Subject: 45-Day Citizen Action Letter - Jared Karstetter (PDC Case 8642)

I. REQUEST FOR PDC REVIEW

On September 7, 2016, Dmitri Igliztin filed a 45-Day Citizen Action Letter (Complaint) with the Washington State Attorney General's Office (AG's Office) alleging that Jared Karstetter, former legal counsel for the King County Corrections Guild (Guild), had violated various campaign finance laws through his practice of making contributions to campaigns, and then receiving reimbursement for those contributions from the Guild. **Exhibit 1.**

A. Concealing Contributions

The Complaint alleged that Mr. Karstetter violated RCW 42.17A.435 by concealing contributions made by the King County Corrections Guild from 2012 through 2015, and identifying himself as the source of the funds for the contribution.

RCW 42.17A.435 states "No contribution shall be made and no expenditure shall be incurred, directly or indirectly, in a fictitious name, anonymously, or by one person through an agent, relative, or other person in such a manner as to conceal the identity of the source of the contribution or in any other manner so as to effect concealment."

B. Earmarking Contributions

The Complaint further alleged that Mr. Karstetter violated RCW 42.17.460 by earmarking contributions received from the King County Corrections Guild through him to candidates for public office.

RCW 42.17A.460 states in part "All contributions made by a person or entity, either directly or indirectly, to a candidate... are considered to be contributions from that person or entity to the candidate... as are contributions that are in any way earmarked or otherwise directed through an intermediary or conduit to the candidate, state official, or political committee."

C. Intermediary or Agent:

The Complaint also alleged that Mr. Karstetter violated RCW 42.17A.470 by being an intermediary or an agent for a contribution. RCW 42.17A.470 concerns contributions made on behalf of another person, and states in part “(1) A person, other than an individual, may not be an intermediary or an agent for a contribution. (2) An individual may not make a contribution on behalf of another person or entity, or while acting as the intermediary or agent of another person or entity.”

D. Reimbursement for Contributions:

Finally, the Complaint alleged that Mr. Karstetter violated RCW 42.17A.485 by being reimbursed by the King County Corrections Guild for contributions that were disclosed by the recipient candidate as having been made in Mr. Karstetter’s name. RCW 42.17A.485 concerns reimbursement for contributions and states “A person may not, directly or indirectly, reimburse another person for a contribution to a candidate for public office, political committee, or political party.”

On October 5, 2016, the AG’s Office referred the Complaint to the Public Disclosure Commission, requesting review and investigation of the allegations, and asking the Commissioners for their recommendation.

II. COMPLAINT DETAILS

As part of the Complaint, Mr. Iglitzin provided documentation that included a copy of the King County Correction Guild reimbursement checks made out to Mr. Karstetter and the corresponding Monetary Contributions reports (C-3 reports) filed by candidates for public office who received the contribution.

The documentation included a copy of the King County Correction Guild check register for two expenditures in the form of reimbursements (Complaint Exhibits A & B), and a copy of the King County Correction Guild Motion of the Executive Board/General Membership to support Rod Dembowski for King County Council and make an \$1,800 contribution to his campaign (Complaint Exhibit B).

The documentation indicated that Mr. Karstetter had been reimbursed \$7,650 by the King County Corrections Guild for eight monetary contributions that had been disclosed by the recipient candidates as having been made by him personally:

In addition, Mr. Igliztin alleged in the Complaint:

- Mr. Vance “specifically informed Mr. Karstetter that it was unlawful for Mr. Karstetter to donate to candidates as if it was coming from Mr. Karstetter personally, money that Mr. Karstetter had either already received from the Guild or money that he intended to be reimbursed for from the Guild.”
- The Guild believed that Mr. Karstetter, by contributing Guild money to candidates without having obtained the proper consent, “was acting ultra vires and without legal authority to take this action on behalf of the Guild.”
- All Guild expenditures were required to have been signed by Guild Treasurer and cosigned by one of the three remaining principal officers. The Guild’s apparently belief and understanding was that most, if not all, of the checks written to Mr. Karstetter were written by Mr. Music without him having obtained such a co-signature.
- Mr. Music, in providing Guild funds to Mr. Karstetter that he could then use to make political contributions in his own name, or to reimburse him after the fact for having done so, was also acting ultra vires and without legal authority to take such actions on behalf of the Guild.”

III. STAFF INVESTIGATIVE REVIEW

A. Records and Database Information

PDC staff reviewed the following documents:

- September 7, 2016, a 45-Day Citizen Action Letter filed with the Washington State Attorney General's Office by Dmitri Igliztin against Jared Karstetter.
- Copies of the King County Corrections Guild Constitution and By-Laws. **Exhibit 2.** The by-laws included: (1) Article I, Section 9, which requires consent from the majority of the Guild membership voting at a regular or special meeting prior to anyone associated with the Guild endorsing any political candidate; and (2) Article II, Section 4, which requires

that all checks written by the Guild Treasurer must be signed by the Treasurer, and cosigned by one of the three remaining Guild principal officers.

- October 13, 2016, email from Garrett Garfield, an attorney with the law firm Holland & Knight in Portland, Oregon, in which he attached a three-page response letter from Mr. Karstetter, and two additional pages as an exhibit. **Exhibit 3.**
- October 21, 2016, email from Mr. Garfield in which he attached a one-page response letter from Mr. Karstetter, and a Dow Constantine fundraising invitation addressed to the Guild and sent to his personal residence. **Exhibit 4.**
- King County Corrections Guild website, and online articles concerning the Guild.
- PDC Contribution database for contributions made by Jared Karstetter and the King County Corrections Guild.

Staff conducted several queries of the PDC contributions and expenditures database, which disclosed the following:

- According to staff's query of the PDC contribution database, between June 29, 2012 through December 31, 2015, Mr. Karstetter and his spouse Julie Karstetter had 37 monetary contributions attributed to them totaling \$17,195 to a number of candidates seeking public office and to one political committee. Staff noted that some of the contributions attributed to Mr. Karstetter in the PDC database included some of the alleged reimbursed contributions from the Guild identified in the Complaint.
- After the telephone investigative interview, PDC staff provided Mr. Karstetter with the staff generated spreadsheet query listing the \$17,295 in contributions attributed to him, and asked him to identify which contributions, if any had been made by him personally. The spreadsheet included the seven contributions attributed to Mr. Karstetter that were identified in the Complaint, and staff highlighted those contributions in yellow.
- Mr. Karstetter reviewed and marked-up the spreadsheet and noted on the spreadsheet that some of the contributions attributed to him personally, and some were actually contributions from the King County Corrections, Juvenile or Sheriff's Guild's.
- Mr. Karstetter highlighted five contributions totaling \$575 in orange, indicating that he made those contributions using personal funds and was not reimbursed for any of those contributions. He highlighted the remaining contributions in green totaling more than \$10,000 that appear to have been made from either the King County Corrections, Juvenile or Sheriff's Guild's. **Exhibit 5.**
- Between October 10, 2011 through July 30, 2016, the King County Corrections Guild made 62 contributions totaling \$63,150 to a number of candidates seeking public office and to several political committees including political party organizations and caucus political committees. **Exhibit 6.**

B. Interviews

PDC staff conducted the following investigative telephone interviews under oath:

- October 11, 2016: Chris Vance, registered lobbyist and public affairs advisor for the Guild.
- October 17, 2016: David Kirk, current Treasurer for the Guild, with legal counsel Mr. Iglitzin present.
- October 24, 2016: Jared Karstetter with legal counsel Mr. Garfield present.

1. Jared Karstetter

On October 24, 2016 Staff interviewed Jared Karstetter over the telephone. Mr. Karstetter was under oath and accompanied by his legal counsel, Garrett Garfield.

Mr. Karstetter has been employed by the Guild since 1996, and prior to that he spent 14 years with the King County Police Union. He has been an employee of the Guild since its inception, serving as the Guild's in house legal counsel. He stated that he is also employed as legal counsel for the King County Marshall's Guild.

Mr. Karstetter stated that the Guild has a small office in a renovated house in Tukwila, and that the Officers basically run the Guild on an ad-hoc type basis. He he attended every Guild meeting, which included the Guild's monthly board meeting and a general membership meeting, as well as a monthly labor/management meeting, and any other meeting that came up. He stated that the Guild Board is comprised of the four officers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer), and eight shift representatives, four each from the King County Jail and the Regional Justice Center in Kent, one for each shift which he said would be similar to a union "shop steward" position.

Mr. Karstetter stated that he advises the Guild Board on all matters, and that his duties would be similar to a business representative in that he is the only Guild employee, every other Guild Board Officer or Board member was elected by the membership. He stated in addition to advising the Guild in all legal matters, and at its meetings, he is also involved in contract negotiations, collective bargaining issues, candidate endorsements and contributions, lobbying efforts, and other Guild matters.

Mr. Karstetter stated the Guild hired Chris Vance for public relations and lobbying in 2007, and that he has known Mr. Vance since the 1990's when he served on the King County Council. He stated that Mr. Vance was always a supporter of the Guild when he was a Councilmember, and he recommended that the Guild hire Mr. Vance in 2007 to act as the Guild's Public Relations adviser and lobbyist in Olympia. He stated that Mr. Vance also took over the candidate endorsement process, and Mr. Karstetter stated that the Guild's endorsement of candidates was conducted at a general membership meeting, as well as approving contributions to the endorsed candidates.

Mr. Karstetter stated that he provides input including recommendations about which candidates the Guild should endorse or make contributions to, but that he does not have a vote for the Guild in any matter, nor does Mr. Vance.

Mr. Karstetter stated that he has always been reimbursed for monetary contributions that he made on behalf of the Guild. He stated that whenever he made contributions that he was later reimbursed by the guild for, it was his practice to always inform the candidates, or the candidate's representatives at the fundraiser or event, that the contributions were on behalf of the Guild.

