Purpose: The 2018 Legislature passed SSB 5991, Chapter 111, Laws of 2018, the "Disclose Act", pertaining to campaign finance disclosure. These emergency rules are necessary to implement the act **by its January 01, 2019, effective date**. The commission has completed the permanent rule making process with an effective date of May 4, 2019. This emergency rule is required to cover the period of the expiration of the first emergency rule which expires April 30, 2019 and the permanent rule with the effective date of May 4, 2019.
