



1105, competing proposals that would have privatized the distribution and sale of liquor in Washington State.

- 1.5 At the time of its 2010 campaign activity, OAV had no political committee registered with the Public Disclosure Commission, and did not report its activity in PDC filings. OAV's federal campaign activity was not reported to the Federal Election Commission.

## II.

### ALLEGATIONS IN COMPLAINT

- 2.1 On November 12, 2010, a complaint against One America Votes was received from Stefan Sharkansky, the co-author of Initiative 1100. **(Exhibit 2.)** Mr. Sharkansky alleged that OAV received a \$50,000 contribution from Protect Our Communities, the political committee formed to oppose Initiatives 1100 and 1105, and solicited additional contributions through its web site. He alleged that OAV contributions were used to support and oppose candidates and ballot propositions in the 2010 elections. He alleged that OAV's activities included sponsoring direct mail political advertising, for example a mailed "ballot guide" which made recommendations on six 2010 statewide initiatives; hosting a "New Americans Ballot Initiative Party" to campaign for and against several statewide initiatives; and conducting telephone and door-to-door canvassing concerning candidates and ballot propositions that reached tens of thousands of registered voters.
- 2.2 Mr. Sharkansky alleged that despite soliciting and receiving contributions that he alleged were reportable under RCW 42.17, and using these funds to campaign for and against Washington State candidates and ballot propositions, OAV had failed to register as an in-state political committee and disclose its activity in PDC contribution and expenditure reports.

## III.

### FINDINGS

- 3.1 After receiving Mr. Sharkansky's November 12, 2010 complaint against One America Votes, PDC staff met with the organization's legal counsel, Jim Oswald, and reviewed extensive documentation of the organization's activity in the 2010 election. OAV disclosed<sup>1</sup> its 2010 campaign activities to PDC

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<sup>1</sup> Having disclosed its activity generally to PDC staff, on December 17, 2010 OAV sought to register as a political committee and formalize its disclosure on the C-series of contribution and expenditure reports. At that time, because the complaint from Mr. Sharkansky was still under

staff on December 15, 2010 (**Exhibit 3**), and disclosed its contributions on December 17, 2010 (**Exhibit 4**). This contribution and expenditure activity is discussed below.

**3.2 Contributions to One America Votes:** From July 2010 through the post-2010 general election reporting period ending on November 30, 2010, OAV received contributions totaling \$156,303, including the following major contributions:

- Campaign for Community Change - \$46,000
- One America - \$38,392
- Protect Our Communities PAC - \$50,000
- SEIU Healthcare 775NW - \$5,000
- The Tides Center - \$5,000
- Tides Advocacy Fund - \$3,500
- UFCW 21 PAC - \$5,000

Other contributions included \$2,705 received from individuals, some of whom contributed via a secure donation page on the OAV web site. OAV's earliest contributions, a total of \$12,500 from One America and the Tides Center, were received on July 30, 2010.

**3.3** The \$46,000 contribution listed above was received from the Campaign for Community Change on October 26, 2010, which was within 21 days of the 2010 general election. (**Exhibit 5, p 11.**) Contributions to any political committee that exceed \$5,000 in the aggregate from one source must be made prior this 21-day period.

**3.4 Expenditures by One America Votes:** OAV's expenditures from July 30, 2010 to December 31, 2010 totaled \$134,143. This amount included \$99,316 in expenditures specifically supporting or opposing a candidate or ballot proposition. \$22,875 of this amount, or approximately 17% of OAV's total expenditures during 2010, supported or opposed a candidate for federal office. The remainder, \$76,441, supported or opposed Washington State

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review, PDC staff advised OAV that until it was determined that OAV did in fact have a filing requirement and that Mr. Sharkansky's complaint would be formally investigated, political committee filings could be premature. On February 11, 2011, the complaint was logged in and a formal response was requested from OAV. As discussed below, OAV registered as a political committee on March 1, 2011, responded to the complaint on March 3, 2011, and on March 4, 2011, filed C-3 and C-4 reports formally disclosing the contribution and expenditure activity that was previously disclosed to PDC staff on December 15 and 17, 2010.

initiatives or state legislative candidates. The majority of this amount, approximately \$43,254, was spent to oppose Initiatives 1100 and 1105.