Mr. Karstetter attended candidate events on behalf of the Guild, along with Randy Weaver, former Guild Vice-President and current Guild President. He stated that each of the candidates the Guild made contributions to had a "direct relationship" with Guild corrections officers and sergeants.

Mr. Karstetter stated that "Mr. Weaver requested that I pay for the event at the door with my credit card. He then instructed the Treasurer to reimburse me upon presentation of my credit card statement" which was usually done at the next Guild meeting. The majority of the Guild candidate contributions were made through the US Postal Service; the Guild Treasurer prepared the contribution check and mailed it directly to the candidate's campaign mailing address.

Mr. Karstetter stated in response to staff's question, that when he made an electronic contribution it was by using his personal credit card, but that the contribution was actually from the Guild. He stated that in most instances the candidates PayPal link or online contribution link or software did not allow him to enter the Guild's name as the source of the contributions, since it was his personal credit card, so he had to enter his name. He added that when he attended the event or spoke to the candidate prior to, or at the event, he made it clear that the contribution came from the Guild.

Mr. Karstetter stated he did not represent to any of the candidates that the contributions had been made by him personally. He stated "As with every other event of this nature, all parties understood that I made the payment in my capacity as an employee of the Guild, and the table placard at the events read King County Corrections Guild." He stated that that each of the contributions listed in the Complaint "took place in connection with events that Mr. Vance had recommended that the Guild participate in." He went on to state the following about some of the candidate contributions:

Contributions to Rod Dembowski:

- Rod Dembowski was a candidate running for Attorney General Robert Ferguson's seat on the King County Council in 2013. Mr. Karstetter stated that the Guild voted to endorse Mr. Dembowski at its monthly meeting, and at the same meeting, Guild Board members approved making a contribution to Mr. Dembowski. He stated that the Guild Treasurer at the time instructed him to make the contribution since Mr. Dembowski did not have a campaign mailing address to receive the check.

- Mr. Karstetter stated that he contacted Mr. Dembowski, and coordinated to make the contribution to his campaign electronically through the campaign website using his personal credit card. The Guild had approved making the maximum contribution to the Dembowski Campaign, which was a total of \$1,800, or \$900 for the primary and general elections.
- At the next Guild meeting, Mr. Karstetter sought reimbursement from the Guild for the Dembowski contribution. He stated that the “Guild executive board was aware of and approved this procedure, as did Mr. Vance.” He stated that he did not ever represent to the Dembowski Campaign that the contribution was from him personally, and that it was his understanding that all parties understood it was a contribution to have been attributed as being from the Guild.

Contributions to Pete Von Reichbauer:

- Pete Von Reichbauer is a multi-term incumbent King County Councilmember. Mr. Karstetter stated that Mr. Von Reichbauer hosts an annual fundraising event at Emerald Downs where his Campaign sponsors a race. He stated Mr. Von Reichbauer always sends an invitation to the Guild requesting the Guild purchase a table at the event, and that the invitation is always sent to Mr. Karstetter.
- Mr. Karstetter stated the Guild purchased a total of 10 seats for the event, and that the attendees at the table included six Guild Board members and three members of the King County Marshall’s Guild. He stated that the “Guild Leadership routinely instructed me to pay for this event, and after which I was reimbursed by the (Guild) President and Treasurer.”

Mr. Karstetter stated that concerning the reimbursed contributions, “it was more convenient for the Guild to have me pay for the event and get reimbursed” from the Guild after the event had been held. He stated that since the Guild only met two times a month, the reimbursements, including those made to him, would take place at those meetings. He stated that Mr. Vance was aware of the reimbursement, since he was briefly present at one the events and witnessed him making the payments with his credit card.

Mr. Karstetter stated that he did not “conceal the source of any funds contributed to candidates” and that he did not seek reimbursement from the Guild for monetary contributions that had been made him personally in his own name. He stated that the Guild directed and authorized all of the activities that he is alleged to have engaged in and contributions made by the Guild dating back for almost 20 years.

Mr. Karstetter stated he has spoken to several candidates since he became aware of the complaint, explained the reimbursement issue to them, and they informed him that the candidates stated their Treasurer or campaign staff person that receives the online confirmations of contributions, only receives the name, address, amount of the contributions and employer and occupation from individuals. He further stated that typically, the Treasurer or campaign staffer would not be aware of conversations the candidate had with representatives of various entities concerning the contributions made and the appropriate attribution of those contributions.

Mr. Karstetter provided a copy of a Dow Constantine fundraising invitation that was addressed to the Guild and had been sent to him at his personal residence, as one piece of evidence. He stated that “the Guild – who specifically directed and approved everything it now purports to complain about – is the party who gains” in this matter.

Mr. Karstetter stated that he believes the Guild’s allegations were “made in bad faith in an effort to gain some perceived advantage in my separate lawsuit against the Guild for breaching my employment contract.” He stated that the Guild’s allegations against him do not make any sense since he does not live in King County and he has nothing to gain personally by “paying for King County Elected officials events.”

Mr. Karstetter stated that “in light of the pending breach of contract case between me and the Guild, I respectfully submit that this matter should be summarily dismissed.”

2. Chris Vance

On October 11, 2016, Staff conducted an investigative telephone interview under oath with Chris Vance. Mr. Vance is a former King County Councilmember from 1993 through 2001, and a State Representative from the 31st Legislative District from 1990 through 1993. Mr. Vance also served as the Chair of the Washington State Republican Party, and is currently running for U.S. Senate.

Mr. Vance was hired by the Guild in 2007, and has worked for the Guild ever since. His duties include acting as a Lobbyist for the Guild and providing testimony before the King County Council, the King County Executive, and the Washington State Legislature. Mr. Vance has been registered as a lobbyist with the PDC since 2014, filing Monthly Lobbyist Expense reports. Mr. Vance also provides external press relations for the Guild, and oversees the Guilds candidate endorsement and contribution recommendations.

Mr. Vance stated that he has a number of other clients that he provides public affairs and political consulting services to, and that the Guild is not his sole client. He stated that he attends two Guild meetings a month and has done so since 2007, which includes a Board meeting of elected Guild representatives, and a general membership meeting. He stated the Guild has a small office in Tukwila, but it is not staffed and the Officers and Officer Representatives serve as an “ad-hoc” organization. He stated that the monthly Board meetings include discussions about county budgets for corrections officers, collective bargaining and union issues, legislation before the Washington State Legislature or King County government, endorsing candidates and making political contributions.

Mr. Vance stated that. The Guild endorses candidates and he is involved in every step of the endorsement process including scheduling the candidate interviews, developing the candidate interview questionnaires, presentations to the Guild Board and members, making endorsement recommendations, and then communicating those endorsements through press releases and the website. He stated that once the candidate endorsement process has been completed, he was involved in the next step of was making political contributions to candidates. This included him making presentations and recommendations at the monthly Guild Board and Guild general membership meetings concerning which candidates to support.

Mr. Vance stated that he has known Mr. Karstetter since the 1990's when he served on the King County Council. He stated that Mr. Karstetter would be present at the two monthly meetings he referenced earlier, and that he likely had other meetings with him over the years in which he was in attendance but he did not recall meeting with him one on one. He stated that Mr. Karstetter was in attendance at meetings in which they discussed the Guild endorsing candidates and making contributions to candidates.

Mr. Vance recalled several occasions in which Mr. Karstetter disagreed with his candidate recommendations and suggested the Guild endorse or contribute to a different candidate. He stated that Mr. Karstetter's role in making contributions from the Guild to candidates included attending the candidate fundraisers, and, in some instances, delivering the contributions made by the Guild to candidates. He stated that the Guild also made contributions to the caucus political committees, and he thought those contributions were mailed directly to those committees.

Mr. Vance stated that he informed Mr. Karstetter that it was a potential PDC issue for him to be reimbursed by the Guild for contributions he had made personally.

3. David Kirk

On October 17, 2016, Staff interviewed David Kirk, current Guild Treasurer, by telephone interview under oath.

Mr. Kirk has been a member of the King County Corrections Guild since August of 2000, and is currently the Guild's Treasurer since being elected in April of 2016. His Treasurer duties include being part of the Executive Board of the Guild, overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Guild, making sure all of the Guild's bills are timely paid, reviewing Guild investments, and balancing the Guild's various accounts.

Mr. Kirk stated that the Guild member's dues are administered by King County, and the Guild's 539 member's dues are payroll deducted from their checks and direct deposited from King County into the Guild checking account. He stated that the Guild has a small office in a renovated house located in Tukwila, and that the Officers basically run the Guild on an ad-hoc basis. He stated that the Guild has at least two meetings a month at their offices, a board meeting and a general membership meeting, and they conduct Executive Board training sessions at the office.

Mr. Kirk stated that he would work as Guild Treasurer wherever he finds a place to work, which included from the Office, from home, and other locations. He stated that he does not have an accounting or financial background, but that the Guild hired an accountant to train him on Guild business and the computer program.

Mr. Kirk stated that the Guild does endorse candidates for public office, and the Executive Board would conduct two to three candidate interviews during the monthly Board meetings. The candidates would appear before the Board and make a presentation that lasted between 15-30 minutes and included a question and answer section from Guild Officers.

Mr. Kirk stated the Guild would then make a recommendation to its general membership to endorse a specific candidate, and if that recommendation was approved, then the Board would have discussions about making a contribution to that candidate, including how much to contribute. He stated the Board would determine how much of a contribution to make to each candidate, and record that information into the Guild meeting minutes. After a contribution has been approved, he stated he would then send a check out through the US Postal Service.

Mr. Kirk stated that when the Guild makes an expenditure, whether for a contribution to a candidate or to pay a vendor, the Guild requires that the check contain the signatures of two Guild Officers. He stated that the process for reimbursing a Guild Officer or member for an out-of-pocket expenditure would be the same and require two signatures from Guild Officers. In addition, the Guild procedures also require that a receipt for the initial expenditure be submitted to him prior to making the reimbursement.

