Mr. Smith serves on the Board of Directors for both entities.
	Nike, Inc. Mr. Smith stated that Nike, Inc. is a worldwide company with 58,500 employees and annual sales of \$27.8 billion.
	Mr. Smith stated that, as a board member for Nike, he does not have access to information about the business and other governmental customers and is not aware of how many would be subject to disclosure.
	Mr. Smith stated that Nike, Inc. is a very large organization and attempting to collect and summarize the business and other governmental customers would be extremely difficult.
	 Mr. Smith disclosed on the F-1 Supplement that the University of Washington made payments to Nike totaling \$443,773, in 2014, for athletic supplies.
	 The Walt Disney Company Mr. Smith stated that The Walt Disney Company is a worldwide company and in 2014, had annual sales of \$48.8 billion and 180,000 employees.
	Mr. Smith stated that as a board member for The Walt Disney Company he does not have access to information about the business and other

	governmental customers and is not aware of how many would be subject to disclosure.
	 Mr. Smith stated that The Walt Disney Company is a very large organization and attempting to collect and summarize the business and other governmental customers would be extremely difficult.
