Reason(s) for Modification (as stated by filer)	 Mark Matteson is requesting a partial reporting modification that would exempt him from disclosing his spouse's full name. Mr. Matteson states that his wife has been a victim of identify theft through a data breach and the uniqueness of her name causes financial security or safety concerns. Mr. Matteson states that there has been an incident of fraud for his spouse. Mr. Matteson states that they have taken steps to protect themselves from future fraud.
Other Issues	 Mr. Matteson has agreed to recuse himself if a matter comes before him involving a conflict of interest between his personal interests and the public duties of his position.