Mr. Kirk stated there may have been one instance since he became Treasurer where the Guild provided a signed contribution check to be delivered to a candidate, but his usual practice is to mail the contribution check. He stated that once the contribution check was mailed, he would inform or notify other Guild Officers or Mr. Vance that he had sent out the check.

Mr. Kirk stated that prior to being elected Treasurer, he began attending Guild meetings in January to become more knowledgeable about running for office. He stated that Mr. Karstetter was in attendance at those meetings, but they did not discuss official Guild business, and that Mr. Karstetter was no longer the Guild's legal advisor when he became Treasurer. He stated that there have not been any changes to the way the Guild makes contributions or reimburses Officers or members, but the Guild is currently strictly following its by-laws.

Mr. Kirk stated that he did not review any Guild records or documents that led to the Complaint being filed against Mr. Karstetter, but that the Guild has hired an accountant to conduct a review of the Guild's books and bookkeeping practices which should be complete in late October or early November.

IV. ANALYSIS

Jared Karstetter acknowledged that he has always been reimbursed for monetary contributions that he made on behalf of the Guild using his personal credit card, including contributions made prior to the dates for the contributions listed in the Complaint. He stated that all of the contributions for which he was reimbursed, had been made by him personally using his credit card on behalf of the Guild. He stated that he was never reimbursed for any of the personal contributions that he made.

A. Did Mr. Karstetter conceal contributions from the Guild in violation of RCW 42.17A.435?

RCW 42.17A.435 states "No contribution shall be made and no expenditure shall be incurred, directly or indirectly, in a fictitious name, anonymously, or by one person through an agent, relative, or other person in such a manner as to conceal the identity of the source of the contribution or in any other manner so as to effect concealment."

Mr. Karstetter typically would receive candidate fundraising letters addressed to the King County Corrections Guild at his personal residence. Concerning the monetary contributions that were mailed directly to candidates by the King County Corrections Guild, the Guild Treasurer would mail all of those contribution checks and he was not involved with those contributions once the Board had approved them.

For the candidate fundraisers and other events in which Mr. Karstetter and other King County Correction Guild Officers or members would attend in person, the Guild authorized him to make a contribution or pay the event fee in advance through the candidate's online contributions link. Since the King County Corrections Guild did not have a business credit card, Mr. Karstetter would use his personal credit to make the payment or the contribution to the candidate's campaign. He would then seek reimbursement for the contributions he made on his credit card on behalf of the King County Corrections Guild at the next Guild meeting from the Treasurer.

Mr. Karstetter recalled in most instances that the candidate's contribution link did not allow him to enter that the contribution was being made by the King County Corrections Guild, so he would have to enter his name as the source of the funds since the credit card was in his name. He stated that he always informed the candidates or the candidate's representatives at the fundraiser or event that the contribution he made using his personal credit card, had been made on behalf of the Guild.

Mr. Karstetter stated that the Guild directed and authorized all of the activities that he is alleged to have engaged in the Complaint, and for contributions made by the Guild dating back for almost 20 years. He stated that he did not "conceal the source of any funds contributed to candidates" as an employee of the King County Corrections Guild, and that he did not seek reimbursement from the Guild for monetary contributions that had been made him personally in his own name.

The evidence of staff's limited review appears to indicate there were no efforts undertaken by Mr. Karstetter or the King County Corrections Guild to intentionally conceal the contributions made by the King County Corrections Guild to the various candidates. While there appears to have been a number of contributions in addition to the ones alleged in the complaint, that the contributor was incorrectly identified on the C-3 reports filed by the recipient candidates, it is not clear whether that would constitute "concealment" under the statute because the contributions were not made through Mr. Karstetter "so as to effect concealment."

B. Did Mr. Karstetter earmark contributions in violation of RCW 42.17A.460?

RCW 42.17A.460 states in part "All contributions made by a person or entity, either directly or indirectly, to a candidate ... are considered to be contributions from that person or entity to the candidate ... as are contributions that are in any way earmarked or otherwise directed through an intermediary or conduit to the candidate, state official, or political committee."

Mr. Karstetter stated that he made the contributions to the candidate's campaigns using his personal credit card and was later reimbursed by the King County Corrections Guild for those contributions. He stated that the King County Corrections Guild authorized him to make the contribution to the candidates, and then to later be reimbursed for those contributions.

The contributions were not earmarked or designated through Mr. Karstetter as an intermediary or conduit for the King County Corrections Guild contributions. The contributions that were reimbursed directly to Mr. Karstetter were made on behalf of the Guild, and the Guild should have been disclosed by the candidates as the source of the funds.

C. Did Mr. Karstetter act as an intermediary or agent of the Guild in violation of RCW 42.17A.470?

RCW 42.17A.470 concerns contributions made on behalf of another person, and states in part “(1) A person, other than an individual, may not be an intermediary or an agent for a contribution. (2) An individual may not make a contribution on behalf of another person or entity, or while acting as the intermediary or agent of another person or entity.”

Mr. Karstetter did act as an agent or intermediary of the Guild when he made contributions with his personal credit card on behalf of the Guild and then was reimbursed by the Guild. This is an apparent violation of RCW 42.17A.470. These activities resulted in confusion and lack of clarity in campaign reports. The campaign treasurers may not have known that contributions from Mr., Karstetter were really contributions by the Guild. As a result, the contributions were not properly identified and tracked, and there was a likely risk of over limit contributions if additional contributions were made directly by the Guild.

D. Did Mr. Karstetter receive reimbursement for contributions in violation of RCW 42.17A.485?

RCW 42.17A.485 concerns reimbursement for contributions and states “A person may not, directly or indirectly, reimburse another person for a contribution to a candidate for public office, political committee, or political party.”

The majority of the contributions made by the King County Corrections Guild were monetary contribution checks that were mailed directly to the candidates through the US Postal Service by the Guild Treasurer.

Mr. Karstetter acknowledged that he has always been reimbursed by the King County Corrections Guild for monetary contributions that he made personally on behalf of the Guild. The King County Corrections Guild contributions that Mr. Karstetter was reimbursed for, were for candidate campaign events in which Mr. Karstetter and other Guild Officers or members would personally attend on behalf of the Guild. For those events, Mr. Karstetter stated that he would make a contribution in advance through the candidate’s online contributions link using his personal credit, and then he would get reimbursed by the Guild Treasurer at the next King County Corrections Guild Board or general membership meeting.

RCW 42.17A.485 prohibits a person or entity from reimbursing another for a contribution. Mr. Karstetter did not reimburse anyone—instead, he received reimbursement from the Guild. Mr. Karstetter does not appear to have violated RCW 42.17A.485.

E. Did Staff’s investigative review reveal any other violations of RCW 42.17A?

King County Corrections Guild: Possible violations of RCW 42.17A.485 by the King County Corrections Guild for knowingly reimbursing Jared Karstetter for contributions he initially made using his personal credit card.

Mr. Karstetter stated that the King County Corrections Guild Board and Officers knowingly reimbursed him for contributions that they “authorized” him to make to candidates on behalf of the Guild using his personal credit card. He stated the King County Corrections Guild Board “directed” the Guild Treasurer to reimburse him for the contributions. Mr. Karstetter stated that he always informed the candidates or the candidate’s representatives at the fundraiser or event that the contribution he made using his credit card, had been made on behalf of the King County Corrections Guild.

Pursuant to the plain language of RCW 42.17A.480, it is an apparent violation for the Guild to have reimbursed Mr. Karstetter for making the contributions to candidates using his personal credit card.

King County Corrections Guild: Possible violations of RCW 42.17A.405(2) by the King County Corrections Guild for knowingly reimbursing Jared Karstetter for contributions he initially made using his personal credit card, and making additional contributions to the same candidates directly, thereby exceeding campaign contribution limits.

RCW 42.17.405(2) states that “No person ... may make contributions to a candidate for a legislative office, county office... that in the aggregate exceed *eight hundred dollars or to a candidate for a public office in a special purpose district or a state office other than a legislative office that in the aggregate exceed *one thousand six hundred dollars for each election in which the candidate is on the ballot or appears as a write-in candidate.”³

Staff’s review of the PDC contribution database found contributions that had been made by the King County Corrections Guild and disclosed by the candidates on C-3 reports for the maximum allowable contribution or close to the maximum contribution limit (\$950 to \$1,000 per election for Legislative and King County Council, and \$1,800 to \$2,000 per election for statewide office).

When those contributions are combined with contributions that had been reimbursed to Mr. Karstetter and incorrectly attributed to him personally, it appears that the Guild contributed more than the legal campaign contribution amounts to several candidates for that particular election cycle. The candidates and campaigns would not have known this and could not have accurately tracking the contributions due to Mr. Karstetter and the Guild’s practice of allowing him to self-pay contributions on his credit card and receive reimbursement later.

As noted during staff’s limited review of this matter, Mr. Karstetter had explained that some of the contributions that had been attributed to him personally by the candidates, were actually contributions from either the King County Corrections, Juvenile or Sheriff’s Guild. Since he also was the legal advisor for the King County Marshall’s Guild, staff was not able to ascertain whether additional contribution limits had been exceeded.

³ The asterisks are to note that the contribution limits found in this section are indexed every two years, and have typically increased each time.

There were apparently violations of RCW 42.17A.405(2) by the Guild through direct contributions to campaigns during the same campaign cycle that there were contributions by Mr. Karstetter as the intermediary or agent of the Guild.

V. Staff Recommendation

A. Concealment:

Staff recommends that the Commission communicate to the Attorney General that within the limited investigative timeframe of the Citizen Action Letter, staff could not conclude that Jared Karstetter violated RCW 42.17A.435 by concealing contributions made by the King County Corrections Guild, and identifying himself as the source of the funds for the contribution.

