Reason(s) for Modification (as stated by filer)	Mr. Hill is requesting a retroactive reporting modification that would exempt him from disclosing the business and other governmental customers that paid \$12,000 or more during 2018 and 2019 to SIEU 775 Home Health Care Workers Health Trust for which he serves as a trustee.

Mr. Hill is also requesting a renewal of the previously granted reporting modification that would exempt him from disclosing the business and other governmental customers that paid \$12,000 or more during 2017, 2018 and 2019 to the following entities for which he serves as a director or trustee: the Seattle Foundation, Habitat for Humanity, MODA, Inc., Puget Sound Public Radio (dba KUOW) and Seattle City Club and for the entity Pinchot University during 2017 and 2018 only.

NEW IN 2018

SEIU 775 Home Health Care Workers Health Trust

SIEU 775 Home Health Care Workers Health Trust provides health insurance to home health workers and has annual revenues of \$135 million, used primarily to purchase health coverage for 20,000 individuals.

Mr. Hill serves as one of 6 employer trustees at the request of WA State OFM. He stated that he is a volunteer and his focus is to work with other trustees to maximize coverage and health improvement for home health care workers within the limited funds provided by the state and other employers.

Mr. Hill stated that in this role, he does not have access to the information requested and cannot request the staff of the Trust to generate this information as it would violate confidentially agreements.

Mr. Hill stated that there is no actual or potential conflict of interest because there is no overlap in his roles for the 2 organizations (the Trust and Seattle Colleges), he is not an "owner" of either organization and is serving as volunteer to both organizations.

Mr. Hill confirmed that there were no payments received by SIEU 775 Home Health Care Workers Health Trust from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2018 or 2019.

RENEWAL

The Seattle Foundation

Mr. Hill serves on the Seattle Foundation's Board of Directors and the Investment Committee.

In his previous written request, Mr. Hill stated that it is not possible for him to report all of the payments the Seattle foundation has received that exceed \$12,000 and it would cause an unreasonable hardship for the organization to produce such a report.

Mr. Hill stated that there is no connection between the Seattle Foundation and Seattle Colleges and confirmed that there were no payments received by the Seattle Foundation from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2017, 2018 or 2019.

Habitat for Humanity

Mr. Hill serves as a board member of Habitat for Humanity, a non-profit organization.

In his previous written request, Mr. Hill stated that it is not possible for him to report all of the payments Habitat for Humanity has received that exceed \$12,000 and it would cause an unreasonable hardship for the organization to produce such a report.

Mr. Hill stated that there is no connection between Habitat for Humanity and Seattle Colleges and confirmed that there were no payments received by Habitat for Humanity from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2017, 2018 or 2019.

MODA, Inc.

Mr. Hill serves as a board member of MODA, Inc., an Oregon based dental and health insurance organization.

In his previous written request, Mr. Hill stated that it is not possible for him to report all of the payments MODA, Inc. has received that exceed \$12,000 and it would cause an unreasonable hardship for the organization to produce such a report.

Mr. Hill stated that there is no connection between MODA, Inc. and Seattle Colleges and confirmed that there were no payments received by MODA, Inc. from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2017, 2018 or 2019.

Puget Sound Public Radio (dba KUOW)

Mr. Hill serves as a board member of Puget Sound Public Radio (dba KUOW), a non-profit organization.

In his previous written request, Mr. Hill stated that it is not possible for him to report all of the payments Puget Sound Public Radio has received that exceed \$12,000 and it would cause an unreasonable hardship for the organization to produce such a report.

Mr. Hill stated that there is a connection between Puget Sound Public Radio and Seattle Colleges. and confirmed that there were no payments received by Puget Sound Public Radio from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2017, 2018 or 2019.

Seattle City Club

Mr. Hill serves as a board member of Seattle City Club.

In his previous written request, Mr. Hill stated that it is not possible for him to report all of the payments Seattle City Club has received that exceed \$12,000 and it would cause an unreasonable hardship for the organization to produce such a report.

Mr. Hill stated that there is no connection between Seattle City Club and Seattle Colleges and confirmed that there were no payments received by Seattle City Club from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2017, 2018 or 2019.

Pinchot University

Mr. Hill was a faculty member and served as the Faculty Representative on the Board of Pinchot University, a private graduate university offering an MBA in Sustainable Business.

In his previous written request, Mr. Hill stated that it is not possible for him to report all of the payments Pinchot University has received that exceed \$12,000 and it would cause an unreasonable hardship for the organization to produce such a report.

Mr. Hill stated that there is no connection between the Pinchot University and Seattle Colleges and confirmed that there were no payments received by Pinchot University from Seattle Colleges during calendar years 2017 or 2018.

Other Issues

Mr. Hill has confirmed for each applicable reporting period, that no payments were received by SIEU 775 Home Health Care Workers Health Trust, the Seattle Foundation, Habitat for Humanity, MODA, Inc., Puget Sound Public Radio (dba KUOW) and Seattle City Club or Pinchot University from Seattle Colleges.

Mr. Hill has made a good faith effort to timely submit his personal financial disclosures and request modifications for business and other governmental customers for calendar years 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Mr. Hill has agreed to recuse himself involving a conflict of interest between the entities listed in his request and Seattle Colleges.
