Chair Jarrett, Vice Chair Isserlis, and Commissioners Downing, Hayward, and Cooney,

I'm writing in my personal capacity regarding the Public Disclosure Commission's (PDC) rulemaking process to review the Fair Campaign Practices Act's (FCPA) statutory contribution limits, reporting thresholds and code values, in accordance with RCW 42.17A.125.

While I found the "Fair Campaign Practices Act -2022 Inflationary Adjustment Chart" prepared by PDC staff to accompany the discussion of this matter at the Commission's October 27, 2022, regular meeting to be quite helpful, I've taken the liberty of modifying it slightly.

The enclosed version includes an added column – "Rate of inflation" – which, for each monetary threshold, indicates the difference between the current statutory dollar amount and the inflation-adjusted amount in 2022 dollars, expressed as a percentage. The chart has been sorted by this new column H so that the thresholds which have experienced the greatest inflation without adjustment appear at the top.

Because the statutory thresholds and the time since they were last updated span a wide spectrum that makes offhand comparison difficult, I would argue that viewing the thresholds based on the amount of inflation that has occurred since their last adjustment helps highlight which thresholds currently in effect differ most significantly from the policy originally established in statute and consequently are most in need of an inflationary adjustment.

Ideally, in my view, all monetary thresholds should be updated regularly and at the same rate to account for inflation. This would provide those regulated by the PDC with predictability and an even playing field while ensuring that that policies established by the people of Washington—whether through their elected representatives in the Legislature or via ballot initiative—are not warped or eroded over time.

This appears to be more or less the Legislature's view as well, given its directive in RCW 42.17A.125 that PDC inflationary adjustments "equally affect all thresholds" in the FCPA's three "general categories": (1) reports of campaign finance, (2) reports of lobbyist activity, and (3) reports of the financial affairs of elected and appointed officials.