The evidence indicates that the recipient candidates of the contributions made by Mr. Karstetter using his personal credit card, which were subsequently reimbursed by the King County Corrections Guild, were incorrectly attributed to Mr. Karstetter in campaign contribution reports. While PDC staff found no evidence that the contributions were intentionally concealed by Mr. Karstetter or the King County Corrections Guild, nonetheless the true source of the contributions was not disclosed or identified. However, RCW 42.17A.435 requires an intent in that the contribution must be made “in such a manner as to conceal the identity of the source of the contribution or in any other manner so as to effect concealment” and Staff did not find evidence of such an intent here.

B. Earmarking:

Staff recommends that the Commission communicate to the Attorney General that Jared Karstetter did not violate RCW 42.17.460 by allegedly earmarking contributions made by the King County Corrections Guild through him to candidates for public office. The statute defines earmarking as “a designation, instruction, or encumbrance, whether direct or indirect, expressed or implied, or oral or written, that is intended to result in or does result in all or any part of a contribution being made to a certain candidate or state official.” That does not appear to have been an issue in the current matter. Mr. Karstetter initially made the contributions directly using his personal credit card at the direction of the Guild, and was later reimbursed by the Guild for the contributions.

C. Intermediary or agent:

Staff recommends that the Commission communicate to the Attorney General that Jared Karstetter appears to have violated RCW 42.17A.470 by being an intermediary or an agent of the Guild for making a contribution, since he made the contributions using his personal credit card and was later reimbursed by the Guild. It appears from Staff’s review that the Guild was aware of this activity, and endorsed it by reimbursing Mr. Karstetter for the contributions.

D. Reimbursement:

Staff recommends that the Commission communicate to the Attorney General that Jared Karstetter did not violate RCW 42.17A.485 concerning reimbursement by the King County

Corrections Guild for contributions he initially made with his personal credit card. The statute prohibits one person from reimbursing another person for a contribution made to a candidate, and does not address the receipt of reimbursement.

E. Any other violations:

Staff further recommends that the Commission communicate to the Attorney General that the King County Corrections Guild may have violated RCW 42.17A.485 when it reimbursed Mr. Karstetter for the contributions he made on behalf of the Guild using his personal credit card.

In addition, staff further recommends that the Commission communicate to the Attorney General that the King County Corrections Guild may have violated RCW 42.17A.405 by making over limit contributions to campaigns when it made both direct contributions and reimbursed Mr. Karstetter for the contributions he made on behalf of the Guild using his personal credit card. Because Staff have not had time to contact the candidates and verify our concerns, we are not including campaign information in this memorandum.

Please note that the campaigns could not have known and could not have accurately tracked these contributions because of the practice of Mr. Karstetter and the Guild allowing Mr. Karstetter to use his personal credit card and then receive reimbursement from the Guild later. Staff do not consider the campaigns to have violated the contribution limits—the campaigns were victims of the confusing contribution/reimbursement practice.

Introduction

My firm is writing to you on behalf of our client, the King County Corrections Guild ("the Guild"). The purpose of this letter is to bring to your attention violations of several provisions of RCW 42.17A committed by Jared Karstetter.

As outlined herein, there is sufficient evidence to support these allegations to support initiative of a lawsuit against Mr. Karstetter for violations of the Public Disclosure Act. If your office does not commence an action concerning this issue within forty-five days of the date of this letter, our client intends to commence a citizen action as authorized under 42.17A.765(4).

Nature of Violations

Mr. Karstetter's law firm, the Law Firm of Jared C. Karstetter, P.S., served as the Guild's legal counsel from 1996 through 2016. Between June of 2012 through October of 2015, Mr. Karstetter himself intentionally made numerous political contributions to candidates and candidate committees under his own name, knowing that these were actually political contributions to those candidates and candidate committees being made by and from the Guild, knowing that these contributions should have been identified as such.

Mr. Karstetter did this in two different ways. On some occasions, he asked the Guild to give him a check in the amount of the planned contribution (hereafter, a "preimbursement"), then later wrote a personal check for that same amount to the candidate or candidate's committee, informing the recipient that this was his personal contribution. See Exhibits A, C, E, and G, attached.¹ On other occasions, he first wrote a personal check to the candidate or candidate's committee, informing the recipient that this was his personal contribution, and only later obtained reimbursement from the Guild of the amount contributed. See, e.g., Exhibits B, D, F, and H, attached.²

The Guild contends that in both of these scenarios, Mr. Karstetter acted with full knowledge that the money being contributed to the candidate or candidate's committee had either already been provided by the Guild (in the form of a preimbursement check that had already been written to him) or that the money *would be* provided to him as a reimbursement after-the-fact. The Guild further contends that Mr. Karstetter, who was at all pertinent times at issue herein a member of the Washington State Bar Association and a person with experience in the areas of campaign finance and electoral politics, took these actions with both actual and constructive knowledge that what he was doing was unlawful.

The following table sets forth at least some of the instances when this conduct occurred:

¹ With regard to Exhibit C, it may be that Mr. Karstetter *also* contributed \$500 of his own money to the Bob Ferguson campaign. However, it is clear that at least one-half of the \$1000 that campaign reported as having received from Mr. Karstetter was Guild money that was being transmitted to the campaign through Mr. Karstetter, money that should have been reported as having been contributed by the Guild. Similarly, with regard to Exhibit G, Mr. Karstetter may have contributed \$127.50 of his own money on June 30, 2015; the remaining \$1500 conveyed to the Van Reichbauer campaign on that date was clearly the \$1500 Mr. Karstetter had obtained from the Guild for this purpose on June 24, six days earlier.

² With regard to Exhibit B, while it is clear that Mr. Karstetter was reimbursed \$900 by the Guild on December 12, 2012, for a \$900 contribution that was conveyed by Mr. Karstetter to the Dembowski campaign on November 30, 2012, and designated as a personal contribution, it is not clear whether the second \$900 reimbursement was given to Mr. Karstetter *in advance of*, or *after*, the second \$900 contribution conveyed by Mr. Karstetter to the Dembowski campaign, which also took place on December 12, 2012. With regard to Exhibit H, it appears that the amount of reimbursement Mr. Karstetter obtained from the Guild on October 28, 2015, in reference to his October 20, 2015, campaign contribution of \$865 to the Dow Constantine campaign was slightly (\$35) in excess of the amount of money Mr. Karstetter had actually contributed. The undersigned has no explanation for that disparity.

The supporting documentation for each alleged violation listed in this table, including any Guild reimbursement or preimbursement checks that exist for each amount in question, along with relevant PDC reports confirming the amounts for each contribution and other pertinent reported information, is attached within the corresponding exhibit.

By concealing the identity of the true source of funds contributed to candidates, Mr. Karstetter engaged in violations of Washington’s campaign disclosure laws, including, but not limited to, RCW 42.17A.435, RCW 42.17A.460, RCW 42.17A.470, RCW 42.17A.485, and RCW 42.17A.715.

RCW 42.17A.460 states that “[a]ll contributions made by a person or entity, either directly or indirectly ... are considered to be contributions from that person or entity...” This is because there are restrictions either prohibiting or severely limiting contributions made on behalf of others, in order to comply with the intent behind the Public Disclosure Act—to ensure “[t]hat political campaign and lobbying contributions and expenditures be fully disclosed to the public and that secrecy is to be avoided.” RCW 42.17A.001(1).

RCW 42.17A.470 not only states that a person, other than an individual, may not be an intermediary or an agent for a contribution; it affirmatively requires that an individual may not make a contribution on behalf of another person or entity without disclosing to the recipient of the contribution *both* his or her identifying information *and* the same information for each contributor for whom the individual serves as intermediary.

Likewise, contributions that conceal the true source of the contributed funds are prohibited by state law. RCW 42.17A.435 reads:

No contribution shall be made and no expenditure shall be incurred, directly or indirectly, in a fictitious name, anonymously, or by one person through an agent, relative, or other person ***in such a manner as to conceal the identity of the source of the contribution or in any other manner so as to effect concealment.***

Id. (emphasis added). This is repeated in large part in RCW 42.17A.715:

No payment shall be made to any person required to report under RCW 42.17A.700 and no payment shall be accepted by any such person, directly or

indirectly, in a fictitious name, anonymously, or by one person through an agent, relative, or other person *in such a manner as to conceal the identity of the source of the payment or in any other manner so as to effect concealment.* ...

Id. (emphasis added).

Here, there is no question that several contributions, as structured by Mr. Karstetter, ultimately concealed the identity of the true source of funds contributed to candidates, in violation of the intent of the act—to “promote complete disclosure of all information respecting the financing of political campaigns.” RCW 42.17A.001.

Conclusion

The Guild intends to bring a citizen’s action against Mr. Karstetter under RCW 42.17A.765(4) if you do not commence an action against Mr. Karstetter within the notice periods specified by statute. At the expiration of 45 days from the date of this letter, a second notice of intent to sue will be sent to you if you have not yet filed suit against Mr. Karstetter. If, after 10 days following receipt of the second notice, you still have not filed suit against Mr. Karstetter, the Guild will bring an action in superior court.

All Fellow Corrections Officers and Sergeants, Greetings and Salutations.

We, the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, respectfully submit for your review and approval the Constitution and By-Laws of the King County Corrections Guild. It has been modeled primarily after the King County Police Guilds Constitution and By-Laws but we have also borrowed liberally from the Constitution and By-Laws of both the Seattle Police Officers Guild and Local 519. We have employed the democratic process throughout, specifically majority vote, to complete the document before you. This has included debate on nearly every section of every article, some of it quite heated. We have attempted to include as many member ideas that have been forwarded to us as possible. Although not widely publicized, the Constitution and By-Laws Committee meetings have been open to all Corrections Officers and Sergeants and contrary to popular rumor were not conducted in secret.