- 3.5 An example of OAV's expenditures to support or oppose 2010 Washington State Initiatives, the multi-lingual ballot initiative guide referred to in Mr. Sharkansky's complaint, is attached as **Exhibit 6, pp 1 – 2**. A version written predominantly in English is attached as **Exhibit 6, pp 3 – 4**. A script of a radio advertisement opposing Initiatives 1100 and 1105 is attached as **Exhibit 7**. A listing of all OAV's activities that specifically supported or opposed a 2010 Washington State candidate or ballot proposition is attached as **Exhibit 8**.
- 3.6 During the 21-day period before the 2010 general election, OAV made approximately \$43,254 in direct mail, radio, newsprint, and other printing expenditures opposing Initiatives 1100 and 1105. These expenses were made in consultation with the Protect Our Communities committee formed to oppose I-1100 and I-1105, and were effectively *sponsored* by that committee, through a \$50,000 contribution to OAV received on October 11, 2010. **(Exhibit 5, p 8.)**
- 3.7 **Reporting by One America Votes:** OAV's political committee registration was due no later than August 13, 2010, two weeks after OAV received contributions totaling \$12,500 from One America and the Tides Center. As discussed above, the committee disclosed its activities to PDC staff on December 15, 2010, 124 days after it was due to register and begin reporting. OAV formally registered as a political committee by filing a C-1pc on March 1, 2011, 200 days after its registration was due. **(Exhibit 9.)**
- 3.8 Based on the contributions to OAV discussed in paragraph 3.2, above, the committee owed C-3 reports on at least five occasions between August 2, 2010 and the November 2, 2010 general election. The contributions disclosed to PDC staff on December 17, 2010 were disclosed between 7 and 137 days late. On March 4, 2011, these contributions were formally disclosed on C-3 monetary contributions reports, between 84 and 214 days late. **(Exhibit 5.)**
- 3.9 Based on the campaign expenditures by OAV discussed in paragraphs 3.4 and 3.5, above, the committee was required to file an initial C-4 disclosing all contributions and expenditures prior to its registration, a post-primary C-4 due on September 10, 2010, the 21-day and 7-day pre-general election C-4 reports due on October 12 and October 26, 2010, and a post-general election C-4 due on December 10, 2010. The activity disclosed to PDC staff on December 15, 2010 was disclosed between 124 and 5 days late, as follows:

The expenditure activity disclosed to PDC staff on December 15, 2010 was represented in terms of a dollar amount assigned to various activities supporting or opposing a candidate or ballot proposition, as in the table attached as **Exhibit 8**. On March 4, 2011, OAV filed C-4 Summary Reports of Contributions and Expenditures, formally reporting the activity disclosed to PDC staff on December 15, 2010. (**Exhibit 10.**) These reports, which disclosed for each expenditure the vendor's name and address, the date of the payment, and a description of the purpose of the payment, were filed between 84 and 203 days late. As noted above in paragraph 3.4, 17% of OAV's campaign expenditures in 2010 supported or opposed a candidate for federal office.

- 3.10 Based on the medium, date of distribution, and aggregate value of OAV's expenditures identifying a state, local or judicial candidate, there were no expenditures that were required to be disclosed on PDC form C-6 as Electioneering Communications, or as Independent Expenditure political advertising in a candidate race. The activity was properly disclosed on C-4 reports, which were due according to the dates in the table in paragraph 3.9, above.
- 3.11 OAV's expenditures in support of or opposition to six statewide initiatives were conducted in consultation with the committees formed to support or oppose those initiatives, and so constituted in-kind contributions to the committees. From September 4, 2010, the date of OAV's earliest expenditure in the 2010 initiative campaigns, to October 11, 2010, OAV's contributions to each of six initiative committees totaled \$550 or less.
- 3.12 During the 21-day special reporting period before the 2010 general election (October 12 – November 1, 2010), OAV's in-kind contributions to the committees formed to oppose Initiatives 1053, 1082 and 1107, and the committee formed to support Initiative 1098, totaled approximately \$3,000 in the aggregate for each committee. During the special reporting period, contributions to each committee first exceeded \$1,000 in the aggregate on

October 15, 2010. On October 18, 2010, OAV was required to file four special reports of large Last Minute Contributions (LMC reports) disclosing its October 15, 2010 contributions to the committees. The LMC reports were not filed. OAV continued to make in-kind contributions to the four committees throughout the special reporting period, and so owed additional LMC reports on October 19, 2010, October 25, 2010, and November 1, 2010. These reports were also not filed.

