Reason(s) for Modification (as stated by filer)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ms. Jarvis is requesting a reporting modification that would exempt her from reporting her residential address on the F-1 report for calendar year 2019. • Ms. Jarvis stated she is a professional staff member for the Office of Financial Management whose duties include making budget recommendations to the governor.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ms. Jarvis indicated that, due to a data breach, she became a victim of identity theft in 2014.• Ms. Jarvis stated that, subsequent to the data breach, one or more unknown individuals used her financial information to obtain a fake driver's license, rent and then steal a car, open several credit card accounts, and set up accounts with credit bureau agencies.• Ms. Jarvis indicated that she filed a police report with the Port of Seattle/SeaTac Police Department regarding the identity theft.• Ms. Jarvis stated that personally identifiable and financial information is easy to obtain, which makes her and her family more vulnerable to identity theft. She indicated that her goal in making this request is to give thieves less of this information.• Ms. Jarvis stated her belief that disclosing her personal residence has nothing to do with her job.
Other Issues	Ms. Jarvis has agreed to recuse herself if a matter comes before her involving a conflict of interest between her personal interests and public duties.