As individuals on the committee we would all like to see "just a few more changes", but as a group we are all relatively pleased with the collective results of our labors. Because a democratic approach was used to construct this document, we trust that a majority of the Guild membership will be comfortable with a majority of it as well. We do realize however that we cannot please everyone, with all aspects of this document. As individuals we all see things a little differently. Please keep this in mind as you review the document before you.

We have endeavored to include more checks and balances and clearly establish accountability, while still allowing the Officers and Executive Board members that you democratically choose, the ability to act in the Guilds best interest, with their own initiative and good judgement. We have also provided for a decidedly more democratic process in which to decide the direction to move on major issues faced by the Guild. We have also more clearly defined the process to remove anyone from office that the membership clearly wants removed. The last major issue we strived to address, which was also the most extensively debated, is cost savings.

We believe that until the Guild is up and running smoothly, with all Corrections Officers and Sergeants participating in the normal order of business and have clearly established ourselves financially, we must cut our operating budget any way possible. We propose that no business manager (s) be employed and that all of the duties normally performed by him be performed collectively by the Officers of the Guild. Both the King County Police and Seattle Police Officers Guilds operate in this way, the only difference is we propose to pay our officers less. This alone, as a simple matter of math, will save us approximately \$65,292.00 over what we paid for this service in 1995. After examining the chart on the back of this letter we are confident you will see that we simply cannot afford the luxury of a business manager at this time. We have also stipulated in the By-Laws that if at some time in the future it is determined to be in the best interest of the Guild to hire a business manager, then the salaries of the Officers of the Guild will be reevaluated and adjusted to match their vastly decreased workload.

The chart on the back of this cover-letter projects the expected income and expenses for the King County Corrections Guild based on a foundation of reality, namely the financial history of Local 519. Please examine it closely, it is documented fact. It is not intended to provide stones to sling at, past or present, supporters, Executive Board members or employees of Local 519. It is time to move beyond such childish behavior and get down to the business of taking care of ourselves and each other.

The Projected Income and Expenses chart does have some faults. The only figures that are undisputable fact are those in Local 519's column. They are derived from an Independent Auditor's Report of Public Safety Employees Local 519, a financial statement dated April 9, 1996 and the Proposed Guild Officers salaries. Figures in the Guild column are purely speculative and may seem high, but they are based on what Local 519 has paid for such items and services in the past year. It would be irresponsible to arbitrarily make up some figures and not base them on fact. Hopefully the new leadership you choose will be a little more thrifty with your money.

A few notes concerning the data in the Guild column: The number of officers is based on the number of Corrections Officers and Sergeants working as of October 5, 1996 and includes the 96 additional Corrections Officers that will begin employment by mid December. The estimated revenue from dues is based on all Corrections Officers and Sergeants not only becoming members but also paying their dues. At this time a considerable number of officers are continuing to exercise their legal right to withhold their dues until a contract has been ratified. All other expenses are based on what Local 519 paid during 1995.

Constitution of the King County Corrections Guild

Article I

Section 1. Name.

The corporate name of this group is: "*King County Corrections Guild*".

Section 2. Permanency.

This Guild shall not have the power to dissolve while there are twenty-five (25) members in good standing.

Article II

Purpose.

The purpose of the Guild shall be to act as the collective bargaining representative for all Corrections Officers and Sergeants of the King County Department of Adult Detention, and to generally do and perform any and all of the acts and things which may be found necessary or convenient for carrying out such purposes.

Article III

Membership.

Section 1. Jurisdiction. All Corrections Officers and Sergeants of the King County Department of Adult Detention are eligible for membership. The Guild may sponsor another organization as a local or subsidiary under such terms as the Executive Board may prescribe and the membership approve. In the event the Guild does sponsor another organization, that sponsorship may be terminated only by following the procedures outlined for changing this Constitution. Probationary Corrections Officers are regular, full members of the Guild and are entitled to all privileges of membership.

Section 2. Member in Good Standing. A member in good standing is defined as a member of the King County Corrections Guild who is current in all dues, fees, and assessments.

Article IV

Designation of Officers.

The Officers of the King County Corrections Guild shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Guild Officer Positions are not shift/facility specific and shall come from and be elected by all members of the Guild in good standing. There shall also be one Executive Board Position for each shift and facility. (The Downtown Facility and the Regional Justice Center.) These positions shall be specific to their shift and facility. These Board Members shall come from and be voted on by, the members in good standing assigned to their respective shift and facility. Each immediate past President is a non voting, ex-officio member of the Executive Board for one (1) year, if eligible.

Article V

Eligibility for Office, Term of Office, Nominations, Elections, Installation and Removal of Officers.

Section 1. Eligibility for Office. Any member in good standing of the Guild, who is not a member of a competing labor organization, shall be eligible to hold office.

Section 2. Nominations and Elections of Officers.

(a) All candidates shall be nominated by a petition signed by at least ten (10) members in good standing of the King County Corrections Guild. All petitions shall specify the position sought. The petition shall be endorsed by the person nominated. No member may petition or run for more than one office at any election.

(b) The nomination period shall commence at 0800 hours on the last Wednesday of November and shall end at 1600 hours on the last Wednesday of December. The petitions will be turned in to the office of the Guild, or the Guild Secretary, by 1600 hours on the last Wednesday of December and shall be acknowledged by the person receiving them by his or her signature with the date and time received. Any candidate nominated will have ten (10) calendar days after the closure to withdraw. This must be done in writing to the Guild office, or to the Guild Secretary. Said withdrawal to be acknowledged by the person receiving it by his or her signature with the date and time received. If any candidate(s) withdraw(s) within the withdrawal period as defined above, leaving a candidate running unopposed, a new nomination period of seven (7) calendar days from the end of the withdrawal period will be allowed for members to file against the aforesaid unopposed candidate. Notice of a new nomination period will be published for the membership. Requirements for office as stated in Section 1 must still be met.

(c) It shall be the duty of the Guild Officers to see that the names of the persons nominated be announced, in writing, as soon as possible after the closure date.

(d) Candidates running for Guild Officer positions and for Executive Board positions shall be listed in order for the time their petition is filed at the Guild office, or with the Guild Secretary. The word incumbent shall be placed after the name of the person currently holding that office if he is seeking re-election to that position. Members seeking an Executive Board position must be assigned to the shift/facility which is represented by the Board position being sought. If a Board Member is transferred from the shift/facility which the Board position represents, that Board Member will be deemed to have voluntarily resigned from his position immediately. The vacant Executive Board position will then be filled in accordance with Article III, Section 2 of the By-Laws.

(e) Elections of Officers and Board Members shall be by secret, written ballot, among the members in good standing in the Guild, even though only one candidate is nominated for a given office. There shall be no voting in proxy in the election of Guild Officers or Board Members. There shall be no write-in or stick-on candidates and any ballot containing a write-in or stick-on candidate shall be void in so far as the vote for such office is concerned, and such ballot for that office shall not be considered as having been cast in determining the majority vote. When more than two candidates are running for an office/position, the candidate receiving a majority of those eligible to vote shall be declared elected. If no candidate receives a majority of those eligible to vote, the balloting shall continue through a run-off election with the two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes participating, with the candidate receiving the majority of those voting in the run-off election being declared elected. When only two candidates are initially running for an office the candidate receiving the majority of those voting shall be declared elected.

(f) Each ballot shall be in a form prescribed by the Executive Board. Each member in good standing shall be furnished a ballot and two envelopes. One envelope shall be plain and one shall contain the printed name of the member. Members shall insert the ballot in the plain envelope and insert the plain envelope in the envelope with his or her name thereon. The member will then sign by the printed name with his signature and place the ballot in the ballot box.

(g) At the time of counting of ballots the Secretary, in the presence of the Election Committee, shall open the ballot box and as each envelope is removed, shall verify that the name thereon is that of a member in good standing and eligible to vote. The Secretary shall remove the unmarked envelope and segregate it. When all the signed envelopes have been opened and verified, the Secretary shall turn them over to the Chairman of the Election Committee who will proceed with the counting of the ballots. The Secretary shall have no further physical contact with the ballots, unless he is a member of the Election Committee.

(h) The ballots will be counted by members of the Election Committee. Any candidate is allowed to appoint an observer to be present at the ballot counting. Observers are not allowed to participate in the counting of the ballots, and are prohibited from touching the ballots in any way. Immediately after the ballots have been counted, a statement noting the hours, date, place, and circumstances of the counting shall be written and signed by all participants of the count and submitted to the Executive Board. This statement shall be retained in the Guild files for a minimum of five (5) years. The Executive Board will certify the results of the election within five (5) business days following the election, unless just cause exists to postpone the certification.

(i) Any member may protest any election by submitting, in writing, to the Guild office, or the Guild Secretary, within three (3) business days of the election, an "official protest" defining the specific reasons for the protest. If there are any protests, the election will not be certified until the Executive Board Members not on the ballots, and a majority of the members on the Election Committee, have an open meeting to discuss the specific reasons for the protest. At the end of this discussion the Executive Board Members not appearing on this ballot shall vote on the protests, and their majority vote shall be final, even though they may not normally constitute a quorum. This meeting shall be held within fifteen (15) calendar days of the receipt of the protest.

(j) Any date herein which falls on a weekend or holiday shall be deferred until the next business day.

(k) Two (2) days prior to the last Wednesday in January will be the deadline for the election of Guild Officers and Board Members.

Section 3. Removal of Officers, Executive Board Members, and Committee Members.

Any Guild Officer, Executive Board Member, or member of any Committee may be removed from office without cause via Petition from the Membership. Such petition shall be valid only if it contains the dated, printed name, and signature of sixty-seven percent (67%) of the members in good standing of the Guild. Such signatures must be obtained within a forty-five (45) day time period. Said petition shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Guild, or the Vice President if the Secretary is the subject of the petition. Immediately upon the Executive Board determining that the petition is valid, the Officer or Member shall be removed from the office/position addressed by the petition.