- 3.13 **OAV Response to Complaint:** On March 3, 2011, a response to the complaint filed by Stefan Sharkansky was received from Jim Oswald, counsel to OAV. **(Exhibit 11.)** In his response, Mr. Oswald stated, *"The failure by OAV to report with the PDC was the result of its inexperience as a first-year organization, coupled with confusion regarding its filing responsibilities and mistaken information it received from an accountant who regularly files PDC reports in response to its requests for guidance regarding PDC requirements."* Mr. Oswald indicated that OAV made a good-faith attempt to determine the extent of its disclosure requirement, and failed to file with the PDC after being advised that there was no requirement, advice the committee had good reason to believe.
- 3.14 PDC staff reviewed internal OAV email correspondence to verify the explanation offered by Mr. Oswald. This correspondence **(Exhibit 12, p 2)** confirms that OAV initially believed that it had a PDC reporting requirement of some manner, and took steps to hire professional help to comply with its requirements. OAV's efforts in this direction were somewhat belated, occurring nearly five weeks after the organization received its first reportable contributions.
- 3.15 The consultant consulted by OAV, Richard Yang, agreed to contact PDC staff to determine the extent of OAV's reporting requirement. On October 1, 2010, Mr. Yang asked PDC staff member Jennifer Hansen whether a 501(c)(4) organization conducting independent expenditures would satisfy its reporting requirement by submitting C-6 reports, or if C-4 filings would be required, presumably shorthand for political committee reporting. **(Exhibit 12, p 4.)** Mr. Yang's questions to Ms. Hansen were somewhat confused; he repeatedly stated that the entity's independent expenditures would be made *"to a PAC,"* indicating that they were either monetary transfers or in-kind contributions to the benefitted committee. Such expenditures, which are not independent, are not reported on the C-6 Independent Expenditure report.
- 3.16 On October 1, 2010, Ms. Hansen replied to Mr. Yang's question, stating that if a *"501(c)(4) group is making an expenditure to a PAC they don't have to file anything unless the 501(c)(4) group reports as a PAC as well."* **(Exhibit 12, pp 3 - 4.)** Ms. Hansen's reply clearly contemplated that the 501(c)(4) organization's expenditures would be conducted in consultation with the benefitted political committee, and so not required to be disclosed by the

sponsor on the C-6 form as independent expenditures. The same day, in response to Mr. Yang's request for clarification, Ms. Hansen stated that if a "501(c)(4) meets the definition of a political committee then they would file campaign reports with us as well."

- 3.17 On October 1, 2010, Mr. Yang met with OAV representative and reported that the committee had no PDC filing requirement whatsoever. (**Exhibit 11, p 5.**) This conclusion appeared to be based on Ms. Hansen's implicit advice that no C-6 filings would be required, and the incorrect assumption that an entity with a tax-exempt 501(c)(4) status cannot also meet the definition of a political committee in RCW 42.17.020(39).
- 3.18 OAV's failure to disclose its activity appears to have been based on incorrect advice received from Richard Yang, advice that the organization believed had originated with PDC staff. The first sign to OAV that Mr. Yang's advice had been incorrect appeared to be the complaint filed by Mr. Sharkansky. Once OAV understood that they likely did have a political committee filing requirement, they disclosed their campaign activity to PDC staff and expressed an eagerness to formalize this disclosure in PDC filings.

#### IV.

#### SCOPE

##### 4.1 PDC staff reviewed the following documents:

1. A complaint against One America Votes, received on November 12, 2010 from Stefan Sharkansky, with exhibits;
2. The One America Votes web site, located at [www.oavotes.org](http://www.oavotes.org);
3. Documents pertaining to One America Votes, including copies of email correspondence, received from OAV legal counsel Jim Oswald on December 14, 2010;
4. Email correspondence from Jim Oswald received on December 14, 15, 17, 2010, and January 5, 2011;
5. One America Votes' response to the complaint, received from Jim Oswald on March 3, 2011;
6. One America Votes contribution and expenditure reports and data, received on March 4, 2011; and
7. Contribution and expenditure reports and data from committees formed to support and oppose various 2010 statewide initiatives, including the No on I-1053 committee and the Protect Our Communities committee.

V.

LAW

**RCW 42.17.020(39)** defines a "political committee" as *"any person (except a candidate or an individual dealing with his or her own funds or property) having the expectation of receiving contributions or making expenditures in support of, or opposition to, any candidate or any ballot proposition."*

**RCW 42.17.040** requires every political committee to timely register with the Public Disclosure Commission.

**RCW 42.17.080 and 090** require political committees to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures. The reports are filed monthly following an excess of \$200 in contribution or expenditure activity, except during the five months before the election, during which time summary reports of receipts and expenditures are required to be filed 21 days and again 7 days before each election in which the committee is participating. Any contributions received and expenditures made prior to the date of registration must be disclosed on the day the registration is filed. Reports of contributions must include the name and address of any contributor who has given more than \$25 in the aggregate.



