Reason(s) for Modification (as stated by filer)	Judge Rodriguez is requesting a reporting modification that would exempt her from disclosing the business customers or clients that paid \$12,000 or more during the reporting period to her former law firm, Quantum Legal PLLC, (4/1/22-12/31/22) formally known as Rodriguez Interiano Hanson and Rodger, PLLC (1/1/22-3/31/22). Judge Rodriguez was an attorney with Rodriguez Interiano Hanson and Rodgers, PLLC prior to her appointment to the Benton County Superior Court.

Quantum Law, LLC has an office that employs 5 attorneys, 2 paralegals, 2 office assistants, hundreds of accounts which includes from years past that are on payment plans, the firm generates over 2 million dollars a year.

Judge Rodriguez states that obtaining the number of clients required for reporting would be an extreme burden. Some clients pay over-time and this would have to be manually calculated as well as possibly being in two separate accounting systems due to the former firm being dissolved.

Judge Rodriguez stated that some of the firm's reportable clients may be listed on the firm's website or in court documents but attests that she no longer has access to any of the client names or payment information.

Judge Rodriguez states that some payments were made with a confidentiality agreement due to insurance settlement agreements for clients. Therefore, she would be in violation of these agreements if she reports these clients that have confidentiality agreements and paid over \$12,000 during the reporting period of January 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022.

Other Issues

In her application, Judge Rodriguez stated that the Benton County Superior Courts have the client list from Quantum Law, LLC and will be assigning cases to dockets other than her own to avoid conflicts. The courts have also indicated that they will be noting the conflict in the case files.

Judge Rodriguez has agreed to recuse herself if a matter came before her involving a conflict of interest between her former law firm, Quantum Law, LLC and Benton County Superior Court.