Article VI

Meetings.

Section 1. Regular Meetings. The regular meetings of the King County Corrections Guild shall be held monthly and shall be at 1800 hours on the last Wednesday of each and every month unless otherwise scheduled by the Executive Board.

Section 2. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be held at the call of the President or Executive Board. Fifty (50) members in good standing of the Guild may at anytime require a special meeting by filing a signed petition therefore with the President of the Guild, in which petition shall name a date for the meeting, which shall be no earlier than five (5) business days subsequent to the date of filing of such a petition, provided that such special meetings shall not exceed one per calendar month, that the subject matter of the special meeting shall be limited to the question specified in the petition requesting the meeting, and that special meetings shall be limited to one meeting per issue during any twelve (12) month period following the date of said special meeting. The petition so filed shall constitute a call to the members.

Article VII

Guild By-Laws.

The By-Laws of the King County Corrections Guild shall at all times be subordinate to the Constitution of the King County Corrections Guild, as it may be amended. If any conflict should arise between the By-Laws, or any amendments thereto, and the Constitution, or any amendments thereto, the provisions of the Constitution shall prevail.

Article VIII

Amendments to the Constitution.

Amendments to the Constitution may be proposed, in writing, at any Guild meeting by any Guild member in good standing, and shall be supported by a petition bearing the printed name and signature of at least one hundred (100) members in good standing of the Guild, and, if the motion is seconded, a vote of the membership present shall be taken. If the motion is approved, the proposed amendment shall be reviewed by the Executive Board for clarity and, if necessary, cleared through the Guild Attorney for legal opinion.

The language of the proposed amendment may be altered with the consent of the maker and the second, but not to the extent of changing the original intent. The amendment shall then be presented again at the next regular Guild meeting. If the proposed amendment is approved by the members present at the second meeting it shall then be published in its final form and presented to the membership with the notation that the proposed amendment will be voted upon. Said amendment shall be submitted to the entire membership via written ballot.

If the proposed amendment is approved by a seventy-five (75) percent majority of the members of the Guild in good standing, the amendment will be adopted and a copy of same shall be attached to the Constitution and By-Laws retained in the Guild files.

Article IX

Application.

Any reference in this Guild Constitution to the masculine gender shall also include the feminine gender.

By-Laws of the King County Corrections Guild

Article I

Membership Dues and Assessments:

Section 1. Application for Membership. Application for membership shall be made on a prescribed application form and shall be accompanied by a completed payroll authorization card authorizing a monthly deduction from the members pay equal to the monthly Guild dues as noted in Article I, Section 4.

Section 2. Approval of Membership Application. Membership applications received shall be presented to the Secretary. The Executive Board is duly authorized to accept, defer, or reject any application subject to appeal to the Membership of the King County Corrections Guild.

Section 3. Initiation Fee. The non-refundable initiation fee for the King County Corrections Guild shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and may be paid in installments of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) a month. The initiation fee shall be paid in full no later than five (5) months after a member joins the Guild. All members admitted to the Guild with a hire date after September 10, 1996 shall be subject to the initiation fee.

Section 4. Dues. The monthly dues of members of the King County Corrections Guild shall be one percent (1%) of base salary. Probationary Corrections Officers are required to pay dues from their date of admittance into the Guild, however, if a probationary Officer is terminated before completing his required probationary period, all dues paid to the Guild will be refunded.

Section 5. When Payable. Membership dues shall be payable monthly, in advance, to the Guild Treasurer. Any member who fails to pay dues by the 30th of the month in which they become due shall be in arrears and upon failure to pay dues or fines for two successive months shall stand suspended from the Guild, but may be reinstated upon payment of all arrearages and upon payment of a reinstatement fee as provided in Section 6 hereof, and upon approval of the Executive Board of the Guild.

Section 6. Reinstatement. A suspended member may be reinstated to membership in the King County Corrections Guild per payment of all arrearages and payment of a reinstatement fee of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00), plus the current months dues.

Section 7. Public Statements. No member or members shall make any public statement per any issue concerning the King County Corrections Guild, except duly elected Officers, without the consent of the Executive Board of the Guild.

Section 8. Petitions. Members who wish to propose petitions in regards to any matter shall not circulate such petitions until the contents of the petition shall be presented to a special or regular meeting of the Executive Board. The foregoing in no way shall prevent the circulation of the petition after said meeting.

Section 9. Endorsing Political Candidates. No person or group within the King County Corrections Guild shall use a Guild Title or Office and/or Guild stationery to endorse any political candidate without first obtaining consent from a majority of the membership voting at a regular or special membership meeting.

Section 10. Special Assessments Restricted. Any special assessment levied by the Guild upon its members shall be used solely for the promotion of the welfare of the Guild. No vote shall be taken on any special assessment unless it shall have been presented at the meeting immediately prior to the time such assessment is to be voted upon, and until all members in good standing of the Guild have been provided notification of the assessment and its purposes in writing by the Secretary. The assessment shall then be voted upon, with the assessment needing the support of the majority of the members of the Guild in good standing to be levied.

Section 11. Member in Transition. A member who is in transition from active, full time duty status to either a disability or service retirement shall, for the period of thirty-one (31) days after termination, retain all such rights and privileges of an active duty member.

Article II

Officers Duties:

Section 1. Duties of the President. The President shall be the Chief Executive and Administrative Officer of the Guild, and shall conduct the affairs of the Guild in accordance with its Constitution and By-Laws and in accordance with policy decisions of the membership and the Guild's Executive Board. The President shall, with the Board's approval, procure suitable offices for the transaction of the Guild's business. The President shall, under policies established by the Executive Board, and with Board approval, employ, terminate, fix the compensation and expenses, and direct the activities of such office staff, administrative assistants, technical and professional assistants, field staff, organizers and representatives as are required to carry out effectively the functions of the office. The President shall, with the approval of the Executive Board, engage such technical and professional services, including legal counsel and other services, as may be required. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Guild and conduct the same in compliance with the Constitution and By-Laws and rules of order; he shall decide on all questions of order without debate subject to an appeal to the meeting. It shall be the duty of the President to report at each meeting of the Guild, the progress and workings of the Guild. He shall be responsible to see to it that all places under jurisdiction of the Guild are visited, and if members are working under unfavorable conditions, he shall insist to the best of his ability that the Guild and its conditions be recognized. The President shall report all violations of Guild conditions or breeches of agreement, and perform all other duties assigned to him by the members of the Guild or by direction of the Executive Board. He shall attend to all controversies between the Guild and the employer and endeavor to adjust a settlement as soon as possible. He shall further be responsible for the safekeeping of all records and documents of value and shall surrender the same to his successor in office at the expiration of his term. He shall be a member ex-officio of all committees and may countersign all checks drawn against the funds of the Guild. The President shall only vote in Board matters in case of a tie.

Section 2. Duties of the Vice President. The Vice President shall assist the President in all his activities. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall preside at all meetings and perform all duties otherwise performed by the President and may countersign checks drawn against funds of the Guild. The Vice President shall assume the duties of the Treasurer, in the Treasurers absence, at the discretion of the Officers of the Guild.

Section 3. Duties of the Secretary. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Guild, and shall make such records available to all shop stewards, who shall make them available to any member in good standing upon request; draw orders on the treasury to be countersigned by the Treasurer, and any one of the President, Vice President, or Secretary, and perform such other duties as may be required by the Officers of the Guild.

Section 4. Duties of the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall receive and take charge of all money, property, and securities of the Guild. He shall deposit all money so received to the credit of the Guild and in the name of the Guild in a financial institution approved by the Executive Board. No more than twenty five percent (25%) of the Guild's treasury shall be invested in equity investments such as common stocks. The balance of the Guild's investments are limited to investments in funds or accounts which are either guaranteed by the United States government or backed by the full faith and credit of the United States government. All disbursements shall be made by check except for the three hundred dollars (\$300.00) in the revolving fund, which must be accounted for by receipts, personal declarations, or other acceptable means. The checks issued by the Guild must be signed by the Treasurer, and any one of the remaining three principle officers, to wit: President, Vice President, and Secretary. The Treasurer shall prepare and submit a monthly membership and financial report as well as an accurate record of receipts and disbursements to the Guild Membership at each regular monthly meeting of the Guild and at that meeting shall render a monthly operating statement of the financial transactions of the Guild for the previous month.

Section 5. Audits. A complete audit of the Guild's financial records shall be conducted at least once every two years. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to engage a certified public accountant, with the approval of the Executive Board, to conduct audits of the Guild's records.

Section 6. Duties of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be the governing body of the Guild, when the Guild itself is not in session. All matters affecting the policies, aims, and means of accomplishing the purposes of the King County Corrections Guild not specifically provided for in its Articles of Incorporation or these By-Laws, or by action of the Guild at a regular or special meeting, shall be decided by the Executive Board, which shall meet at the call of the President, or such times as seems expedient to a majority of the Members of the Board, but at least once each month. A report on all action taken by the Executive Board shall be made to the membership at the next following meeting. A majority of the Members of the Executive Board shall constitute a Quorum. Guild monies may be expended on any legitimate purpose of the Guild. The Executive Board shall retain the ultimate right to approve or disapprove of the expenditure of Guild funds.

Section 7. Interim Officers. The Interim Officers of the Guild shall serve until the Guild's first elections. Interim Officers are not eligible for salaries.

Section 8. Salaries of Officers of the King County Corrections Guild.

(a) Salaries for King County Corrections Guild Officers shall be based on the salary of the Top Step Corrections Officer exclusive of longevity, premium pay, or any other incentive pay.