Re: Complaint against "OneAmerica Votes", its Governing Persons and Pramila Jayapal, all of 1225 S. Weller St. Suite 200 Seattle, WA 98144, (206) 723-2203.

Dear Mr. Stutzman:

I am submitting this written complaint pursuant to WAC 390-37-040(2). I have reason to believe that "OneAmerica Votes" has committed multiple violations of RCW 42.17. I assert that it was openly acting as a political committee, soliciting and accepting donations and making expenditures in order to support or oppose state candidates and ballot measures in the 2010 election. Yet I believe it failed to register itself as a political committee with the PDC and also failed to report its political contributions and expenditures to the PDC.

Specific facts:

1. "OneAmerica Votes" ("OAV") is a non-profit corporation registered with the Washington Secretary of State as of August 31, 2009. It's Governing Persons are identified as Dana Laurent, Sudha Nandagopal, M. Lorena Gonzalez and Paul Ahern, Jr.

Ms. Gonzalez and Mr. Ahern are listed in the Washington State Bar Association directory as practicing attorneys and should be expected to be familiar with state campaign finance laws.

2. OAV appears to be closely affiliated with OneAmerica (formerly known as "Hate Free Zone"), separately registered as a Washington non-profit corporation. The two entities appear to share office space and staff. Two of OAV's governing persons are listed on OneAmerica's website ([weareoneamerica.org](http://weareoneamerica.org)) as members of the OneAmerica board. Recent news reports [attached as Exhibit A] identify Pramila Jayapal as the leader of both entities. One of these news articles describes OneAmerica as "a nonprofit with ... a \$2.1 million budget (mostly from

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foundations), 17 full-time employees and a political action committee". The latter presumably refers to OAV.

3. OAV's website (oavotes.org) describes its mission as:

OneAmerica Votes advocates for policies and works to elect candidates that promote democracy and justice in immigrant communities at the local, state and federal levels.

[I attach copies of several pages and other documents from the OAV website as Exhibit B]

4. The OAV website solicits donations. Its "Donate" page includes the text:

As an advocacy and political organization applying for 501(c)4 status under the IRS code, donations to OneAmerica Votes are not tax deductible.

5. The OAV website states its endorsements of several candidates for the state Legislature in 2010, and states its positions on all 6 Initiatives to the People on the 2010 ballot.
6. The OAV website also reports that it mailed "ballot guide" flyers to voters. [A copy of the "ballot guide", downloaded from the website is included in Exhibit B]. The "ballot guide" attempts to persuade the voter how to vote on each of the 6 statewide initiatives on the November 2010 ballot. The mail piece states that it was "Paid for by OneAmerica Votes".
7. OAV held a "New Americans Ballot Initiative Party" on October 18, 2010, which is described on the website as:

OneAmerica Votes is hosting a New Americans Ballot Initiative Party to share details about the ballot initiatives facing voters this fall and to highlight their impact on immigrant communities across the state. Free food, music and other entertainment will be provided as new Americans and their allies celebrate the democratic process by casting their ballots together.

A flyer for the "Ballot Initiative Party" states that it was "Sponsored by: Asian Counseling and Referral Service, Asian Pacific Islander Coalition of WA, El Centro de la Raza, Minority Executive Directors Coalition". This "party" was obviously intended not to provide objective information about the initiatives, but as a campaign event to persuade the attendees how to vote. Nevertheless, I could not find in the PDC database any reports of campaign contributions or independent expenditures by any of the "sponsors" relating to this event.

8. OAV's "2010 Civic Engagement Calendar", posted on the website, lists several Canvassing and Phone Bank events between September 7 and November 1

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9. An item on the OAV website, apparently posted a few days after the November 2 election, reports:

Over the course of the last few months, OneAmerica Votes had more than 160,000 contacts with registered voters in Washington State, including a group of more than 25,000 immigrant voters that received phone calls, door-to-door canvassing and four direct mail pieces. Within that universe of 25,000 immigrant voters there were more than 17,000 Latino voters OneAmerica Votes was working to turn out. Based on preliminary numbers, those efforts to mobilize Latino voters in support of Patty Murray, pro-immigrant federal and state candidates, and the ballot initiatives are paying off in votes.

