Explanation of Rule(s)	Personal residence - Real property. Regarding reporting the information otherwise required by RCW 42.17A.710 (1)(h) through (k):  (i) Under WAC 390-24-200, the filer shall list the street address of each parcel, the assessor's parcel number, the abbreviated legal description appearing on property tax statements, or the complete legal description. Each property description shall be followed by the name of the county in which the property is located.  (ii) No modification will be necessary if the filer describes the real property using one of the alternatives in WAC 390-24-200, plus the name of the county.  (iii) A modification will be required if the filer seeks some other means to describe reportable real property including the personal residence of the filer. The commission may consider a modification, for example, when the filer or his or her immediate family member has received a threat, has a no contact order, or presents a similar personal safety concern.  A prospective modification to allow nondisclosure of a residential address may be granted if the applicant or an immediate family member has received a threat, been issued a no contact order or presents a similar personal safety concern.  Applicants whose spouse or registered domestic partner creates a reporting obligation for the applicant. When an applicant is required to report the activities of an entity solely because the applicant's spouse or registered domestic partner held an office, directorship, general partnership or ownership interest in the entity and the applicant does not have direct knowledge of the information that must be reported, the applicant may be allowed to satisfy the disclosure requirements of RCW 42.17A.710 (1)(g)(ii) and WAC 390-24-020 by disclosing reportable customers from whom compensation in excess of the disclosure threshold established under RCW 42.17A.710 (1)(g)(iii) has been received as follows:  (A) All payments made by the agency or jurisdiction in which the applicant is aware; and (C) Any other business and other go

	<ul> <li>Mr. Kristiansen is also requesting a renewal of a reporting modification that would exempt him from disclosing his personal residential address information on his F-1 report.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Mr. Kristiansen stated that the information contained in previous request approved June 25, 2015 is still relevant to his current request.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Western Wood Preserving Company</li> <li>Mr. Kristiansen has previously stated that his spouse is a minority owner and Secretary/Treasurer of Western Wood Preserving Co., a wood preserving plant located in Sumner, Washington.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Mr. Kristiansen has previously stated that the wood preserving business is a highly competitive industry, and that in Washington State, there are only five major wood preserving plants. He stated that of the five major wood preserving plants in Washington State, Western Wood Preserving is the smallest.</li> </ul>
	Personal Residence  • Mr. Kristiansen stated, before the Commission in August of 2008, that his personal residence is located in rural Snohomish County where emergency response times could be up to 30 minutes.
	<ul> <li>Mr. Kristiansen said he felt that by listing his personal residence on the F-1 report, his family's safety could potentially be compromised. He cited one instance in which his house had been vandalized in 2004 while his family was at home.</li> </ul>