(b) The salaried positions of the King County Corrections Guild shall be:

- (i) President - 35% of Top Step Corrections Officer
- (ii) Vice President - 20% of Top Step Corrections Officer
- (iii) Secretary - 20% of Top Step Corrections Officer
- (iv) Treasurer - 20% of Top Step Corrections Officer

(c) Members who are elected or appointed to the position of Board Member, with the exception of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer, will be paid ten dollars (\$10.00) an hour with a twenty five dollar (\$25.00) minimum for attending the following meetings: a) General Membership Meetings, b) Executive Board Meetings, and c) Special Board Meetings.

(d) The salaries above are based on the Officers of the Guild performing all duties and tasks required to carry out the business of the Guild. (Except in cases where it is determined that legal counsel should be utilized.) If however, the decision is made to employ a business representative to carry out these tasks, the salaries of the Officers of the Guild shall be reevaluated so as to reflect the decreased work load.

(e) If a Guild Officer who receives payments from the Guild should be unable to perform his Guild duties, the person's salary will continue for the month in which his inability to perform commenced and shall terminate at the end of that month.

Section 9. Liability Insurance. The Officers of the Guild shall be covered by surety bonds or liability insurance at Guild expense in amounts to be determined by the Executive Board.

Article III

Term of Office, Filling of Vacancies, and Removal of Officers.

Section 1. Term of Office. The term of office for President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the Executive Board Members shall be two years. Said regular terms of office shall commence immediately upon the election being certified by the Executive Board. The President, Secretary, First Shift Representatives, and Third Shift Representatives shall be elected on odd years, the Vice President, Treasurer, Second Shift Representatives, and Fourth Shift Representatives shall be elected on even years. The first regularly elected Officers and Board Members shall serve the following term lengths:

Section 2. Filling of Vacancies. Vacancies on the Executive Board or in Guild Officers shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term by appointment by the President, subject to approval of the Executive Board. In the event of a vacancy in the position of President, such vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the Executive Board immediately following such vacancy. Such appointment to be only until the next regular election at which time there will be a special election for the position of President for the remaining unexpired term of office. In the event a vacancy is filled as above provided by appointment, of a person who is already an Officer or Executive Board Member, he shall, if he accepts the new appointment, be deemed to have resigned from his former office, or position, which will be filled as provided above.

Section 3. Removal of Officers, Executive Board Members, and Committee Members.

(a) Any Guild Officer or Member of the Executive Board who fails to participate in three (3) consecutive regular or special board meetings, without prior notice and without just cause (as determined by the Executive

Board) for such absence, shall be deemed to have voluntarily resigned. A Guild Officer or Executive Board Member shall be deemed to have voluntarily resigned on the effective date of a promotion. In such case, the vacancy shall be filled as provided for in Article III, Section 2 of the Guild By-Laws.

(b) The Executive Board, by a three-fourths (3/4) vote, may recommend to the membership the removal of any Guild Officer, Executive Board Member, or Committee Member. Such recommendation shall be announced at the next regular monthly meeting and will be voted upon by the membership by secret ballot as soon as practical following the meeting. At least sixty seven percent (67%) of the members in good standing in the Guild must cast a vote in order to validate the results. A seventy five percent (75%) majority of those voting shall be required for the removal of any such officer. The vacancy shall be filled as provided for in Article III, Section 2 of the Guild By-Laws.

Article IV

Rules of Order. Meetings shall be conducted in an orderly and businesslike manner.

Article V

Committees.

Section 1. Standing Committees. The Standing Committees of the King County Corrections Guild shall be:

(a) **Board of Trustees.** The Board of Trustees shall consist of three (3) members in good standing elected by the members in good standing. The Board of Trustees shall examine all disbursements made by the Guild to determine if said expenditures have been duly authorized by the Executive Board or the membership. The Board of Trustees shall meet at least once each quarter, or more often if directed to do so by the Executive Board or by orders of the membership of the Guild, via petition bearing the signatures of sixty-seven (67) percent of the members in good standing, and shall examine the books and records and monthly reports of the Treasurer to determine if all expenditures are appropriate and make their findings known to the membership of the Guild. If the Board of Trustees finds that all expenditures are appropriate and authorized they shall make a recommendation in the minutes that the expenditures be approved and accepted by the membership. The approval of the membership of the recommendations and findings of the Board of Trustees shall relieve the Board of Trustees and the Officers of any liability in connection with the expenditures so made. The three (3) elected Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected on odd years and the normal term is two (2) years.

(b) **Election Committee.** The Executive Board shall appoint the Election Committee, three (3) members in good standing, none of whom shall be candidates for office, to conduct elections in accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Guild.

(c) **Grievance Committee.** The Grievance Committee shall hear all grievances raised pursuant to Article VIII of these By-Laws. The Grievance Committee shall consist of a majority of the Executive Board. The President shall appoint the members of the Grievance Committee.

(d) **Negotiating Committee.** The authority to bargain collectively for the Guild shall be vested in a Negotiating Committee that shall consist of one (1) Guild Officer, designated by the Executive Board, and three (3) elected members in good standing. The results of any negotiations for collective bargaining agreements or amendments to collective bargaining agreements shall be subject to ratification by the Guild members in good standing by

majority vote, except when binding arbitration is used to resolve an impasse, in which case the decision of the Arbiter will be final. No collective bargaining agreement or amendment to a collective bargaining agreement shall be offered to the membership for ratification without the Executive Board having first reviewed and approved of the document in its final written form. The three (3) elected members of the Negotiating Committee shall be elected one (1) calendar year prior to the expiration of the current collective bargaining agreement, and shall continue to serve until the ratification of a successor collective bargaining agreement.

(e) Shop Stewards. The Guild Shop Steward program will be administered as outlined in the King County Corrections Guild Shop Steward Policies and Procedures.

Section 2. Special Committees. The President shall appoint Special Committees of the Guild with the approval of the Executive Board.

Article VI

Guild Attorney.

In the sole and exclusive discretion of the Executive Board a Guild Attorney may, or may not, assist any member on any legal matter.

Article VII

Resolutions.

Resolutions submitted from the floor shall be drawn up in proper form by the Executive Board who will recommend and act on them for the proper expediency of said resolutions.

Article VIII

Grievance Procedure.

A member claiming a grievance against the Guild or any of the Officers or Directors shall exhaust the following procedure prior to seeking alternative review or relief.

Step 1. The grievance shall be filed with the Secretary of the Guild. The grievance shall set forth in full detail the grounds of the member's grievance and shall include every issue or matter to be considered or reviewed. It shall contain a detailed statement of facts upon which the member relies in support of his grievance and shall further include the member's request, if one there be, to personally appear before the Board at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

The Secretary shall present the grievance at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting, and the member shall be permitted a reasonable time to speak on his own behalf, if he so desires. The Board shall then sit in closed session, determine the merits of the member's grievance, and shall decide upon the appropriate relief or remedy, if applicable. Alternatively, the Board may order further investigation of the member's grievance and report back at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. The member shall be advised in writing of the Board's decision, and the reasons for the decision. If the member is not satisfied with the Board's decision, he may appeal that decision by so notifying the Secretary, in writing, within ten calendar (10) days of his receipt of notice of the Board's decision.

Step 2. Upon receipt of notice of appeal, the Secretary shall notify the current Chairman of the Elections Committee. The Elections Committee Chairman shall, in the presence of the two (2) other Committee

Members, randomly draw twelve (12) names of current Guild members in good standing. Each member shall be contacted by the Chairman, in order of drawing, until eight (8) members have agreed to serve on the appeals panel. The date of the meeting shall be given to the Secretary of the Guild and the member filing the grievance. The Chairman shall call the meeting to order and shall seat the prospective panel members in order of their original selection. As each member is called, the Guild and the appellant may challenge each prospective panel member for cause, and shall be allowed to exercise one peremptory challenge. Upon challenge for cause, the prospective panel member shall be allowed to explain the circumstances giving rise to the challenge, or may voluntarily withdraw from the panel. The Chairman shall make all decisions on challenges for cause, and his decision shall be final. As soon as five (5) panel members have been selected, they shall, among themselves, elect a Chairman. This elected Chairman shall then handle all further activities of the panel. The proceedings of the panel shall not be adversarial in nature. Rather, its purpose shall be to obtain all facts, identify all issues, ask questions, and to render a fair decision. To that end, the panel may call and question witnesses, seek legal counsel, and acquire such research material as is reasonably necessary to assist in making a determination on the issues raised.

The panel may meet in closed session to discuss the relevance and weight of the evidence submitted during the initial hearing or subsequent hearings. Following the close of evidence, the panel shall render a decision, based upon a vote of the majority of the panel, within thirty (30) calendar days and so notify the grievant and the Guild. The decision and the reasons therefore shall be signed by the elected Chairman.

The decision shall be binding on all parties to the grievance, except where the rights of either party to the grievance have been prejudiced because the findings, inference, conclusions, or decisions are either clearly erroneous in view of the entire record, collective bargaining agreement, Guild Constitution, or Guild By-Laws, or arbitrary or capricious. The minutes of the hearing and the full decision shall be placed on file in the Guild office. Such records to be retained by the Guild for at least five (5) years. It shall be the responsibility of the Guild to provide for the taking of minutes, remuneration of panel members, attorney fees for legal counsel to the panel, and such allowances for transportation as may reasonably be necessary during the hearing(s).

Article IX

Charges Against Members. All members of the King County Corrections Guild are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a manner that furthers the best image and interests of the Guild. Any member who fails to conduct themselves in such a manner and whose conduct thereby causes the Guild to expend needless time and resources in an effort to remedy the matter, shall be guilty of Conduct Unbecoming a Guild Member.

Any member in good standing of the Guild may file charges against any other member or Officer of the Guild, alleging any offense against the Guild, its Officers or members, such as violation of the Guild Constitution and By-Laws, contracts, decisions of the Guild, conduct unbecoming a member of the Guild, or any other offense which injures the Guild or any of its members. Any charges preferred against any member shall be filed in writing in duplicate with the Secretary specifying the nature of the offense involved. The Executive Board of the Guild shall receive and investigate any charges.