10. "Protect Our Communities" ("POC"), the political committee formed to oppose Initiatives 1100 and 1105, made a \$50,000 payment to OAV on October 8 (reported as a code "C" expenditure and described as a "donation" on POC's amended C-4 filed October 26).
11. It seems clear from the foregoing that OAV is acting as an in-state political committee. Yet although I diligently searched the PDC's online campaign finance database, I was unable to find any filings by OAV. OAV does not appear to have filed a CIPC, in apparent violation of RCW 42.17.040. OAV does not appear to have reported any of its receipts or expenditures, nor any independent expenditures on behalf of the candidates or ballot measures for which OAV was obviously campaigning, in apparent violation of RCW 42.17.080 and/or RCW 42.17.100. I was unable to find any reports of any monetary or in-kind contributions made by OAV to any other registered political committee. Except for the aforementioned "donation" from POC, I was unable to find any other payments from registered political committees to OAV.

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

### Ballot Initiatives

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Six ballot initiatives have qualified for the 2010 ballot in Washington State, the most in a number of years. One of these initiatives (I-1098) has the potential to provide valuable revenue for education and health care while making sure that all Washingtonians contribute their fair share. The other five initiatives would harm Washington State residents by turning its future over to out-of-state special interests and reducing the amount of funding available for core services like education and health care. Below are summaries of the six ballot initiatives, including the position OneAmerica Votes has taken on each measure:

**YES on I-1098:** I-1098 would make Washington State's tax system more fair (it ranks last in tax fairness) by eliminating the B&O tax on 80% of small businesses and reducing state property taxes by 20%. Right now, the wealthiest 1% of Washingtonians (individuals making \$200,000/year or more) pay less than 3% of their income in taxes, while the poorest 20% pay more than 17% of their income in taxes. **To balance out the tax cuts to small businesses and the vast majority of earners, I-1098 would impose a tax on individuals earnings over \$200,000/year (\$400,000 for a couple) that would generate \$2 billion in new revenue dedicated to funding education and health care.** Help provide tax relief to those who need it while bringing fairness to our tax system. VOTE YES on I-1098.

**NO on I-1053:** Passage of I-1053 would have a devastating impact on core services in Washington State by requiring a 67% approval vote in the state legislature to raise or create new taxes. This ballot initiative

is similar to one that passed a few years ago, which resulted in billions of dollars of cuts to services like health care and education, in addition to cuts to immigration services, English language programming, and English language programming. We cannot let the wellbeing of our state and our democracy be decided by 17 extremely partisan legislators. VOTE NO on I-1053.

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**NO on I-1082:** Currently, Washington State has a public workers compensation system that is a model for the nation in efficiency. **Passage of I-1082 would hand over this system to big private insurers like AIG and Liberty Mutual, who would treat workers compensation claims like they do other claims, placing barriers between injured workers and their rights.** In addition, Latinos and immigrants would be disproportionately impacted by these changes because they have higher rates of workers compensation claims, which is a result of high rates of employment in dangerous jobs. I-1082 would harm workers rights and only help the profits of big insurers like AIG. VOTE NO on I-1082.

**NO on I-1100/1105:** Both I-1100 and I-1105 would end the state's liquor control system and **result in an explosion of liquor stores that would harm our communities and cost the state millions in revenue.** Currently there are 315 stores selling liquor in Washington. A report from the State Auditor estimates that the passage of I-1100/1105 would result in more than 3,350 liquor stores populating our communities. That is 3,000 more liquor stores that can stay open until 2am, selling liquor at convenience stores and near parks and schools. History has also shown that businesses target communities of color with ads for liquor and open a disproportionate number of liquor stores in those same communities. Keep liquor stores out of our communities. VOTE NO on 1100/1105.

**NO on I-1107:** During the last legislative session, in an effort to protect core state services like the Basic Health Plan and Apple Health for Kids, the legislature passed small and mostly temporary taxes on non-essential items, like soda pop, candy and gum. **I-1107 would repeal these taxes and cost the state more than \$500 million in revenue over five years, lending another blow to core services, including schools and health care.** The taxes are very small (only 2 cents per can of soda) but they helped the state legislature balance the budget without further cuts. Passage of I-1107 would only result in less funding for schools, hospitals and other important services. VOTE NO on I-1107.

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### Endorsements

For the 2010 elections, OneAmerica Votes is endorsing candidates who have worked closely with the immigrant communities we serve and taken strong positive action on key immigration issues. Endorsements are also given where a competitive race exists and there are significant differences between candidates' positions on immigration issues.

