<p>SB 5840</p>	<p><i>Original Bill:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Amends C-4 reporting schedule for all campaigns to report on the 10th of each month; and active campaigns also to report on the 25th of each month from July-October. Gives treasurers 48 hours to prepare reports during July- October. Requires PACs to submit a statement of participation each year to indicate if they expect to engage in campaigning in the primary or general election. <p><i>Possible Proposed Sub:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Allows certification in lieu of monthly reports for non-participating committees.