Section 1. Trial Board. The Executive Board shall be the Trial Board, except that where the member charged or preferring such charges is a member of such Board, the Executive Board shall appoint a disinterested member as a substitute

Section 2. Types of Discipline. The following are examples of discipline that may be imposed on a member having been found guilty of an offense against the Guild:

- (1) Verbal Reprimand
- (2) Written Reprimand
- (3) Fine
- (4) Removal from office/position
- (5) Suspension or Revocation of Guild Membership

In addition to the above, a member may be ordered to reimburse the Guild for any resources expended by the Guild as a result of the member's inappropriate actions/activity.

Section 3. In the event disciplinary action is taken against the accused, appeals may be taken and will be dealt with in accordance with Article VIII, Step 2.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of applicable statutes, every member or Officer of this Guild against whom charges have been preferred and disciplinary action taken agrees, as a condition of membership or affiliation and the continuation of membership or affiliation, to exhaust all remedies of the Guild and this Constitution, and further agrees not to file or prosecute any action in any court, tribunal, or other agency until those remedies have been exhausted.

Article X

Amendments to the By-Laws.

Amendments to the By-Laws may be proposed, in writing, at any Guild meeting by any Guild member in good standing, and shall be supported by a petition bearing the printed name and signature of at least fifty (50) members in good standing of the Guild, and, if the motion is seconded, a vote of the membership present shall be taken. If the motion is approved by a vote of the majority of those members in good standing present at the meeting, the proposed amendment shall be reviewed by the Executive Board for clarity and, if necessary, cleared through the Guild Attorney for legal opinion.

The language of the proposed amendment may be altered with the consent of the maker and the second, but not to the extent of changing the original intent. The amendment shall then be presented again at the next regular Guild meeting. If the proposed amendment is approved by a vote of a majority of those members in good standing present at the second meeting, it shall then be published in its final form and presented to the membership with the notation that the proposed amendment will be voted upon. Said amendment shall be submitted to the entire membership via written ballot.

If the proposed amendment is approved by a majority of the members of the Guild in good standing, the amendment will be adopted and a copy of same shall be attached to the Constitution and By-Laws retained in the Guild files.

Article XI

Application.

Any reference in these Guild By-Laws to the masculine gender shall also include the feminine gender.

Dear Mr. Young and Ms. Dalton:

Pursuant to your request, please accept this letter as my preliminary response to the allegations made against me by the King County Corrections Guild (the "Guild") in its correspondence dated September 6, 2016. My response is simple—The Guild's accusations against me are patently false. I have never made any political contribution in such a way as to effect concealment of the provenance of the contribution, nor have I otherwise attempted in any way to circumvent the Public Disclosure Laws.

At the time of the events in question, I was well known in the community as an employee of the Guild, having been employed by the Guild from 1996 until recently.¹ Before my employment with the Guild, I was with the King County Police Union for fourteen (14) years, whose membership then became part of the Guild. Every one of the individuals mentioned in the Guild's correspondence knew me as counsel to and an employee of the Guild.

The Guild also retained an independent contractor named Chris Vance for lobbying and public relations. Each of the contributions referred to in the Guild's correspondence took place in connection with events that Mr. Vance had recommended that the Guild participate in, and that the Guild had authorized. Each of these events were sponsored by candidates with a direct relationship with the employment of corrections officers and sergeants (e.g., budget, wages, hours, and working conditions). Each of these candidates are endorsed and financially

¹ I am presently litigating with the Guild whether it breached my employment contract in King County Superior Court Cause Number 16-2-12397-0. I believe that the Guild's accusations against me are a transparent and baseless attempt to distract from its breach of contract and inappropriately apply pressure on me.

supported by the Guild each year. As the Guild's employee, I was responsible for meeting with these officials, along with Guild leadership, to talk about members' wages, hours, and working conditions. Mr. Vance was responsible, along with the Guild treasurer, to ensure that all proper filings were made with the Public Disclosure Commission. I had no responsibility in that regard whatsoever.

Most, if not all of the events referred to in the Guild's correspondence, related to annual events that were put on by the candidate. For example, Attorney General Bob Ferguson would host an annual "Shrimp Feed," which the Corrections Guild always helped sponsor. I would attend on behalf of the King County Corrections Guild, along with Randy Weaver. At that time, Mr. Weaver was the vice president of the Guild; he is now the Guild's president. Mr. Weaver requested that I pay for the event at the door with my credit card.² He then instructed the Treasurer to reimburse me upon presentation of my credit card statement (usually the Guild Meeting following the event). I never represented that any such payment was being made on my own behalf, nor would it have been understood as such—not by me, not by the candidate, not by the Guild.

Rod Dembowski, King County Councilmember, succeeded Mr. Ferguson on the King County Council. The Guild passed a motion to maximize its contribution to Mr. Dembowski's election for his first term.³ The Guild Treasurer instructed me to make the contribution as Mr. Dembowski did not have an address to receive a check at the time. I contacted Mr. Dembowski and made arrangements to get the funds to him electronically. I sought reimbursement at the next Guild meeting. The Guild executive board was aware of and approved this procedure, as did Mr. Vance. Again, I never represented that any payment was anything other than a contribution by the Guild, and I have no doubt that all parties understood it as such.

Pete VonReichbauer hosts an annual event at Emerald Downs at the start of racing season, where he sponsors a particular race. The Guild is always asked to purchase a table at the event and that invite always comes to me. For the event in question the Guild purchased ten seats at the event.⁴ I am also the Legal Advisor for the King County Sheriff Marshal's Guild. The Marshal's Guild agreed to sit with the Corrections Guild. Guild leadership routinely instructed me to pay for this event, after which I was reimbursed by the President and Treasurer. Mr. Vance was aware of this procedure—indeed, he was present briefly at the event and witnessed me making the payment.

As with every other event of this nature, all parties understood that I made the payment in my capacity as an employee of the Guild. The table placard at the event read "KING COUNTY CORRECTIONS GUILD." Six executive board members from the Guild, as well as three members of the Marshal's Guild. Mr. VonReichbauer has confirmed that to the extent his C3

² The Guild's allegation that I ever "wrote a personal check to [a] candidate or candidate's committee, informing the recipient that this was [my] personal contribution]" is untrue. While I did use my credit card to pay for events, I did not write personal checks to any candidates on behalf of the Guild.

³ Mr. Ferguson vacated the last year of his term. Under the Charter, persons applied for the vacancy. The County Executive then forwards the three top candidates to the Council. Mr. Ferguson personally asked me to meet with Mr. Dembowski and invite him to our Board Meeting. I did that and invited him to our Executive Board Meeting for a meet-and-greet. I also attended the Annual Dow Constantine 39th Birthday Party along with Mr. Weaver and his wife, so that we could lobby Mr. Constantine for Mr. Dembowski's assurance as one of the top three picks. Mr. Vance recommended that the Guild support Mr. Dembowski and maximize the Guild's contributions, as his vote was needed on the council once it confirmed Mr. Dembowski for the unexpired term.

⁴ I am also the legal advisor for the King County Sheriff Marshal's Guild. The Marshal's Guild agreed to sit with the Corrections Guild at this event.

form—which I have no part in completing—discloses a contribution from me personally, this represents simply a scrivener’s error.

The parties involved will confirm the true facts of this matter. For example, I invite you to contact Captain Douglas Justice (206.755.3030). Captain Justus spent seventeen (17) years as the Guild’s Vice President and President. He will confirm that my attendance at events held by candidates for office was as a Guild employee, and that I was sent because Mr. Vance did not like to attend these events. Moreover, it was convenient for the Guild to have me pay for the event and get reimbursed. Captain Justus will confirm that Mr. Vance had no problem with this system. He will acknowledge that the Guild annually allotted \$20,000–\$25,000 to a budget to be used for annual events like those hosted by Mr. VonReichbauer, Mr. Constantine, Mr. Dembowski, and Mr. Ferguson.⁵


In addition to being wrong on the facts, the Guild’s accusations against me don’t make any sense. I don’t live in King County. I gain nothing personally by “paying” for King County elected officials’ events. Rather, my employer the Guild—who specifically directed and approved everything it now purports to complain about—is the party who gains. The Guild’s accusations against me are not only frivolous; I believe they are being made in bad faith in an effort to gain some perceived advantage in my separate lawsuit against the Guild for breaching my employment contract.

I have enclosed three documents that illustrate the points made above. I have also enclosed copies of the Identification that I used when dealing with any political issues, which clearly identifies my affiliation with the Guild. Of primary importance is the Blue Lapel Placard stating “King County Corrections Guild”, which I wore when attending events on the Guild’s behalf. Please also note the business cards that the Guild provided me, again identifying me as affiliated with the Guild.


In summary, I did not conceal the source of any funds contributed to candidates, did not seek reimbursement for contributions made in my own name, nor otherwise take any actions to avoid the requirements of the Public Disclosure Laws. To the contrary, all parties at all times—including the Guild, which directed and authorized all the activities of which it now complains—would have understood that any payments in which I played a role were Guild contributions. To the extent the logistics of any payments may have raised the possibility of confusion, I have determined that any political events that may be supported by my Marshal’s Guild will be done by “direct-pay” checks that are made payable to the candidate, which I then tender when I attend the event. But the Guild’s current accusations against me are meritless. Moreover, its allegations should be viewed with considerable skepticism, given that identical activities were authorized, directed, and supported by the Guild for close to 20 years, and in light of the pending breach of contract case between me and the Guild. I respectfully submit that this matter should be summarily dismissed by your office and by the Public Disclosure Commission.

Thank you in advance for your courtesy. I am eager to clear up this matter.