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## Election Analysis: OAV Impact on Latino Voter Turnout

With Tuesday's elections in the books and votes still being counted, OneAmerica Votes has begun its work evaluating the effectiveness of its GOTV program.

Over the course of the last few months, OneAmerica Votes had more than 160,000 contacts with registered voters in Washington State, including a group of more than 25,000 immigrant voters that received phone calls, door-to-door canvassing and four direct mail pieces. Within that universe of 25,000 immigrant voters there were more than 17,000 Latino voters OneAmerica Votes was working to turn out. Based on preliminary numbers, those efforts to mobilize Latino voters in support of Patty Murray, pro-immigrant federal and state candidates, and the ballot initiatives are paying off in votes.

After controlling for partisanship and likelihood to vote, Latino voters within the OneAmerica Votes target universe are turning out at between 5% to 7% higher than Latinos who were not contacted by OneAmerica Votes. In addition, OneAmerica Votes voters as a whole were turning out primarily for Patty Murray (70.0%), with Latinos supporting Murray at an even higher rate (74.4%).

The following is a breakdown by likelihood to vote of voter turnout thus far in the election for Latino voters who were part of the control group and for those who were called, canvassed and contacted via direct mail by OneAmerica Votes and its volunteers (please note, these results are based on preliminary analysis):



Attached is a comprehensive list of all of our actions during the 2010 election and how much each cost. I've tried to organize them with the information the PDC requests in its reports, including who/what the actions targeted and whether it was support or opposition. I also created a column for "cost per issue," since most of our canvassing and phonebanks involved multiple asks on candidates and initiatives. This breaks down the total cost into how much was spent on each issue.

In the second tab on the document I've tried to break down how much we spent on each race and on what type of expenditures. This is a little difficult because I'm not sure how to break out the cost associated with actions where we passed out the ballot guide or our one-pager that has something about all six ballot measures on it.



Dear Mr. Stutzman:

This letter is submitted by OneAmerica Votes ("OAV") in response to your February 11, 2011 letter, with which you enclosed the November 12, 2010 complaint by Stefan Sharkansky.

Let me first express my appreciation for the extensive communication with your office during the months since Mr. Sharkansky's complaint was filed. We have appreciated the opportunity to provide you with all relevant information regarding the circumstances that resulted in OAV not reporting as a Political Committee. As you know, since OAV was first advised of this complaint, it has stood ready to submit appropriate reports. In consultation with your office, we have put off filing reports pending further discussions with your staff regarding the appropriate form of reporting. As of the date of this letter, OAV has completed form C1 and all C3s and C4s for the entire period from its founding through the present. It will submit those reports as soon as it receives a response to its pending request for a filer ID.

The purpose of this letter is to outline the reasons for OAV's failure to file reports prior to November 12, 2010, and to ask that the Commission not impose penalties for OAV's delay in filing the materials.

OneAmerica Votes is a new organization, and 2010 was the first election in which it was involved. It was organized in August 2009 and began work in July 2010 as a Washington State nonprofit corporation that is exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The failure by OAV to report with the PDC was the result of its inexperience as a first-year organization, coupled with confusion regarding its filing responsibilities and mistaken

information it received from an accountant who regularly files PDC reports in response to its requests for guidance regarding PDC requirements..

The materials I provided to your office in mid-December outline the process that led OAV to proceed without filing with the PDC. On September 12, 2010, Toby Guevin, Program Manager for OAV, met with a civic engagement consultant to discuss OAV's planned 2010 election work. The consultant suggested that OAV look into getting someone to keep track of PDC reporting and mentioned Richard Yang of EJK Accounting and Tax Service as a person who provided such services. Mr. Guevin then obtained approval to contact Mr. Yang to inquire about the services he could provide and the rates he would charge for "PDC reporting."

Mr. Guevin contacted Mr. Yang on September 18, 2010 by email and shortly thereafter by telephone, described OAV's planned activities, and asked Mr. Yang what obligations applied to an organization which, like OAV, was a 501(c)(4) corporation, rather than a typical PAC/527 organization. Before emailing Mr. Yang to discuss OAV's obligations, Mr. Guevin had gone to the PDC website. However, because the forms referenced political committees, rather than corporations, Mr. Guevin did not determine what, if anything, OAV needed to file.

When Mr. Guevin actually met with Mr. Yang on October 1, 2010, Mr. Yang advised Mr. Guevin that OAV did not need to file with the PDC because it was a 501(c)(4) organization. As Mr. Guevin explains in his declaration, he was somewhat surprised by that advice. However, in light of the *Citizens United* decision, and the fact that Mr. Yang was, in effect, turning down business by advising OAV that it didn't need his PDC reporting services, Mr. Guevin assumed Mr. Yang's advice was correct.

