaign") response to Caleb Heimlich's June 18, 2015 addendum to Susan Hutchison's May 27, 2015 45 Day Letter Citizen Action (the "Addendum"). Mr. Heimlich is the Executive Director of the Washington State Republican Party. In the Addendum, Mr. Heimlich raises two basic issues. First, Mr. Heimlich makes the same allegations as in Ms. Hutchison's original letter in regard to four additional communications made by the Inslee Campaign to Governor Inslee's supporters and potential supporters (sent on 12/7/14, 12/16/14, 12/18/14, and 5/7/15). Second, Mr. Heimlich alleges that the communications in question constitute political advertising and that the Campaign did not include its address on these communications (or the Campaign's website.) Neither of these allegations has any merit. For the reasons more fully articulated below, and in the Campaign's previous responses to the PDC, I would respectfully submit that the PDC should dismiss the Complaint against Jay Inslee for Washington, with Mr. Heimlich's Addendum, in its entirety.

A. The Four Additional Communications Were Made by Jay Inslee for Washington for the Purpose of Re-electing Governor Inslee and Do Not Constitute Grassroots Lobbying

The Campaign has explained, in its original response on June 16, 2015, why the communications between the Campaign and Governor Inslee's supporters and potential supporters are not an impermissible "personal use" of campaign funds and do not amount to grassroots lobbying. For the PDC's convenience, the Campaign summarizes, but will not repeat fully, the reasons why below.

As previously explained, the Campaign has sought to maintain Governor Inslee's supporter base in anticipation of Governor Inslee being up for re-election in 2016. Specifically, the Campaign

has sought means by which the Governor can remain in regular contact with his supporters and demonstrate that he is using his time in office to pursue the goals he and his supporters share. Sending communications to Governor Inslee's supporters and potential supporters also allows the Campaign to build and maintain an effective campaign contact database. These are primary means by which an incumbent running for re-election can build and maintain his or her support in off-cycle years.

Thus, sending communications of this kind was, obviously, of benefit to Governor Inslee as an incumbent running for re-election. As such, these communications—all of which were timely and properly reported on the Campaign's C-4 forms—do not constitute an impermissible "personal use" of campaign funds within the meaning of RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238.

And because these communications were expenditures by a candidate for office related to his reelection, the Campaign did not *also* need to report these same communications on an L-6 form as "grassroots lobbying." *See* RCW 42.17A.640 ("Any person who has made expenditures, *not reported* by a . . . candidate or political committee under RCW 42.17A.225 or 42.17A.235, . . . shall register and report, as provided in subsection (2) of this section, as a sponsor of a grass roots lobbying campaign." (emphasis added)).

B. Additional Information Regarding the Four Specific Communications Identified in the Addendum

Consistent with its prior responses to the PDC, the Campaign provides the following specific information about the four communications discussed in the Addendum.

1. Timing and Cost of Expenditures Related to the Four Communications

All expenses related to these communications were paid to two vendors: Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive. In each instance, all work necessary to prepare these communications by Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive was conducted pursuant to retainer arrangements between the Campaign and these two vendors. These vendors bill the Campaign on a monthly basis. Newman Partners is paid by the Campaign on a flat monthly fee of \$9,000, regardless of the volume of services provided by Newman Partners in a given month. The Campaign pays Trilogy Interactive a flat monthly fee, in advance, for the first 15 hours of work performed by Trilogy Interactive each month. Additional work performed by Trilogy Interactive in a given month is billed at an hourly rate for any such "overage" after the work is performed.

• For services provided to produce the 12/7/2014, 12/16/2014 and 12/18/2014 communications:

- Newman Partners was paid on 12/31/2015; as listed on Schedule B to the Campaign's December 2014 C-4.
- o Trilogy Interactive was paid on 12/18/2015 and/or 12/31/2015; as listed on the Campaign's December 2014 C-4 (with attached Schedule B).
- For services provided to produce the 5/7/15 communications:
 - Newman Partners was paid the monthly retainer on 5/31/2015; as listed on the Campaign's May 2015 C-4.
 - o Trilogy Interactive was paid the monthly retainer of \$3,165 on 5/28/2015; as listed on the Campaign's May 2015 C-4.

To the best of its knowledge, the Campaign has never been invoiced for and incurred no special or unique expenses for creation of the production and distribution of these four emails. Instead, any cost required to produce the emails was covered by the existing monthly retainer arrangement between the Campaign and Newman Partners and Trilogy Interactive.

2. The Campaign Used the Contact Information of the Persons Responding to the Communications to Build Its Campaign Contact Database: It Did Not Use the Responses to Present a Petition or Similar Message to State Legislators

As was true with the communications described in the Campaign's previous responses, to the extent that individuals who received the communications responded, the names and contact information of such individuals were entered into the Campaign's campaign contact database. The Campaign did not use the responses to present a petition or similar message to state legislators. None of the names of the responding individuals were presented to state legislative officials, nor were state legislative officials informed of the responses in any other way.

¹ Trilogy Interactive billed the Campaign for its monthly retainer on December 18, 2014, and for "overages" for December 2014 on December 31, 2014. The Campaign's understanding is that Trilogy Interactive spent less than 15 hours working on the communications in questions, and thus any work attributable to these communications was covered by Trilogy Interactive's flat monthly fee. However, because Trilogy Interactive spent more than 15 hours working for the Campaign in December 2014, it is *possible* that the specific time spent by Trilogy Interactive on the email technically fell within the "overage" for the month of December, which was paid by the Campaign on December 31, 2014. The Campaign would need to spend significant time and considerable expense to work with Trilogy Interactive to attempt to determine conclusively whether costs associated with the December communications are technically associated with the expenditure to Trilogy Interactive on December 18 or December 31. Either way, however, they were fully reported in the December 2014 C-4.

C. Each of the Communications at Issue (and the Campaign's Website) Plainly and Prominently Lists the Campaign's Address

Mr. Heimlich also alleges that the communications (and the Campaign's website) do not list the Campaign's address, in violation of RCW 42.17A.320.² This allegation is also meritless.

As is apparent from the very materials provided by the Republican Party, each of the communications set out in the original letter and in the Addendum provided the Campaign's address. Each email communication includes a prominent notice that reads:

> Paid for by Jay Inslee for Washington PO Box 21067 Seattle, WA 98111

Moreover, any person who clicked the link in the email communication featuring this prominent disclaimer was directed to an attached form that identified the Campaign by name and linked to the Campaign's "Privacy Policy," which yet again identifies the Campaign by name and lists the Campaign's address. There is simply no straight-faced argument that these communications fail to disclose the Campaign as the sponsor of the communication or failed to include the Campaign's address. They did. Repeatedly.

Mr. Heimlich's suggestion that the Campaign's website does not list an address is similarly baseless. The Campaign's website is accessible by means of a "landing page" that must be viewed before a visitor is redirected to the "home page." The "landing page" identifies the Campaign as the sponsor of the website. Immediately below the sponsor identification, the landing page directs visitors to a "Contact Us" page and the Campaign's "Privacy Policy," both of which, again, prominently list the Campaign's address. 4 Mr. Heimlich's Addendum is thus artfully and misleadingly incomplete. He simply ignores the fact that the Campaign repeatedly and expressly identifies itself as the sponsor of its own website and lists its address in multiple places.3

The Campaign thus did not violate either the letter or spirit of RCW 42.17A.320. No person who received the communications in question—or who visits the Campaign's website—could come away misled or confused about the identity (or address) of their sponsor.

Please let me know if I can respond to any questions you might have or to provide you with further information in response to Mr. Heimlich's addition to the Republican Party's baseless complaint.