As you know, Mr. Yang had consulted with Jennifer Hansen of the PDC staff before advising Mr. Guevin. While it would have been reasonable for Mr. Yang to make additional inquiries in light of Ms. Hansen's responses, the emails confirm that Mr. Guevin was actively seeking advice on OAV's responsibilities under the Public Disclosure Act.

After OAV was contacted by your office, OAV staff learned that an email Mr. Yang had forwarded to Mr. Guevin regarding his exchange with Ms. Hansen was actually cut and pasted from the email string. The entire email string, while not substantially different from the cut-and-pasted version, would have provided helpful context and might have prompted Mr. Guevin to question Mr. Yang's conclusion.

When OAV learned of the complaint by Mr. Sharkansky, Mr. Guervin immediately checked with Mr. Yang to ensure that it was in compliance to the best of its knowledge. Email documentation sent to your office confirms this, and again shows that OAV was acting under the full belief that it had complied with all legal requirements.

Also upon learning of the complaint, OAV also promptly sought legal advice from my office. As you know, I then set out to work with your office to assure that OAV corrected any errors and was in compliance on a going-forward basis. (At the same time, OAV engaged John Pomeranz an attorney with the Washington D.C. firm of Harmon, Curran, Spielberg & Eisenberg, LLP, to

advise the organization on federal election law compliance, and Mr. Pomeranz continues to advise OAV on these matters.)

I would ask that the Commission take no enforcement action in this matter. I make this request for three reasons. First, as the declaration of Mr. Guevin reflects, it was always the intention of OAV to comply with all PDC requirements. OAV attempted, on numerous occasions, to solicit and follow advice provided from a person they believed knew the matters at hand, and had communicated with the PDC regarding OAV's obligations. Second, I am confident that OAV will work closely with my office to assure that it satisfies all PDC requirements in the future. It is of utmost importance to OAV's operation and values to ensure that it is always operating in full compliance with legal requirements and cooperates fully with the PDC.

Finally, without in any way minimizing the error OAV made by not reporting to the PDC, the bulk of Washington State expenditures by OAV were reflected in PDC filings. By far the major focus of OAV's non-federal activity was opposition to Initiatives 1100 and 1105. Protect Our Communities, the ballot measure committee organized to oppose those measures, reported a contribution to OAV of \$50,000 on its October 11, 2010 C4 report. Although this reporting did not fully advise the public of the specifics of OAV's efforts, it signaled that OAV was participating in the wider effort to defeat 1100 and 1105.

In summary, because OAV's violation was the result of reliance on professional advice it received from a person it reasonably assumed was conversant with PDC requirements, because OAV has acted promptly and decisively to correct its error, and because the public's right to know of major expenditures was not significantly compromised, enforcement action is not needed to fulfill the purposes of the Public Disclosure Act.

I believe OAV has provided your office with all materials relevant to Mr. Sharkansky's complaint. But if you or the Commissioners have any additional questions or concerns about the events that led to Mr. Sharkansky's complaint, please feel free to contact my office.

DECLARATION OF TOBY GUEVIN, PROGRAM MANAGER, ONEAMERICA VOTES


1. My name is Toby Guevin.
2. I am over the age of 18 and I am competent to testify to the matters stated in this Declaration.
3. I am the Program Manager of OneAmerica Votes, and I held this position at all times since August 1, 2010.
4. On September 12, 2010, with the agreement of Pramila Jayapal, Chief Executive Officer of OneAmerica Votes, I met with a civil engagement consultant, Erin Haick, to discuss anticipated 2010 election work by OneAmerica Votes ("OAV"), and seek guidance on best practices.
5. During our meeting, Ms. Haick suggested that getting someone to keep track of PDC filing and accounting information would be well worth the investment. She mentioned that Richard Yang of EJK Accounting and Tax Services filed PDC reports for other organizations involved in election activities in Washington State.
6. After speaking with Ms. Haick, I obtained permission from Pramila Jayapal to look into hiring Richard Yang, as recommended by Ms. Haick.
7. On Monday, September 20, 2010, I e-mailed Richard Yang. He advised me that the services he offered included "PDC reporting."
8. During my initial telephone conversation with Mr. Yang, I explained that OAV intended to be active in ballot measures, state legislative races and the U.S. Senate race, and that our activities would consist of independent expenditures. I also explained that OAV was a 501(c)(4) not-for-profit corporation, rather than a 527 organization, and asked whether that had an impact on our filings, in light of the *Citizens United* decision.
9. I asked that question because I had gone onto the PDC website, and noted that all of the forms spoke in terms of "political committees," rather than corporations.
10. During our telephone conversation, Mr. Yang and I scheduled a meeting for Friday, October 1. It was my understanding that he would look into our filing obligations during the interim before our October 1 meeting.

## Declaration of Toby Guevin

11. When we met on October 1, Mr. Yang advised me that, based on his research, and on an email exchange with PDC staff, we did not have an obligation to file with the PDC because we were a 501(c)(4) organization doing independent expenditures.
12. I was a bit surprised by Mr. Yang's statement. But because of the *Citizens United* ruling, and because Mr. Yang's advice amounted to turning away business we were prepared to give him, I assumed his conclusion that we did not have to file was correct.
13. To reassure me, later on October 1, Mr. Yang sent me an email exchange between him and Jennifer Hansen, who is a Filer Assistance Specialist at the PDC. I have attached the email he sent me on October 1 as Exhibit 1 to this Declaration.
14. Later in the 2010 campaign, I again contacted Mr. Yang to ask whether OAV was required to report to the PDC regarding some phone bank activity in Yakima. Mr. Yang told me we didn't have to report because we were a 501(c)(4), rather than a PAC/527.
15. On November 16, 2010, OAV became aware of the complaint as a result of Mr. Sharkansky's blog. I then re-contacted Mr. Yang. At that time, he provided me with a copy of the actual email exchange between him and Ms. Hansen. I have attached that copy as Exhibit 2 to this Declaration. When I received Exhibit 2, I realized that the email Mr. Yang had provided on October 1 had been cut and pasted from a series of emails between him and Ms. Hansen.
16. When I spoke to Mr. Yang on November 16, he recommended that I speak to Jason Bennett. Mr. Bennett advised me that OAV should have registered and reported to the PDC during the 2010 election cycle.
17. Throughout the 2010 election cycle, I believed that OAV was not required to do any filings with the PDC because of our status as a 501(c)(4) corporation.
18. It was my intention to comply with all state and federal election laws. To the extent OAV failed to comply with PDC requirements, its failure was completely unintentional.
19. I will take all steps necessary to assure that OAV complies with all PDC requirements in the future.

I declare, under penalty of perjury of the laws of the State of Washington, that the foregoing is true.


1. My name is Pramila Jayapal.
2. I am over the age of 18 and I am competent to testify to the matters stated in this Declaration.
3. I am the Chief Executive Officer of OneAmerica Votes (OAV). I was involved in the decision to establish OAV as a 501(c)(4) organization, which is permitted to engage in a broader range of activities including some politically-oriented activities as permitted by law.
4. OAV was organized in August 2009, but did not engage in any work in Washington State until July 2010.
5. I was involved in the formulation of plans for OAV political activity in the 2010 election cycle.
6. I hired Mr. Toby Guevin as the Program Director for OAV.
7. In September, 2010, Mr. Guevin and I agreed that he would seek advice from a civic engagement consultant about how to structure and implement OAV's political activities.
8. After meeting with the civic engagement consultant, Mr. Guevin advised me that the consultant recommended retaining an accountant with PDC experience to advise OAV regarding PDC registration and reporting requirements. I agreed with Mr. Guevin that he should contact the accountant identified by the civic engagement consultant.
9. After consulting with the accountant, Richard Yang, Mr. Guevin advised me that after communicating with PDC staff Mr. Yang had concluded that OAV was not required to register or report to the PDC. I asked Mr. Guevin to make sure that we were in compliance with all reporting requirements, stating that it was of paramount importance for the organization that we fulfill all such requirements. He agreed to do so.
10. I do not have any independent knowledge regarding PDC requirements and fully relied on the advice of an individual that I believed at the time to be fully knowledgeable about PDC reporting requirements.

11. Until November 16, 2010, when I received the complaint by Mr. Sharkansky, I had no reason to believe that OAV was not in full compliance with PDC requirements.
12. Immediately after November 16, 2010, I contacted legal counsel with experience in PDC matters. Since November 16, 2010, I have taken all steps available to me to assure that OAV files all required PDC reports as soon as possible.
13. As the Chief Executive Officer of OAV, and the person ultimately responsible for OAV, I am committed to assuring that OAV fully complies with all state and federal election laws. I will take all steps necessary to assure that OAV remains in full compliance with all PDC requirements in the future.
